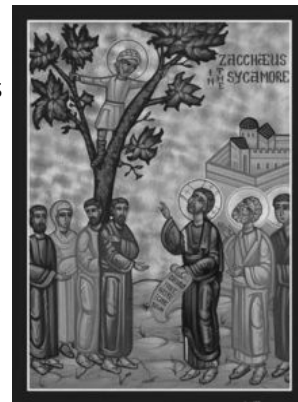
Turn Clocks Back

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

In the Gospel Reading from St. Luke we hear the story of the tax collector Zacchaeus and his desire to see and perhaps meet Jesus. The image of Zacchaeus up in that sycamore tree is one that many of us may recall from our childhood, and hearing it — because it is a vivid impression, and one that even as we get older may — may trigger a memory.



The name Zacchaeus means “pure one,” but he certainly was not pure. We learn from his own confession how he has overcharged and cheated people in his tax collection duties. However, for all his faults and shortcomings Zacchaeus seeks purity, and he understands that Jesus is a way to achieve that. It is interesting to note that Zacchaeus climbs a tree to see Jesus better. That sounds like something a child might do, and that fulfills in a small way an instruction Jesus gives to each of us, “Amen, I say to you, unless you turn and become like children, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.” Jesus follows that remark my immediately reminding us that we must become humble like children.

That is a cue for us to recall importance of humility when it comes to being a good steward, but thanks to the lesson of Zacchaeus we learn even more about how to seek stewardship. Like the tax collector we need to make an effort to seek Jesus; like him we must be humble; we must welcome Jesus into our homes and into our hearts; and finally we need to receive him joyfully.

REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

En el Evangelio de San Lucas que oímos la historia del publicano Zaqueo y su deseo de ver y tal vez encontrar a Jesús. La imagen de Zaqueo en ese árbol sicómoro es uno que muchos de nosotros podemos recordar de nuestra infancia, y oyendo - porque se trata de una impresión viva, y que incluso a medida que envejecemos puede - puede desencadenar un recuerdo.



El nombre Zaqueo significa "puro", pero desde luego no era pura. Hemos aprendido de su propia confesión cómo ha cobrado de más y engañado a la gente en sus funciones de recaudación de impuestos. Sin embargo, a pesar de sus defectos y carencias Zaqueo busca la pureza, y entiende que Jesús es una forma de lograr eso. Es interesante observar que Zaqueo sube a un árbol para ver mejor a Jesús. Eso suena como algo que un niño puede hacer, y que cumple de una manera pequeña una instrucción Jesús da a cada uno de nosotros, "En verdad os digo, que si no os hacéis como niños, no entraréis en el reino de los cielos." Jesús se deduce que la observación inmediatamente nos Mis recordando que debemos ser humildes como niños.

Esa es una señal para que recordemos importancia de la humildad cuando se trata de ser un buen administrador, pero gracias a la lección de Zaqueo que aprender aún más sobre cómo buscar la administración. Al igual que el cobrador de impuestos que tenemos que hacer un esfuerzo para buscar a Jesús; como él hay que ser humilde; debemos acoger a Jesús en nuestros hogares y en nuestros corazones; y, finalmente, tenemos que recibirlo con alegría.
