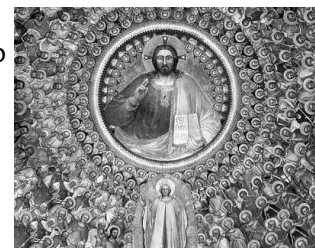

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. Most of us are aware that every day of the year is Feast Day for some saints. In fact, and this is of great consequence to our understanding, according to the *Catholic Encyclopedia* "The Solemnity of All Saints is when the Church honors all saints, known and unknown."



Those who have Feast Days are "known." Yet, each of us has known "saints" in our lives who fall into the category of "unknown." It may have been a parent or a sibling or a friend or a co-worker or a neighbor or a member of our parish or merely someone with whom we came in contact at some point in time. The crux is that on this day we need to pray and to honor those saints who have been an important part of our life in some way.

Indeed this is a day which should remind us that we, too, are called to sainthood. Not that we aspire to be honored publicly by the Pope or by the Church, but we do need to recognize that each of us is called to holiness. It is those "unknown" saints who provide examples of how to live and love and treat others, how to be good stewards. May we pray for them and may we seek to be like them in our own lives!

Women's Ministry Survey Results



Thanks to all who joined the brainstorming session and/or completed the survey. The information that we collected will help our pastoral staff to prioritize activities in the coming months. I reported the findings to the Adult Faith Formation Team so that they can keep your ideas in mind when planning for the future. Here are the priorities, as indicated by the surveys:

1. There was overwhelming support for a **Women's Retreat**, preferably on a Saturday, offsite. (We were able to secure **Saturday, Apr 30 from 8:30 am-4 pm** at Mission San Luis Rey for this event. Those who expressed an interest in being part of the planning team will receive an invitation to attend a brief planning meeting to be held sometime in early November.)

2. Respondents expressed the hope for small **Bible Study & Prayer Groups**. (The Adult Faith Formation Team is currently evaluating a number of bible study programs and resources for groups, with implementation possible in winter or spring, 2016.)

Contemplative Outreach of North San Diego will host an introductory program on Centering Prayer on **Saturday, Jan 16, 8:30 am-12:30 pm** in the Parish Hall. We hope to form centering prayer groups following the workshop.)

3. There was significant interest in forming one or more **Book Clubs**. We will gather a team together in early 2016 to explore this possibility.

All are hungry for more social events. Ideas include a Seder meal, St. Patrick's Day celebration, theater and concert trips and a Ladies Tea. (A **Eudist Fundraising Event** will take place on **Saturday evening, Dec 4**. The Adult Faith Formation Team has calendared a **Seder Supper** for **Saturday, Mar 19, 2016** in the Parish Hall following the 5 pm Mass. The Seder Supper team could use some help planning for the March event, so don't hesitate to contact Karen Charest at ksc927@juno.com if you can lend a hand. Or, call Karen at (760) 943-0046 and leave a message with your name and phone #. Additional social events will be planned when the above three priorities are addressed and a planning team has been formed.
