STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Today, the Third Sunday of Advent, we celebrate *Gaudete* Sunday. *Gaudete* means “rejoice.” Although Advent is a season of penitence and preparation, today is always set aside by the Church to relax and rejoice in the Lord. All of our readings today deal with Christian joy. This may seem not in keeping with the overall mood encouraged for Advent, but it is most definitely in keeping with what we need to feel, and it is definitely appropriate for those who embrace stewardship as a way of life.



Stewardship is, of course, based upon an “attitude of gratitude” and today is a day to focus on the joy that results from that gratitude. Father Henri Nouwen was a well known Catholic priest, professor, writer, and theologian. In describing the significance of this particular day, Father Nouwen clarified the difference between joy and happiness. He said, “While happiness is dependent upon external conditions, joy is the experience of knowing that we are unconditionally loved by God and nothing — not sickness, failure, emotional distress, oppression, war, or even death — can take that love away. Joy can be present in the midst of sadness.”

This “joy” that is reflected in lives of stewardship was also emphasized by Pope Francis, who said in his homily for *Gaudete* Sunday in 2014, “Today is a day of joy. Rather than fretting about all we have not done or accomplished to prepare for Christmas during Advent, we need to think of all the good things God, and life, has given us.”

REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

Hoy en día, el tercer domingo de Adviento, celebramos *Gaudete* domingo. *Gaudete* significa "regocijarse." A pesar de Adviento es un tiempo de penitencia y preparación, hoy siempre se establece a un lado por la Iglesia para relajarse y regocijarse en el Señor. Todas las lecturas de acuerdo hoy con alegría cristiana. Esto puede parecer no está en consonancia con el estado de ánimo general alentado para el Adviento, pero es sin duda de acuerdo con lo que tenemos que sentir, y es sin duda adecuado para aquellos que abrazan la corresponsabilidad como una forma de vida.



La administración es, por supuesto, sobre la base de una "actitud de gratitud" y hoy en día es un día para centrarse en la alegría que resulta de que la gratitud. Padre Henri Nouwen era un conocido sacerdote católico, profesor, escritor y teólogo. Al describir el significado de este día en particular, el padre Nouwen aclaró la diferencia entre la alegría y la felicidad. El dijo: "Mientras que la felicidad depende de las condiciones externas, la alegría es la experiencia de saber que estamos incondicionalmente amados por Dios y nada - ni la enfermedad, el fracaso, la angustia emocional, la opresión, la guerra, o incluso la muerte - puede tomar ese amor lejos. Alegría puede estar presente en el medio de la tristeza ".

Este "alegría" que se refleja en la vida de la administración también fue enfatizado por Francisco, quien dijo en la homilía de Domingo de *Gaudete* en 2014, "Hoy es un día de alegría. En lugar de preocupándose por todo lo que no hemos hecho o logrado para prepararse para la Navidad durante el Adviento, tenemos que pensar en todas las cosas buenas que Dios, y la vida, nos ha dado ".
