

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION



St. Paul writes in his letter to the Romans, our Second Reading on this Second Sunday of Advent: "May the God of endurance and encouragement grant you to think in harmony with one another." That statement is prayer-like, something that Paul tends to do in his letters, because Paul recognizes and knows that it is only through the Holy Spirit that each of can find that internal conversion to have the same endurance and patience to achieve the harmony for which we seek.

That in part is what we are striving for during this Advent season. Often, especially at this time of year, we are in a hurry. God may seem to work too slowly for us. God's plan is based upon patience and endurance. Paul continues that we need to "... welcome one another, then, as Christ welcomed you." Christ does indeed welcome us with all our faults and our sins as well. Throughout His ministry the Lord called us to treat one another, to love one another, as He treats and loves us.

As part of our Advent journey we need to work toward finding that same love in our hearts that the Lord feels for us. First, we need to recognize and accept that love. Then we need to seek the conversion that allows us to translate that love into our treatment of others. This is, in effect, what stewardship is all about — to glorify God in our actions by thinking of others first, by sharing who and what we are.

REFLECCIÓN DOMINICAL



St. Paul escribe en su carta a los Romanos, la Segunda Lectura en este segundo domingo de Adviento: ". Que el Dios de la paciencia y del consuelo os conceda a pensar en armonía unos con otros" Esa declaración es similar a la oración, algo que Paul tiende a hacer en sus cartas, porque Pablo reconoce y sabe que es sólo a través del Espíritu Santo que cada uno de puede encontrar que la conversión interna para tener la misma resistencia y paciencia para lograr la armonía para el que buscamos.

Eso en parte es lo que estamos luchando por durante este tiempo de Adviento. A menudo, especialmente en esta época del año, estamos en un apuro. Dios puede parecer que funciona con demasiada lentitud para nosotros. El plan de Dios se basa en la paciencia y la resistencia. Pablo continúa diciendo que tenemos que "... la bienvenida unos a los otros, entonces, como también Cristo nos dio la bienvenida." Cristo en efecto, nos da la bienvenida con todas nuestras faltas y nuestros pecados así. A lo largo de su ministerio que el Señor nos ha llamado a tratarse unos a otros, amarnos unos a otros, como Él nos ama y trata.

Como parte de nuestro camino de Adviento necesitamos trabajar hacia la búsqueda de ese mismo amor en nuestro corazón que el Señor siente por nosotros. En primer lugar, tenemos que reconocer y aceptar que el amor. Entonces tenemos que buscar la conversión que nos permite traducir ese amor en nuestro trato con los demás. Esta es, en efecto, lo que tiene que ver con la administración - glorificar a Dios en nuestras acciones por pensar primero en los demás, mediante el intercambio de quién y qué somos.
