

## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

What we know and understand as Church more or less begins with today's Gospel reading from St. Luke. Jesus calls His first disciples — His first Apostles. Luke tells us of the miracle that occurred for St. Peter and the others in their fishing boat. At the Lord's command, they cast their nets after a time of catching nothing, and “they caught a great number of fish.”

Note Peter's reaction, however. He falls to his knees and implores Jesus, “Depart from me Lord, for I am sinful man.” St. Peter is astonished and amazed, and he is, quite frankly, afraid of what he has just experienced. We may sometimes react to the Lord's calling in a similar way. It is a bit overwhelming and frightening to come to the realization that we, too, are called, and that the Lord has expectations of us.

Yet, this is how what we know as the Church began. It commenced with Jesus calling simple fishermen according to our Gospel. These, of course, then developed into twelve, then hundreds, then thousands, and now millions upon millions of those called to be disciples. We are among that throng. When Luke speaks of “following,” he is talking about discipleship. We are called to be stewards and disciples, but are we willing to “leave everything and follow Him?”

## REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

Lo que sabemos y entendemos como Iglesia más o menos comienza con el Evangelio de hoy la lectura de San Lucas. Jesús llama a sus primeros discípulos - Sus primeros apóstoles. Lucas nos narra el milagro que se produjo por San Pedro y los otros en su barco de pesca. En el mandato del Señor, echaron sus redes después de un tiempo de coger nada, y "encerraron gran cantidad de peces."



Nota reacción de Pedro, sin embargo. Cae de rodillas y suplica a Jesús: "Apartaos de mí Señor, porque soy hombre pecador." San Pedro está asombrado y sorprendido, y él es, francamente, miedo de lo que acaba de experimentar. A veces podemos reaccionar a la llamada del Señor de una manera similar. Es un poco abrumador y aterrador para llegar a la conclusión de que también nosotros estamos llamados, y que el Señor tiene expectativas de nosotros.

Sin embargo, así es como lo que conocemos como comenzó la Iglesia. Comenzó con Jesús llamando simples pescadores de acuerdo a nuestro Evangelio. Estos, por supuesto, a continuación, se convirtieron en doce, luego cientos, luego miles, y ahora millones y millones de los llamados a ser discípulos. Estamos entre esa multitud. Cuando Lucas habla de "siguiente", él está hablando de discipulado. Estamos llamados a ser administradores y discípulos, pero estamos dispuestos a "dejarlo todo y seguirlo?" 

## It's Tax Time!

St. James Church is again sponsoring free income tax assistance for 2015 Federal and California returns. Under the auspices of the AARP Tax-Aide program, this free tax-preparation service is available to low-and middle-income taxpayers, with the primary focus being on those who are 60 and older. The service will be offered each Saturday morning between the hours of 9am and 1pm from February 6 through April 16. One major change from prior years: appointments will no longer be available by phone. Instead, a first come, first served, walk-in approach will be in effect.
