
*God of freedom, beauty and truth, we believe that your deepest desire, your most powerful energy, is that all creation might know abundant life.*

## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

“Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed.”


There are scores of instances in the Four Gospels which indicate Jesus praying. He often would go off alone to pray, but He also prayed with others publicly; He prayed before He made a choice, before He healed someone, and He was just as likely to pray after as well.

St. Paul exhorts us to “pray constantly, never ceasing.” Jesus perhaps more than any other fulfilled this admonition. He

provides to us the perfect example of both how we should pray and in what ways. Prayer is at the foundation of our faith; it is at the core of a stewardship way of life. Developing an ongoing, consistent, and active prayer life is paramount for each of us.

Prayer not only indicates our constant awareness of God, but it enhances our lives, and is an indication of our total trust in God. Trust in God is also an important facet of stewardship. Knowing that we are in God's hands and in His care is what strengthens us and allows us to make the commitment Jesus has asked us to make. One of Jesus' final prayers is one which offers us the suggestion of how we need to approach life: “Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit.”



**REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL**

"Rising muy temprano, antes del amanecer, salió y se fue a un lugar desierto, y allí oraba."

Hay decenas de casos en los Cuatro Evangelios que indican Jesús orando. A menudo se marchaba solo a orar, sino que también oró públicamente con los demás; Él oró antes de que Él tomó una decisión, antes de que Él sanó a alguien, y él era tan probable que orar después también.



St. Paul nos exhorta a "orar constantemente, sin cesar." Jesús tal vez más que cualquier otra cumplido esta amonestación. Él nos proporciona el ejemplo perfecto de cómo tanto debemos orar y de qué manera. La oración es el fundamento de nuestra fe; es el núcleo de una manera mayordomía de la vida. El desarrollo de una vida de oración continua, coherente y activa es de suma importancia para cada uno de nosotros.

La oración no sólo indica nuestra conciencia constante de Dios, sino que mejora nuestras vidas, y es una indicación de nuestra confianza total en Dios. La confianza en Dios es también una faceta importante de la mayordomía. Sabiendo que estamos en manos de Dios y en Su cuidado es lo que nos fortalece y nos permite hacer el compromiso de Jesús nos ha pedido hacer. ## Friday Fish Feast 2015


