This will be a beautiful, powerful and important moment in my life in the Church. It would be an enormous blessing for me to have you there to participate in this day with me. STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

The more popular name for today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is Corpus Christi, which of course in Latin means the "Body of Christ." The Church has celebrated this feast at this time since it was proclaimed by Pope Urban IV in 1264.

We are asked on this day to concentrate on two expressions of the Body of Christ — the Holy Eucharist and the Church itself. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#1327) states the importance of the Eucharist quite succinctly and directly: "In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith." At the center of every Mass is our celebration of the Eucharist. The word "Eucharist" comes from the Greek word *eucharistia* which means "thanksgiving." It is through the Eucharist which we receive the Lord's greatest gift to us, and it should be in thanksgiving and delight which we receive it.



This holy day should also remind us of all those things for which we should be thankful. Gratitude is at the basis of a life of stewardship. It is through thanksgiving for all we have received, especially the Holy Body and Blood of Christ through the Eucharist, that we find the motivation and the commitment to be good stewards.

The Pontiff Emeritus Benedict XVI in one of his writings spoke of the Eucharist in this way: "In the Eucharist a communion takes place that corresponds to the union of man and woman in marriage. Just as they become 'one flesh,' so in the Eucharist we all become 'one spirit,' one person with Christ." Today we thank God for the incredible gift to us of the Eucharist.

REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

El nombre más popular para esta solemnidad del Santísimo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo es Corpus Christi, que por supuesto en latín significa el "Cuerpo de Cristo". La Iglesia ha celebrado esta fiesta en este momento desde que fue proclamado por el Papa Urbano IV en 1264.

Se nos pide en este día para concentrarse en dos expresiones del cuerpo de Cristo - la Santa Eucaristía y la Iglesia misma.

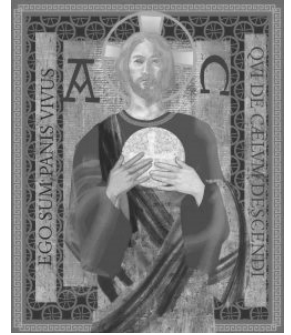
El *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica* (# 1327) señala la importancia de la Eucaristía de forma sucinta y directa: ". En

resumen, la Eucaristía es el compendio y la suma de nuestra fe" En el centro de cada misa es nuestra celebración de la Eucaristía. La palabra "Eucaristía" viene de la palabra griega *eucharistia* que significa "acción de gracias." Es a través de la Eucaristía que recibimos mayor don del Señor a nosotros, y que debe estar en acción de gracias y deleite que lo recibamos.

Este día santo también debería recordarnos todas aquellas cosas por las cuales debemos estar agradecidos. La gratitud es la base de una vida de mayordomía. Es a través de la acción de gracias por todo lo que hemos recibido, especialmente el Santo Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo a través de la Eucaristía, que nos encontramos con la motivación y el compromiso de ser buenos administradores.

El Pontífice emérito Benedicto XVI en uno de sus escritos habló de la Eucaristía de esta manera: "En la Eucaristía la comunión tiene lugar que corresponde a la unión del hombre y la mujer en el matrimonio. Del mismo modo que se convierten en "una sola carne", por lo que en la Eucaristía que todos se convierten en "un solo espíritu," una persona con Cristo. "Hoy damos gracias a Dios por el increíble regalo para nosotros de la Eucaristía.

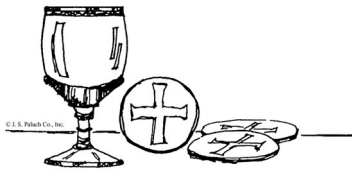
Mission Circle

Late Nite Catechism

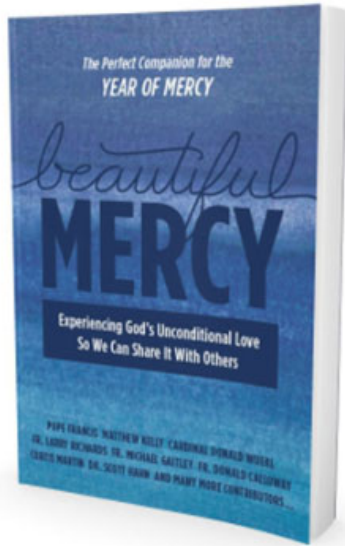
St. Elizabeth Seton Parish is hosting another version of *Late Nite Catechism* on Saturday, June 4 at 7 p.m.
