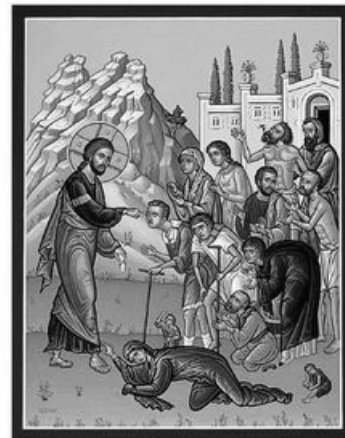

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Our Gospel Reading for today finishes with the Lord telling us, “For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will save it.” That may sound somewhat foreboding to us as we strive to follow Him and to be His disciple.

We need to see that from another perspective, however. Jesus was fond of teaching by using references to plants and planting. On multiple occasions he cites seeds in His teachings. If we consider it, we bury a seed; in effect it dies. Nevertheless, it must die for it to fulfill what it was intended to be. It cannot produce fruit, become a tree unless it goes through the process of dying to what it once was.



That is Jesus’ message for us. If we truly wish to follow Him, we must die to what we once may have been, or in some cases to what we may think we want to be. We have to learn to look at ourselves as the Lord might look at us. The ongoing question is “What does the Lord want me to be?” or “How does the Lord want me to serve Him and others?”

It is not easy to serve the Lord. It is not comfortable to always think of others first. Yet, those are Jesus’ instructions to us. That is His call to us. As He reminded us many times, “I came to serve, not to be served.” That needs to be our goal as well. That is what stewardship is all about.

REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

Nuestro Evangelio de hoy termina con el Señor que nos dice: "Porque el que quiera salvar su vida, la perderá; y el que pierda su vida por mí, la salvará." Eso puede sonar un tanto presagio para nosotros mientras nos esforzamos para seguirle y ser su discípulo.

Tenemos que ver que, desde otra perspectiva, sin embargo. Jesús era aficionado a la enseñanza mediante el uso de referencias a las plantas y la siembra. En múltiples ocasiones se cita a las semillas en sus enseñanzas. Si tenemos en cuenta que, enterramos una semilla; en efecto, se muere. Sin embargo, debe morir por ella para cumplir con lo que estaba destinado a ser. No puede producir frutos, convertido en un árbol a menos que pasa por el proceso de morir a lo que era antes.

Ese es el mensaje de Jesús por nosotros. Si verdaderamente queremos seguirle, debemos morir a lo que una vez que haya sido, o en algunos casos a lo que podamos pensar que queremos ser. Tenemos que aprender a mirar a nosotros mismos como el Señor podría mirar a nosotros. La pregunta en curso es "¿Qué quiere el Señor que sea?" O "¿Cómo quiere el Señor que yo sirva a Él ya los demás?"

No es fácil para servir al Señor. No es cómodo pensar siempre primero en los demás. Sin embargo, esas son las instrucciones de Jesús a nosotros. Esa es Su llamada a nosotros. Como nos ha recordado muchas veces, "Vine a servir, no a ser servido." Ese tiene que ser nuestro objetivo también. Eso es lo que la administración se trata.

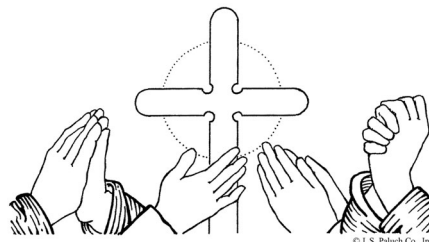

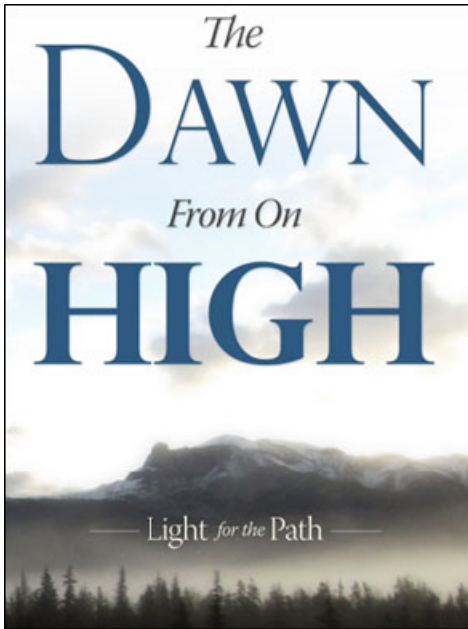
What Makes a Dad
