

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Most scholars are of the opinion that St. Paul wrote his letter to the Ephesians while he was imprisoned in Rome. Those who study Sacred Scripture find this letter different from most of Paul's letters, as rather than addressing particular problems which may have arisen in a Christian community established by Paul, it develops a theology, an explanation of what it means to be a Christian.



At the end of this particular reading, Paul makes reference to two important aspects of our faith and of our beliefs. St. Paul tells us that we have “believed in him (Jesus)” and that we are “sealed” with the promised Holy Spirit. Believing in Jesus, in His promises, in His redemption of us, is at the core of everything we do. This trust, this belief, is what allows us to take the steps needed to follow Him, to be His disciple, and to practice a stewardship way of living.

Note that we believe first, however, and then we are sealed. Yes, we are sealed at Baptism and at Confirmation as those represent our promises to the Lord. We do not need some assurance from God as to His good graces. By believing, by having faith and trust, we are able to be Christ's representative. It is worth recalling and repeating that well-known quote from St. Thomas Aquinas: “To one who has faith, no explanation is necessary; to one without faith, no explanation is possible.”

REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

La mayoría de los eruditos son de la opinión de que St. Paul escribió su carta a los Efesios mientras estaba encarcelado en Roma. Los que estudian la Sagrada Escritura encontramos esta carta diferente de la mayoría de las cartas de Pablo, ya que en lugar de abordar los problemas específicos que puedan haber surgido en una comunidad cristiana establecida por Pablo, se desarrolla una teología, una explicación de lo que significa ser cristiano.



Al final de esta lectura particular, Pablo hace referencia a dos aspectos importantes de nuestra fe y de nuestras creencias. St. Paul nos dice que hemos "creído en él (Jesús)" y que estamos "sellado" con el Espíritu Santo prometido. Creer en Jesús, en sus promesas, en Su redención de nosotros, es el núcleo de todo lo que hacemos. Esta confianza, esta creencia, es lo que nos permite tomar las medidas necesarias para seguirle, ser su discípulo, y practicar una forma mayordomía de vida.

Tenga en cuenta que nosotros creemos en primer lugar, sin embargo, y luego somos sellados. Sí, somos sellados en el Bautismo y en la Confirmación como las que representan nuestras promesas al Señor. No necesitamos cierta garantía de Dios como a sus buenas gracias. Al creer, por tener fe y confianza, somos capaces de ser el representante de Cristo. Vale la pena recordar y repetir que conocida cita de Santo Tomás de Aquino: "Para aquel que tiene fe, ninguna explicación es necesaria; a uno sin fe, ninguna explicación es posible".

Being Good Stewards of Our Common Home: The Pope's Encyclical

Seldom has a papal encyclical been anticipated with so much noise and discussion and even premature criticism and fear as our Holy Father, Pope Francis' *Laudato si* ("Praise Be to You"); with a beautiful subtitle "On Care for Our Common Home." This is the pope's encyclical on the environment – easily found on Google but most of us will admit encyclicals aren't as engrossing as our favorite summer reading. Nevertheless, it deserves our prayerful attention; not just the commentary that journalists, pundits, radio hosts and television analysts provide



The letter urges us to examine our lifestyles and invites us to prayerfully consider a significant shift in our own practices and habits.

Each of us, as Christian stewards, will find something that inspires and challenges us from Pope Francis' prescription for a healthy planet. For many readers, the challenge might come particularly in the pope's warnings about "extreme and

selective consumerism." In our culture, we're taught that more is better – more production, more growth, more profits, more spending. But can the earth sustain this kind of economic dogma? Pope Francis echoes the Catholic teaching tradition that we should "replace consumption with sacrifice, greed with generosity, wastefulness with a spirit of sharing."

The letter urges us to examine our lifestyles and invites us to prayerfully consider a significant shift in our own practices and habits. For example, one question we should ask ourselves: Can we live with less? A visit to our closets is a good place to start, and while committing to buy less, we might ruminate on the mistaken values of our consumer economy and culture. Our pontiff points out that one-third of food that is produced is discarded. Again, our own kitchens present evidence of our complicity in this wastefulness.

The poor suffer the most from changes in the earth's complex ecosystem, and that is readily evidenced by their struggle simply to find clean water. The pope also reminds us as Christians called to exercise good stewardship of the planet to consider what in our own life comprises "need" and what is "greed."

Pope Francis urgently calls us to a renewed commitment to the Eucharist as well – something many commentators fail to mention – and asks us to rediscover our common bond within this "act of cosmic love." For the Christian steward, improving the environment must be a topic of prayer, a chance to call our politicians to action, and a time to renew our commitment to that wonderful Catholic principle of the common good.
