

STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

St. Paul offers a formula for living the way we are

supposed to live as Christians in the Second Reading. Paul writes, "Do nothing out of selfishness or out of vainglory; rather, humbly regard others as more important than yourselves." Doing that is a challenge for most all of us. Yet, that is one of the secrets to being a good steward and living as Christ wants us to live.



To truly live that way requires a dramatic conversion. All of us know people who are so self-centered that they often are not even aware that they are totally unwilling to compromise or to even recognize the value of those around them. Achieving this kind of self awareness, of what kind of a person we are, is a significant step on our faith and life journeys.

Screenwriter and playwright William Nicholson once wrote, "God does not necessarily want us to be happy. He wants us to be lovable, worthy of love, able to be loved by Him. What makes people hard to love? It is called selfishness. Selfish people are hard to love, because so little love comes out of them."

That is our challenge, to love others in such a way that we become lovable as well. Christ told us over and over that the secret to being His disciple and the secret to being a good steward is to "Love your neighbor." That is how to be the kind of person Paul calls us to be as well.



REFLECION DOMINICAL

San Pablo ofrece una fórmula para vivir la forma en

que se supone que vivimos como cristianos en la Segunda Lectura. Pablo escribe: "No hagáis nada por egoísmo o por vanagloria; más bien, humildemente consideran a los demás como más importantes que vosotros mismos ". Hacer eso es un desafío para la mayoría de todos



nosotros. Sin embargo, ese es uno de los secretos para ser un buen mayordomo y vivir como Cristo quiere que vivamos.

Realmente vivir de esa manera requiere una conversión dramática. Todos conocemos personas que son tan egocéntricas que a menudo ni siquiera son conscientes de que están totalmente dispuestos a comprometer o incluso reconocer el valor de los que les rodean. Lograr este tipo de conciencia de sí mismo, de qué tipo de persona somos, es un paso significativo en nuestra fe y en los viajes de la vida.

El guionista y dramaturgo William Nicholson escribió una vez: "Dios no quiere necesariamente que seamos felices. Quiere que seamos amables, dignos de amor, capaces de ser amados por Él. ¿Qué hace a la gente difícil de amar? Se llama egoísmo. Las personas egoístas son difíciles de amar, porque tan poco amor sale de ellas. "

Ese es nuestro desafío, amar a los demás de tal manera que nos volvamos amables también. Cristo nos dijo una y otra vez que el secreto de ser su discípulo y el secreto de ser un buen mayordomo es "amar a tu prójimo". Así es como ser el tipo de persona que Pablo nos llama a ser así.


St. Thomas More ANNUAL MEN'S RETREAT
