STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Our First Reading from the Old Testament Book of Habbakuk is once

again from someone we consider to be a minor prophet.

However, Habbakuk, like other

divinely-inspired writers of the Bible, captures the essence of messages and

prophecies that have

universal applicability not only in his time, but to us today.



Habbakuk was writing more than 600 years before the birth of Christ that is more than 2,600 years before now. Yet he addresses a stewardship approach to life in ways that are significant to us today. Scholars generally agree that the overall theme of Habbakuk is trying to grow from a faith that might be termed perplexing and sometimes doubtful to a point where we place absolute trust in God.

In today's reading, Habbakuk deals with the situation of when someone believes in God, but when they look at the world around them, it does not seem to match what God wants. Isn't that true of today's world as we are inundated with tragic and horrible news almost on a daily basis?

Trust in God is the key for us to be good stewards, and it is at the crux of the power of faith. In his *Memoirs* Pope Benedict XVI said, "The more I reflect on it, the more I understand that the nature of human life is that it is ever Holy Saturday, not Easter Sunday. We are still awaiting Easter; we are not standing in full light, but walking toward it full of trust." That trust is the secret!

REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

Nuestra primera lectura, tomada del Antiguo Testamento Libro de Habacuc es una vez más de alguien que consideramos como un profeta menor. Sin embargo, Habacuc, al igual que otros autores inspirados divinamente de la Biblia, captura la esencia de los mensajes y profecías que tienen aplicabilidad universal, no sólo en su tiempo, pero nosotros hoy.



Habacuc estaba escribiendo más de 600 años antes del nacimiento de Cristo, que es más de 2.600 años antes de ahora. Sin embargo, él se dirige a un enfoque de la administración a la vida en formas que son importantes para nosotros hoy en día. Los eruditos generalmente están de acuerdo que el tema general de Habbakuk está tratando de crecer a partir de una fe que podría denominarse desconcertante y, a veces dudosa a un punto en el que ponemos la confianza absoluta en Dios.

En la lectura de hoy, Habbakuk se ocupa de la situación de cuando alguien cree en Dios, pero cuando se ven en el mundo que les rodea, no parece coincidir con lo que Dios quiere. ¿No es cierto en el mundo de hoy como estamos inundados de noticias trágica y horrible casi a diario?

La confianza en Dios es la clave para que seamos buenos administradores, y es el quid de la fuerza de la fe. En sus *Memorias* Papa Benedicto XVI dijo: "Cuanto más pienso en ello, más entiendo que la naturaleza de la vida humana es que cada vez es Sábado Santo, no el domingo de Pascua. Estamos en espera de Pascua; no estamos parados en plena luz, pero caminando hacia ella llena de confianza. "Esa confianza es el secreto!
