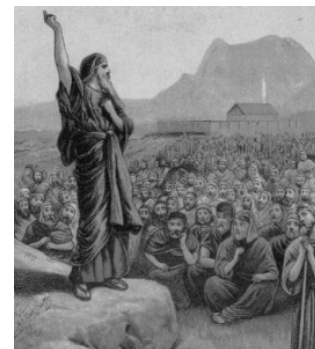
## STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION

Literally speaking, “Deuteronomy,” as in the Book of Deuteronomy, means “Second Law.” This Old Testament Book from which our First Reading is drawn actually consists of three sermons delivered to the Israelites by Moses. Interestingly, in German, this book is called just *Mose*, drawing the name from the opening line of the Book which states, quite simply, “These are the words of Moses.”

In today's reading Moses speaks not just to the Israelites, but to us as well, as is always the case with Holy Scripture. Moses makes reference to giving of one's first fruits. Specifically he says, “Therefore, I have now brought you the first fruits of the products of the soil which you, O Lord, have given me, and having set them before the Lord, your God, you shall bow down in his presence.”

Giving of first fruits is a way to acknowledge and honor God because it provides the Lord with His portion first, before any is used for one's self. That, of course, is an important aspect of stewardship, as challenging as that may be. Moses points out that it is more than giving first fruits, however. He recognizes that all comes from God, and we are called to return this first portion in thanksgiving for God's grace and love and blessings.

Moses would also remind us that giving must come from the heart, with a true attitude of gratitude. It is part of the way we worship the Lord by being stewards of His gifts.

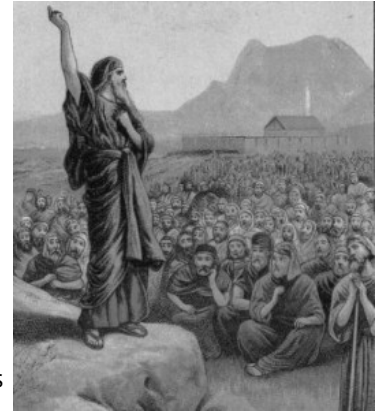

## REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

Literalmente hablando, "Deuteronomio", como en el libro de Deuteronomio, significa "segunda ley". Este libro del Antiguo Testamento de la cual la primera lectura se dibuja en realidad se compone de tres sermones entregados a los hijos de Israel por medio de Moisés. Curiosamente, en alemán, este libro es llamado simplemente *Mose*, dibujo el nombre de la línea de apertura del libro que dice, simplemente, "Estas son las palabras de Moisés."

En la lectura de hoy Moisés no habla sólo para los hijos de Israel, pero a nosotros también, como es siempre el caso con la Santa Escritura. Moisés hace referencia a dar los primeros frutos de uno. En concreto, dice: "Por tanto, ahora he traído las primicias de los productos de la tierra, que tú, Señor, me has dado, y haberlos puesto ante el Señor, tu Dios, te inclinarás en su presencia. "



Dando los primeros frutos es una manera de reconocer y honrar a Dios, ya que proporciona al Señor con su primera parte, antes de que cualquier se utiliza para uno mismo. Eso, por supuesto, es un aspecto importante de la administración, tan difícil como eso puede ser. Moisés señala que es más que dar los primeros frutos, sin embargo. Reconoce que todo viene de Dios, y nosotros estamos llamados a devolver esta primera parte, en acción de gracias por la gracia y el amor y las bendiciones de Dios.

Moisés también nos recuerda que la administración debe venir del corazón, con una verdadera actitud de agradecimiento. Es parte de la forma en que adoramos al Señor por ser administradores de sus dones.

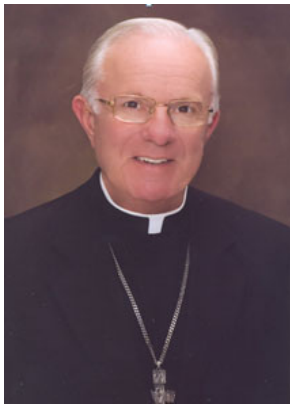
