**STEWARDSHIP REFLECTION**

The Book of Leviticus from which our First Reading comes is the third book in the Old Testament. Its name in part comes from the Levites, who were the tribe to which Aaron belonged. Historically Aaron is considered to be the one from whom priests are descended. However,



the Bible offers instructions to all of us, not just to priests. In today's reading from Leviticus, God says to Moses that he should teach the people this: "Be holy, for I, the LORD, your God, am holy."

There is no way, of course, that we can be as holy as God is. God is divine, not human, and thus His Holiness is above and way beyond our capabilities. What God is saying to us though is that we do need to strive for holiness. We often speak of our call to holiness and how we can try to achieve that. One way is to embrace stewardship and all it entails as a way of life.

Will that make us holy like the Lord? No, but it does mean that we need to comprehend that it is God and God's wisdom we must embrace and follow. Holiness for us means we need to attempt to separate ourselves from those things and thoughts and ideas which can be viewed as not holy in the Eyes of God. Yes, it is impossible for us, but yet that is what we must try to do.

## REFLECIÓN DOMINICAL

El libro de Levítico partir de la cual la primera lectura viene es el tercer libro en el Antiguo Testamento. Su nombre, en parte, proviene de los levitas, que eran la tribu a la que pertenecía Aaron. Históricamente Aaron se considera que es aquel de quien descienden los sacerdotes. Sin embargo, la Biblia ofrece instrucciones para todos nosotros, no sólo a los sacerdotes. En la lectura de hoy de Levítico, Dios le dice a Moisés que debe enseñar a las personas esto: "Sed santos, porque yo, el Señor, tu Dios, soy santo."



No hay manera, por supuesto, que podemos ser tan santo como Dios es. Dios es divina, no humana, y por lo tanto Su Santidad está por encima y más allá de nuestras capacidades. Lo que Dios nos está diciendo es que aunque sí tenemos que tender a la santidad. A menudo hablamos de nuestra llamada a la santidad y cómo podemos tratar de lograr eso. Una forma es abrazar la administración y todo lo que conlleva como una forma de vida.

¿Eso nos hace santo como el Señor? No, pero sí quiere decir que tenemos que comprender que se trata de Dios y sabiduría de Dios debemos abrazar y seguir. La santidad para nosotros significa que tenemos que tratar de separarnos de las cosas y los pensamientos e ideas que pueden ser vistos como no santo a los ojos de Dios. Sí, es imposible para nosotros, pero sin embargo eso es lo que hay que tratar de hacer.

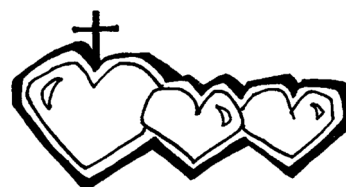

## DIVINE WISDOM

The Lord's message, through Moses, was to “take no revenge and cherish no grudge . . . love your neighbor as yourself” (Leviticus 19:18). We might think, “Great in theory, but not always realistic!”

Then Jesus in today's Gospel goes even further. Take a slap in the face and then turn the other cheek? Treat enemies the same as friends? Again, we're tempted to think that those are nice ideals, but not very practical in the “real world.”

Paul echoes Jesus when he tells the Corinthians that what passes for human wisdom is absurdity to God. Divine wisdom casts sunshine on the good and the bad, showers rain on the honest and the dishonest—without distinction. We must examine our wisdom and common sense to see how they compare to the wisdom of God, and make adjustments accordingly.

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

In brushing up for “Catholic Jeopardy,” it might help to know that there is only one feast on the calendar for a thing, rather than a person or mystery. It’s for a chair: Saint Peter’s chair in fact.

After the Resurrection, there can be no doubt that the disciples reserved a special place for Simon Peter in the upper room. Later, Peter became the bishop of Antioch in today’s Syria, the place where we were first called “Christians.” From there, he went to Rome, the center of the Empire, where it is said that Peter sat in a chair in the house of Priscilla and Aquila to instruct his flock. Jesus, in entrusting the keys of the Kingdom to Peter and his successors, entrusted his compassion and mercy to them, and charged them with pointing to the Kingdom of God. Compassion and mercy are to resonate through their teaching.

Since the ancient sign of a teacher is the chair (“disciple” literally means one who sits at the feet of a teacher), Peter’s chair has long been treasured. Today there is a symbolic shrine of Peter’s chair above the main altar of St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome. This monument is the last work of Bernini, a huge bronze throne supported by four doctors of the Church: Augustine and Ambrose from the Western Church, and Chrysostom and Athanasius from the East. High above it is the alabaster window of the descent of the Holy Spirit.
