Fr. Gerard's Corner

Luke and Acts are two parts of a narrative, written by the same author. The Gospel focused on the life of Jesus, Acts on the early church. In his Gospel, Luke writes that Jesus said, "When they take you before synagogues and before rulers and authorities, do not worry about how or what your defense will be or what you are to say. For the holy Spirit will teach you at that moment what you should say" (Luke 12:11-12). Then in Acts, after Jesus has given the Holy Spirit, we repeatedly see this put into action.

In the first reading Peter is responding to Annas, Caiaphas, and other members of the Sanhedrin after he had cured a disabled man who often sat at the temple gate and begged. Peter had been arrested and was called before the council. Forced to defend himself, he relied on the Holy Spirit for wisdom and courage. Realizing that he was merely the instrument—that the power truly came from God—Peter wisely and correctly testified that the man was healed through Christ Jesus, who is the source of all salvation. Furthermore, the Holy Spirit gave him the courage to say this, to the very people who saw to it that that same Jesus was put to death.

The Sanhedrin released Peter, in no small part because of the number of people who saw what happened and came to believe in Jesus that day. Through incidents like this, the early church grew in numbers and in faith. In the name of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, who told his disciples he had other sheep who would also hear his voice, and who gave us the Holy Spirit who is our Advocate, lives are transformed and the Body of Christ expands.

Stewardship Reflection


“He is the stone rejected by you, the builders, which has become the cornerstone.” This is St Peter preaching again in the First Reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

However, in this instance he is speaking at his own trial. He and St. John had been imprisoned.

What a different man Peter is compared to the man who denied Jesus in fear! Peter is no longer intimidated by the authorities; keep in mind that this is in effect the same court which condemned Christ to crucifixion. Earlier in Acts we witness Peter and the other disciples being filled with the Holy Spirit. This is not a one-time event, but something ongoing throughout their lives.

A woman named Corrie Ten Boom was a resistance leader and practitioner in the Netherlands in World War II. She and her sister provided a hiding place for Jews and others being sought by the Nazis. She later wrote a book titled *The Hiding Place* about those experiences. The Ten Booms were betrayed in 1944, arrested, and brought to trial. What she stated at that trial very much parallels what we hear from St. Peter today. She cited the power of the Holy Spirit.

She said, “Trying to do the Lord’s work in your own strength is the most confusing, exhausting, and tedious of all work. But when you are filled with the Holy Spirit, then the ministry of Jesus just flows out of you.” Like St. Peter and Corrie Ten Boom, we are all filled with the Holy Spirit. Do we let it flow out of us?

El rincón de P. Gerardo

El Evangelio de Lucas y los Hechos de los Apóstoles son dos partes de una narración escrita por el mismo autor. El Evangelio se concentró en la vida de Jesús y los Hechos en la Iglesia primitiva. Lucas, en su Evangelio, escribe que Jesús dijo: “Cuando los lleven a las sinagogas y ante los jueces y autoridades, no se preocupen de cómo se van a defender o qué van a decir, porque el Espíritu Santo les enseñará en aquel momento lo que convenga decir”(Lucas 12, 11-12). Eso lo vemos repetidamente en los Hechos, después que Jesús ha dado el Espíritu Santo.

En la primera lectura vemos cómo Pedro le responde a Anás y Caifás, y a otros miembros del Sanedrín después de haber curado a un hombre discapacitado que a menudo se sentaba a la puerta del templo para pedir limosna. Pedro había sido arrestado y ahora comparecía ante el consejo. Habiendo sido forzado a defenderse, confiaba ahora en el Espíritu Santo que le diera sabiduría y valor. Consciente de que era sólo un instrumento y que verdaderamente el poder venía de Dios, Pedro, sabia y correctamente, testificó que el hombre había sido curado por medio de Cristo Jesús, que es la fuente de toda la salvación. Además, el Espíritu Santo le dio el valor para decir eso a la precisa gente que se habían asegurado de que mataran a Jesús.

El sanedrín dejó a Pedro en libertad, porque un buen número de gente vio lo que había pasado y ese día llegaron a creer en Jesús. Debido a incidentes como éste la Iglesia primitiva creció en número y en la fe. En el nombre de Jesús, el Buen Pastor, que le dijo a sus discípulos que habían otras ovejas que también oírían su voz y que nos dio el Espíritu Santo, nuestro Consolador, hay vidas que se transforman y así el Cuerpo de Cristo se extiende.


