Fr. Gerard's Corner

Jesus commands us to show mercy to those who hurt us. "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful" (Luke 6:36). We are called to be merciful not just because it is the right thing to do, but also because God is merciful. But there is another implication. Since we are created in the image of God, and God is merciful, we are created to be merciful. This is not some additional feature that Jesus is calling forth from his disciples. This is part of our constitution, our humanity. It is no accident that *humane* is often used as a synonym for *merciful*. To be human is to be merciful.

Later, Jesus offered the most extreme example of mercy when he died on the cross. Today's Gospel passage is not regarded as a prediction of his passion, but it could be. Everything that he said to his disciples on this occasion, early in his ministry, happened to him on Good Friday. He was hated, he was cursed, he was mistreated. He was struck on the cheek, his cloak was taken from him. Jesus forgave them all, saying on the cross, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do" (Luke 23:34).

Saint Paul compares Adam and Jesus. Going back again to the creation narrative, God blew the breath of life into Adam's nostrils. Adam became the first recipient of God's life-giving spirit. Jesus, after his resurrection, breathed upon his disciples, giving them the Holy Spirit. God literally breathes life and the Spirit into humanity.

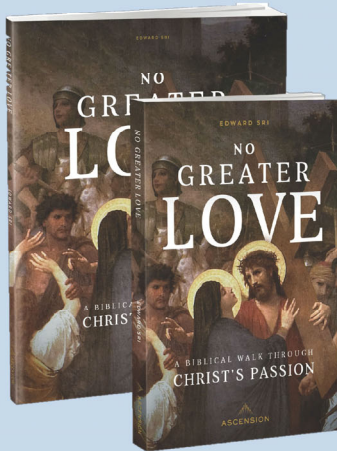

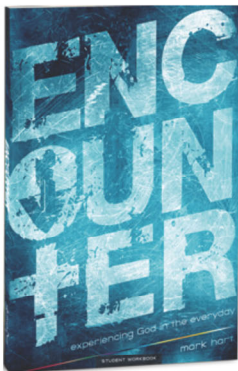

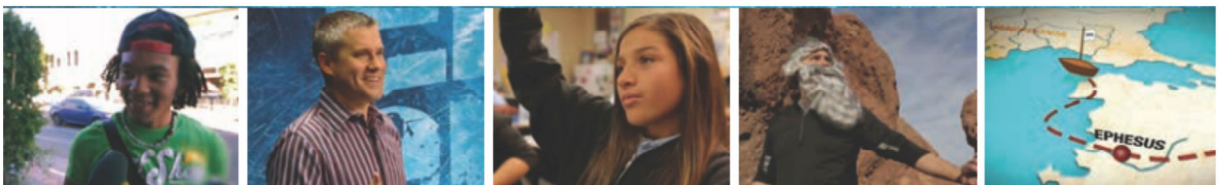

Bendiciones y maldiciones. Lo primero es siempre maravilloso; lo segundo es preocupante. Muchas veces es obvio por qué Dios maldice algo o a alguien: la serpiente anima a Eva para que desobedezca, la higuera no da fruto, los malvados llevan a otras personas por caminos equivocados. Pero, ¿por qué maldecir a los que confían en su prójimo, a los que tienen en abundancia o a los que ríen? Es importante ver el contexto. En el pasaje de Jeremías, Dios no maldice al esposo que confía en su esposa o a la hija que confía en su padre o su madre. Los maldecidos son aquellos que se alejan de Dios y ponen su confianza en las creaturas falibles. Jesús nota que algunos tienen más que suficiente mientras que otros carecen de lo necesario. Algunos le dan su espalda a la miseria de otros. Estas personas tendrán un futuro difícil.

Jesús voltea el mundo de cabeza. Aquellos que gozan de riquezas, felicidad y fama verán su éxito desmoronarse. Aquellos que sufren por hambre, pobreza y escarnio serán al final recompensados. Ésta es la naturaleza paradójica del Reino de Dios. Después de todo, éste es el reino al cual se refiere san Pablo en la segunda lectura, el reino al cual ascendió Jesús en la paradoja más grande de la historia: por morir como un criminal en la cruz, Jesús resucita a la gloria eterna.

Jeremías, Pablo y Jesús nos hacen un llamado a transformar nuestra vida. La manera de lograr eso es cambiar nuestra perspectiva. Haciéndonos eco de san Pablo, no hemos sido creados sólo para esta vida, sino para la vida eterna con Dios.

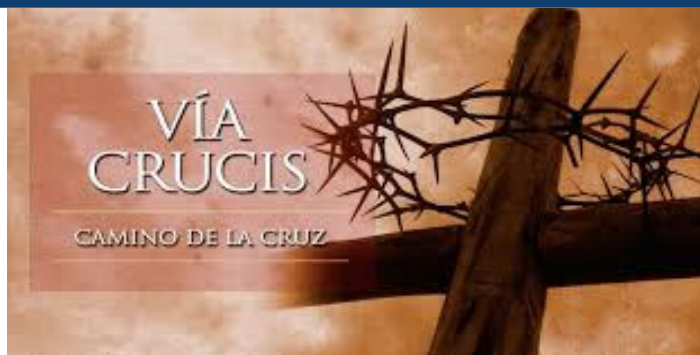
