Fr. Gerard's Corner

Between the first reading and the Gospel, we hear of three of the main figures of the Hebrew scriptures: Abraham, Moses, and Elijah. All three encountered God repeatedly and dramatically. Fire is often used in scripture to symbolize the presence of God. We hear today of the flaming torch that bound the covenant God made with Abraham. We know the stories of Moses seeing God in the burning bush and Elijah taken up to heaven in a fiery chariot. We cannot expect that God will speak with us so dramatically. But if we do not listen, we may fail to realize that God speaks to us today.

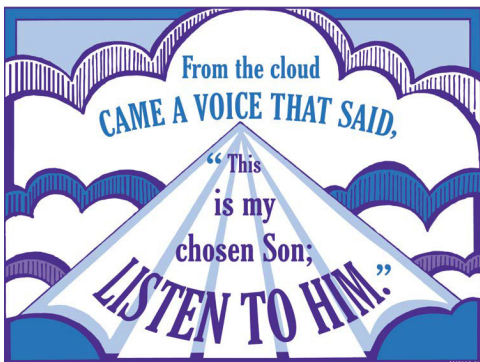
Most of us are citizens of the country in which we live, though many of us are not. Some of us may even be citizens of more than one country. Saint Paul traveled extensively, spending much of his time in foreign countries. But today we hear him tell the Philippians that Christians are not citizens of Jerusalem, or Rome, or anywhere on earth. "Our citizenship is in heaven," he writes (Philippians 3:20). Think about that for a moment. All of us, no matter where we were born, where we grew up, what language we speak, or where we live now, are fellow citizens, baptized into citizenship with God.

In the synoptic Gospels, Peter, James, and John are the three disciples mentioned most often, the disciples closest to Jesus. Here he specifically chooses them to witness his transfiguration. We pray that like them we may be worthy witnesses of the transformative power of God in our lives.

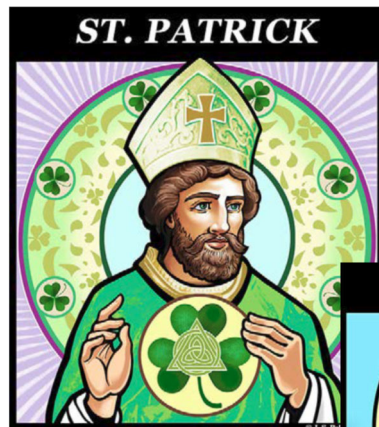

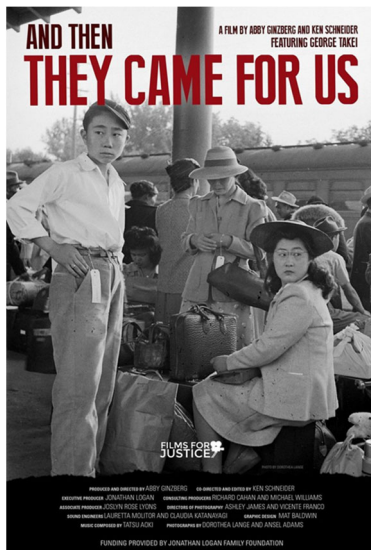

Seventy-five years ago, Executive Order 9066 paved the way to the profound violation of constitutional rights that resulted in the forced incarceration of 120,000 Japanese Americans. Featuring George Takei and many others who were incarcerated, as well as newly rediscovered photographs of Dorothea Lange. And Then They Came for Us brings history into the present, retelling this difficult story and following Japanese American activists as they speak out against the Muslim registry and travel ban. Knowing our history is the first step to ensuring we do not repeat it. And Then They Came for Us is a cautionary and inspiring tale for these dark times.

Special Guest Speaker: Professor Lorraine Bannai served as the attorney for the legal team of Fred Korematsu when his case was re-opened (coram nobis) and his conviction was overturned.

Korematsu was an American civil rights activist who objected to the internment of the Japanese Americans during World War II. Professor Bannai is also author of *Enduring Conviction: Fred Korematsu and His Quest for Justice* (2015).

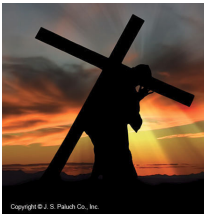

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

By now, many may have failed in Lenten discipline to some measure or another: the daily doughnut is simply too alluring, or a furtive puff on a cigarette irresistible. There is meaning even in the failure, though, a kind of reminder that we cannot save ourselves. Part of the power of Lent is that we do it together, and although individuals decide on different ways to keep it, it is fundamentally the same journey. We fall, we get up, we keep moving. The desire to “give something up” for Lent is an age-old impulse in the Christian heart. We get better at it over the years, and move more deeply into the meaning and message of acts of sacrifice; so there is no shame in stumbling, as long as we are not discouraged by the failure and give up. We are clearing space in our lives, after all, and some of the things we desire to give up are worth rooting out completely anyway.

What do we do with the space we have cleared out by our sacrifice? The Lenten question of giving up is balanced by the Easter question of our response to Christ’s embrace of us in love: “What are you taking on for Easter?”

El rincón del P. Gerardo

Entre la primera lectura y el Evangelio escuchamos acerca de tres de las figuras más importantes de las Escrituras hebreas: Abraham, Moisés y Elías. Los tres tuvieron repetidos e impresionantes encuentros con Dios. El fuego se usa a menudo en las Escrituras para simbolizar la presencia de Dios. Hoy escuchamos acerca de la antorcha encendida que cerró la alianza que Dios hizo con Abraham. Conocemos las historias de cuando Moisés vio a Dios en la zarza ardiente y cuando Elías, en un carro de fuego, subió al cielo en un remolino. No podemos esperar que Dios nos hable de una manera tan dramática, pero si no estamos a la escucha dejaríamos de darnos cuenta de que Dios nos está hablando hoy.

La mayoría de nosotros somos ciudadanos del país en que vivimos, aunque no es así para muchos de nosotros. Algunos de nosotros hasta somos ciudadanos de más de un país. San Pablo viajó extensamente y pasó mucho de su tiempo en países extranjeros, pero hoy lo escuchamos decir a los filipenses que los cristianos no son ciudadanos de Jerusalén, ni de Roma, ni de ningún otro lugar en la tierra. Nosotros “somos ciudadanos del cielo” (filipenses 3, 20), dice san Pablo. Pensemos en eso por un momento. Todos nosotros, sin importar dónde nacimos, dónde nos criamos, qué idioma hablamos o dónde vivimos ahora, somos conciudadanos, bautizados en la ciudadanía de Dios.

En los Evangelios sinópticos Pedro, Santiago y Juan son los discípulos que se mencionan con más frecuencia y los más cercanos a Jesús. En el pasaje de hoy él los escoge específicamente para que sean testigos de su transfiguración. Nosotros oramos para que, como ellos, seamos testigos dignos del poder transformador de Dios en nuestra vida.

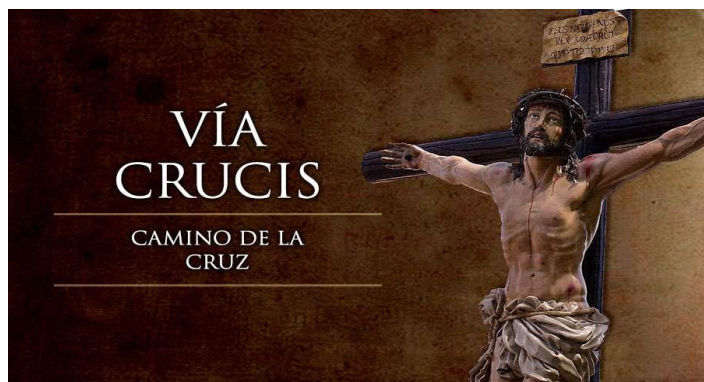

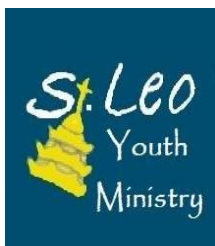
