Fr. Gerard's Corner

The word of God is dynamic. It inspires action. Isaiah preaches that day after day God opens his ears, suggesting that there is freshness in God's word each day. Moreover, Isaiah is called to use God's word to rouse the people, to get them to act. God's word means to do more than inform or instruct, it is to drive people to act.

None of us can honestly say that we are worse off than Jesus was at his death. Emptied of all his divine privileges, obedient to the will of God, humbling himself as a slave, he accepted the abuse, the conviction, and the death sentence. He has been betrayed by one friend, denied by another, and abandoned by the rest. He has no possessions. All he had was the clothes on his back, and even those are taken away. He is humiliated, disgraced, put to shame. He is all alone. No, he is not alone. He knows God has not abandoned him. Nor are any of us alone. No matter how horrible our lot is, we are not alone.

Jesus has placed his trust in God and has surrendered to God's will, so throughout the narrative his concern is not with his own fate, but with those of others: his disciples, Peter, the high priest's servant, the women of Jerusalem, the penitent criminal. The word *compassion* literally means "to suffer with," and in the midst of his greatest suffering Jesus suffers with all these people he encounters on the path to his death. Even on the cross, hours from death, he shows compassion to the criminal who asks for mercy.

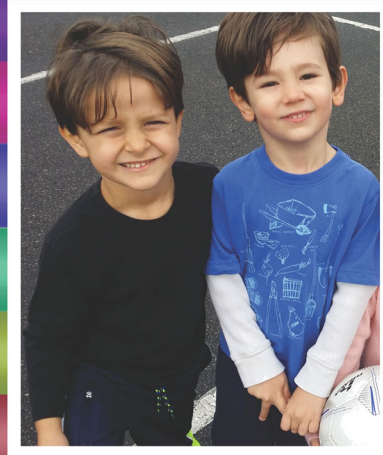

Además, Isaías tiene el llamado de usar la palabra de Dios para estimular a las personas y hacerlas actuar. La palabra de Dios tiene el propósito de hacer más que informar o instruir, es para llevar a las personas a la acción.

Ninguno de nosotros puede decir honestamente que estamos peor que Jesús a la hora de su muerte. Él se vació de todos sus privilegios divinos, obedeció la voluntad de Dios, se humilló como un esclavo, aceptó el abuso, la condena y hasta la sentencia de muerte. Había sido traicionado por un amigo, negado por otro y abandonado por el resto. No tenía bienes propios. Todo lo que tenía era la ropa puesta y se la quitaron. Fue humillado, deshonrado y avergonzado. Está completamente solo. Pero no, no está solo. Sabe que Dios no lo ha abandonado. Ni ninguno de nosotros estamos solos. No importa cuán horrible sea nuestra suerte, no estamos solos.

Jesús ha puesto su confianza en Dios y se ha sometido a la voluntad de Dios, por eso en toda la narración su preocupación no es por su propia suerte, sino por sus discípulos, por Pedro, por el criado del sumo sacerdote, por las mujeres de Jerusalén, por el criminal penitente. La palabra compasión quiere decir textualmente “sufrir con” y en medio de su mayor sufrimiento Jesús sufre con todas esas personas que encuentra en el camino hacia su muerte. Aún desde la cruz, a sólo horas de su muerte, muestra compasión por el criminal que pide misericordia

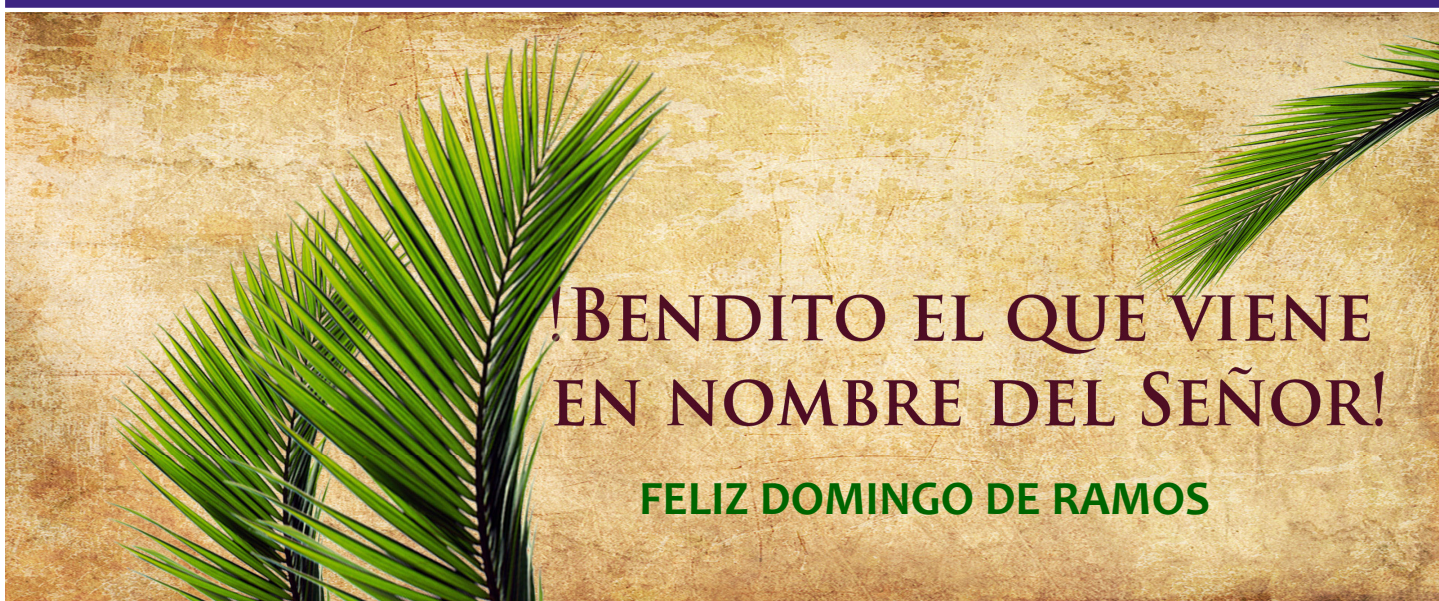
