Fr. Gerard's Corner

The early church enjoyed a fruitful time immediately after Jesus' resurrection and ascension, but it was also a dangerous time. Neither the Roman government nor the Jewish leaders took kindly to the preaching and proselytizing of apostles like Peter and Paul. But the work they did and the message they delivered brought many converts. In Acts, we hear that some people were scared to join Peter, though they held him in high esteem. In the end, their faith won out, evidenced by the sheer number of people they brought who were in need of healing. We too are called to be bold in our faith, no matter where it leads us.

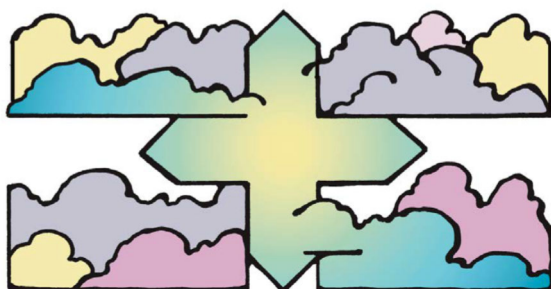
The fear felt by the original disciples is revealed in the very first sentence of the Gospel: "the doors were locked" (John 20:19). After all, Jesus had just been arrested, convicted, and sentenced to death by an alliance of religious and secular authorities. How comforting, then, that the first word spoken by the Risen Jesus to his disciples is "Peace." Both on that first day and then again a week later, Jesus greets them with "Peace be with you" (John 20:19, 26). He offers exactly what the disciples, fearful and lost, needed.

Similarly, in John's vision set down in the book of Revelation, Jesus addresses him, saying, "Do not be afraid" (Revelation 1:17). It is human nature to react to anxiety and distress with fear. Jesus brings peace and reassurance to us. This is one way in which God's mercy comes to us just when we need it the most.

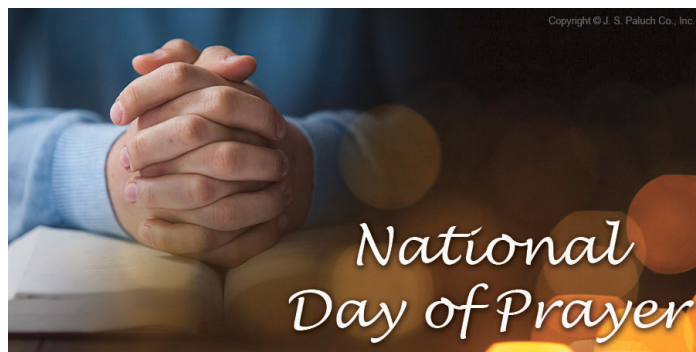

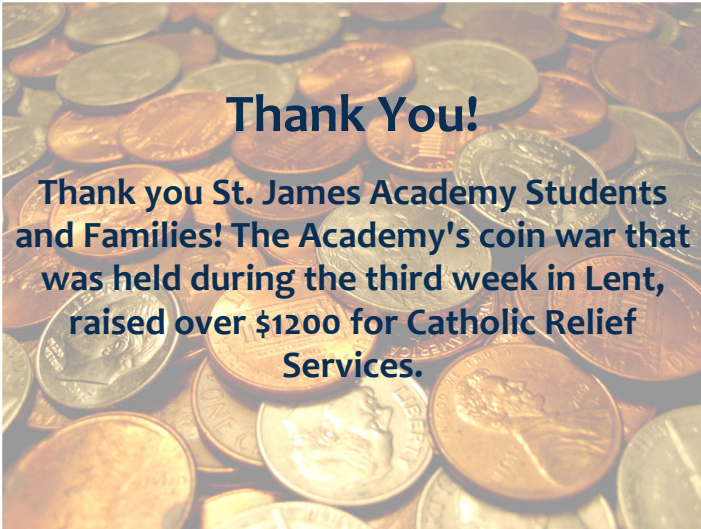

St. James Academy awarded California 2019 Green Achiever Award

Pope Francis asks us to "hear the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor." St. James Academy's efforts to put our faith into action have led the State of California to designate our school as a top 2019 Green Achiever and to further nominate the school for the U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Award for excellence in resource efficiency, health and wellness and sustainability education.

With the support of wonderful teachers, students, parent volunteers and donors, the school is in the process of completing a new green schoolyard along the west side of campus featuring an outdoor classroom, Monarch butterfly mural and conservation, Kumeyaay Native American garden, California native pollinator garden, worm composting and organic vegetable garden. The school has installed reusable water bottle filling stations to reduce single-use plastic as well as energy saving LED lights throughout the campus. The St. James parish has contributed by installing roof top solar panels, drought tolerant landscaping, and electric vehicle charging stations (with a grant through Electrify America).

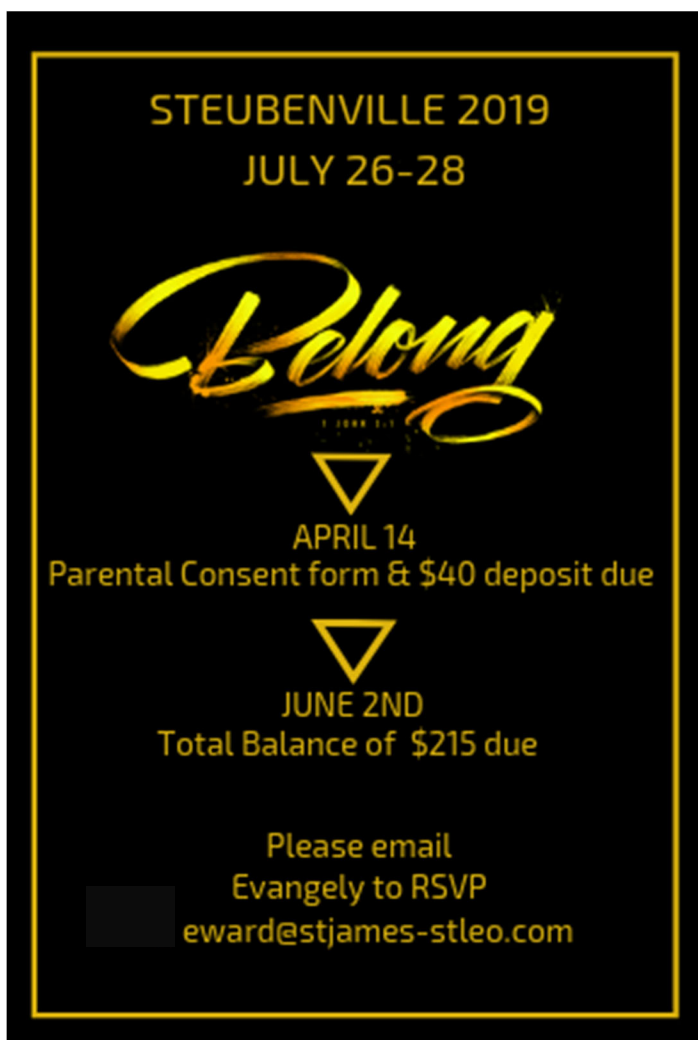

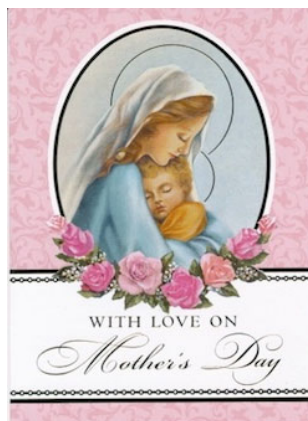

El rincón del P. Gerardo

La Iglesia primitiva gozó de un tiempo fructífero inmediatamente después de la resurrección y ascensión de Jesús, pero también fue un tiempo peligroso. Ni el gobierno romano ni los líderes judíos vieron con buenos ojos la predicación y el proselitismo de los apóstoles, como lo eran Pedro y Pablo, aunque las obras que hicieron produjeron muchos conversos. En la proclamación de los Hechos de los Apóstoles escuchamos que algunas personas tenían temor de unirse a Pedro aunque lo tenían en gran estima. A la larga la fe ganó tal como es evidente por el puro número de personas que les traían para ser curadas. También nosotros somos llamados a ser audaces en nuestra fe, sin importar a dónde nos lleve.

El temor que sintieron los primeros discípulos se manifiesta ya en la primera frase del Evangelio: “estando cerradas las puertas” (Juan 20, 19). Después de todo, Jesús acababa de ser arrestado, condenado y sentenciado a muerte por un pacto hecho entre las autoridades religiosas y las civiles. Qué consolador resulta que las dos primeras palabras que salen de la boca de Jesús resucitado a sus discípulos sean “la paz”. Tanto en ese primer día como otra vez una semana más tarde Jesús los saluda diciéndoles “la paz esté con ustedes” (Juan 20, 19, 26). Así le ofrece a esos discípulos temerosos y perdidos, ni más ni menos que lo que necesitaban.

De manera similar en la visión de Juan, que el libro del Apocalipsis ha dejado por escrito, Jesús le dice: “No temas” (Apocalipsis 1, 17). Es normal para la naturaleza humana reaccionar a la ansiedad y a la aflicción con temor. Jesús nos trae la paz y nos consuela. Ésta es una de las maneras en que nos llega la misericordia de Dios en el preciso momento que más la necesitamos.

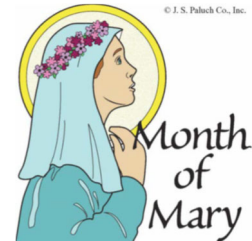
