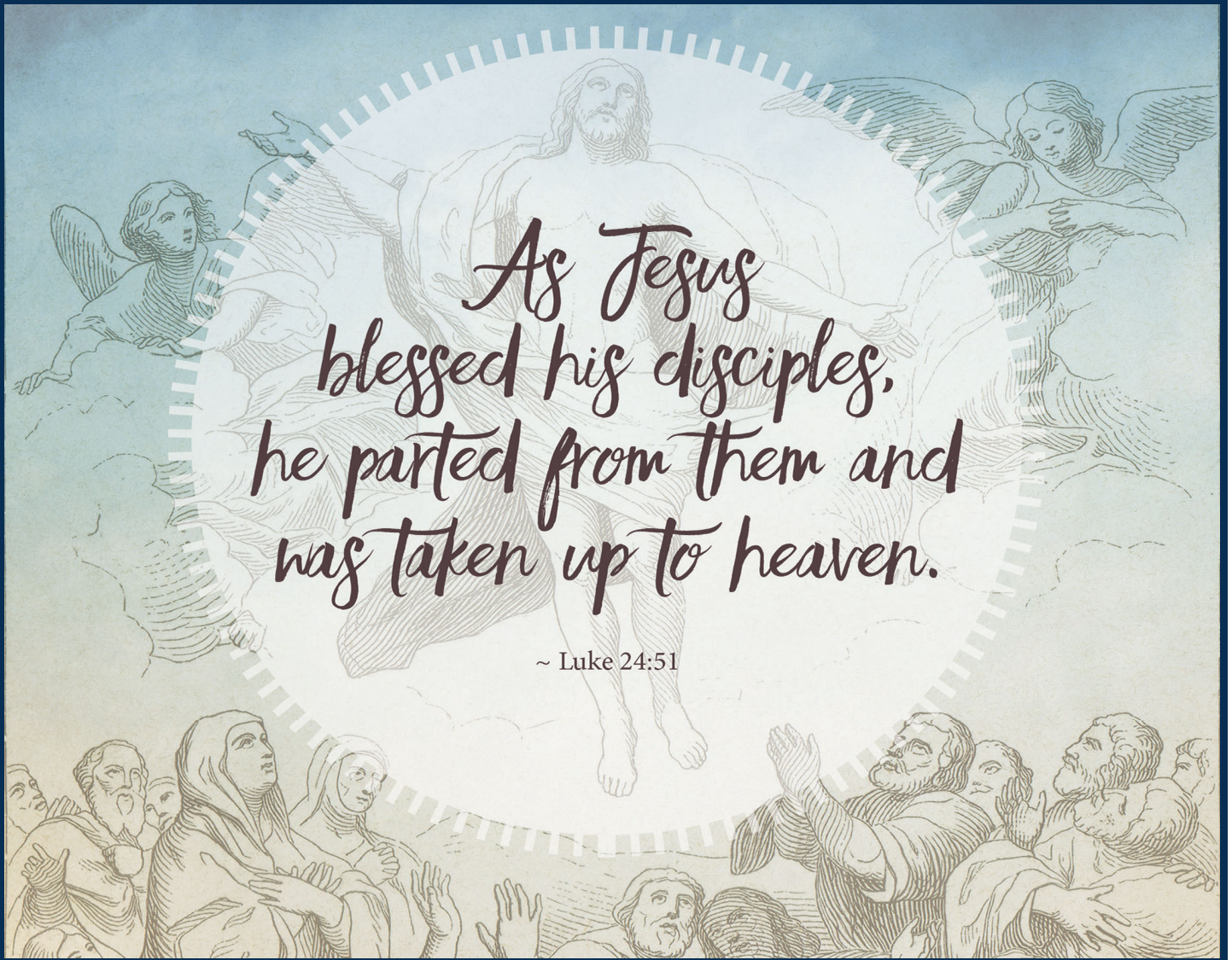

Fr. Gerard's Corner

How many mornings do you suppose the apostles looked up to the heavens and wondered if this would be the day Jesus returns? Initially, they would have expected him to come soon, probably while most of them were still alive. Eventually, they would have concluded that it might not be until their children, or maybe their children's children, had lived their lives. How surprised would they have been if they had known that a hundred generations later Jesus Christ still had not returned? Indeed, it is our turn now to witness to the Risen Lord to the ends of the earth.

The authors of each option for the second reading use beautiful images that are tied to the heart, that human organ associated with feelings of love and affection. Saint Paul (or, more likely, someone else writing in his name) blesses the Ephesians, saying, "May the eyes of your hearts be enlightened," uniting the certainty of visibility with the authenticity of feeling (Ephesians 1:18). The author of Hebrews calls us to approach heaven with a "sincere heart . . . sprinkled clean" from sin (Hebrews 10:22). May we feel sure and sincere in our love for Christ.

Saint Luke wrote both his Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles. Today we get to hear the last words of the former and the first words of the latter. Both describe Jesus' ascension to heaven, but both also narrate Jesus' command to his disciples to be his witnesses. With the help of the Holy Spirit, they are to preach in his name to the ends of the earth. Since we have received the Holy Spirit, we are now the ones called as witnesses. Though we have not labored alongside Jesus as his original disciples did, we have encountered Jesus Christ, and continue to do so in the presence of those around us.

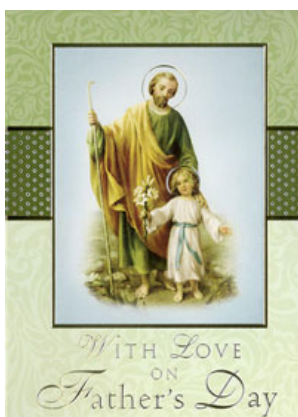

El rincón del P. Gerardo

Cuando san Esteban, el protomártir cristiano, fue asesinado nos dio un nuevo modelo de orar. La oración de él fue la primera dirigida a Jesús. Esteban ora a Jesús así como Jesús oró al Padre. De hecho, las últimas palabras de Esteban son un paralelismo de las últimas palabras de Cristo en la cruz. Significativamente cuando Esteban ora: “Señor, no les tomes en cuenta este pecado” (Hechos 7, 60), Saulo estaba incluido en esa oración, pues él aprobó y presencié esa ejecución, aunque más tarde, ya siendo Pablo, llegaría a ser el misionero más importante de la fe cristiana. Lucas insinúa que la oración desinteresada de Esteban fue atendida y concedida de una manera incomparable.

Y hablando de san Pablo... No pasó mucho tiempo después del martirio de Esteban que escuchó la voz de Jesús cuando se dirigía a Damasco. Pero en la lectura que escuchamos hoy los aliados de Saulo “se taparon los oídos” (Hechos 7, 57), rehusando escuchar el testimonio de Esteban sobre Jesús. Los miembros del sanedrín no lograron oír la voz de Jesús, porque rehusaron escucharlo.

Hace tres días, en el jueves de la Ascensión, celebramos el regreso de Jesús al Padre. La misión de Jesús aquí en la tierra se había cumplido. Pero esa misión está a la vez incompleta. “Que todos sean uno” (Juan 17, 21), ora Jesús, imaginando un mundo unido, que ha logrado la unidad modelada por el Padre y el Hijo. Es una tarea abrumadora, pero la ruta se nos ha trazado y tenemos la garantía de Jesús de que “el amor con que me amas esté en ellos y yo también en ellos” (Juan 17, 26). Con el amor de Dios en nosotros, dirigido exteriormente hacia nuestro prójimo, Jesús se manifiesta en nosotros, en todos nosotros.

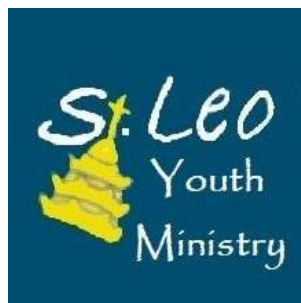
