Fr. Gerard's Corner

In the Gospel, we see a number of Jesus' disciples returning to their old profession: fishing. It is noteworthy that they go out at night, and that they catch nothing. Earlier in John's Gospel, Jesus told the disciples, "Night is coming, when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world" (John 9:4-5). That morning, at dawn, they did not realize that it was "the light of the world" standing on the shore. They only recognized him once they realized that he had led them to a catch of more fish than they could handle.

The religious authorities in the first reading wanted to keep the people of Jerusalem in the dark about Jesus. Peter identifies with them as believers in God ("the God of our ancestors"), but then he stands up to them, accusing them of murder ("you had him killed" [Acts 5:30]). The authorities ordered them to stop preaching in Jesus' name, but they did not prosecute them. So in the end the apostles—and many others—chose to obey God and continue teaching and preaching in the name of the Risen Lord.

Earlier in John's Gospel, Jesus portrays himself as the Good Shepherd, willing to lay down his life for his sheep. Here in the final chapter of his Gospel, Jesus tells Peter that he will now be the one to shepherd his flock. Peter will need to tend and feed his sheep. Also like Jesus, Peter will end up sacrificing his life for his sheep.

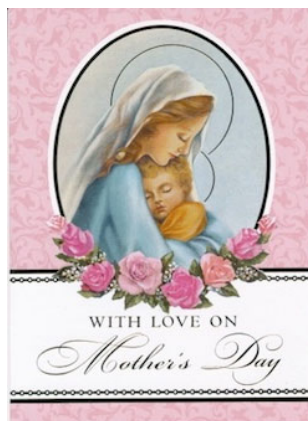

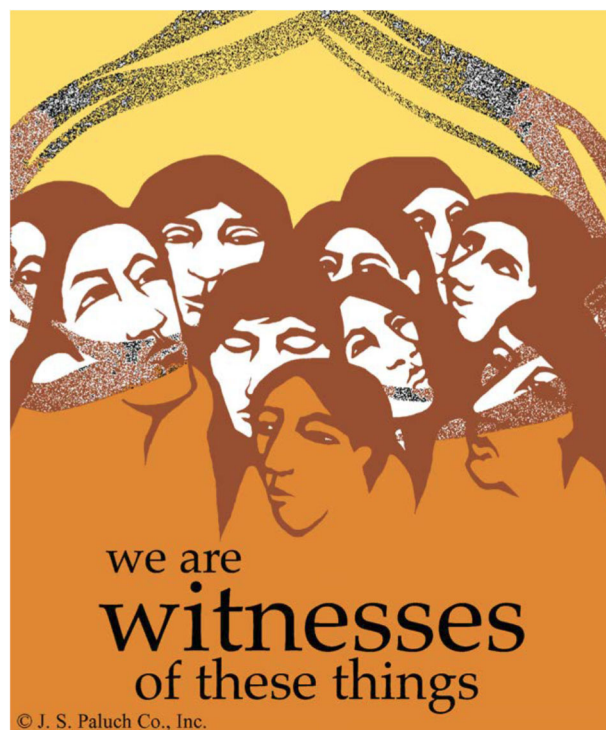
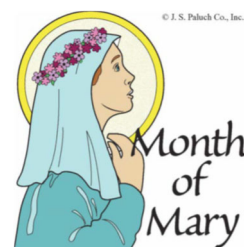

El rincón del P. Gerardo

El Evangelio nos dice que un número de los discípulos de Jesús volvieron a su antigua profesión de la pesca. Vale destacar que salen de noche y que no pescan nada. Anteriormente en el Evangelio de Juan, Jesús le dice a los discípulos: “Llega la noche y ya nadie puede trabajar. Mientras esté en el mundo, yo soy la luz del mundo” (Juan 9, 4-5). En la alborada de esa mañana ellos no se dieron cuenta de que “la luz del mundo” estaba esperando junto a la orilla. Sólo llegaron a reconocerlo cuando vieron que fue por él que pescaron una cantidad de peces más grande de la que podían recoger.

Las autoridades religiosas de que nos habla la primera lectura querían mantener a la gente de Jerusalén en la oscuridad en cuanto a Jesús. Pedro se identifica con ellos como creyentes en Dios (“el Dios de nuestros padres”), pero después les hace frente acusándolos de la muerte de Jesús (“ustedes [le] dieron muerte”) [Hechos 5, 30]. Las autoridades les prohibieron seguir predicando en nombre de Jesús, pero no los llevaron a juicio. Por tanto, a la larga, los apóstoles y muchas otras personas decidieron obedecer a Dios y continuar predicando en el nombre del Señor resucitados.

Anteriormente en el Evangelio de Juan, Jesús se describe a sí mismo como el Buen Pastor, dispuesto a dar su vida por sus ovejas. Aquí, en el último capítulo de este Evangelio, Jesús le dice a Pedro que ahora será él, Pedro, quien apacentará el rebaño de Jesús. Pedro tendrá que atender y alimentar a sus ovejas. Y también, como Jesús, Pedro tendrá que sacrificar su vida por sus ovejas.
