## Fr. Gerard's Corner

Moses knew better than anyone where God's commandments came from. He alone went up the mountain. He alone received the two stone tablets. But in today's readings, he reminds the people that these laws are no longer remote or mysterious. By this time, these laws should be on their lips and in their hearts, part of their very being. They are for us as well. Once we have internalized something, it is easier to act accordingly. This is Moses's lesson. "It is something very near to you . . . you have only to carry it out" (Deuteronomy 30:14).

As important as what the good Samaritan did is what he did not do. He did not look at the victim and see someone of another tribe or race. He did not wonder if the victim might have been somewhat to blame. He did not look around for someone else. He did not leave it to the authorities whenever they might happen by. He did not let a sense of inadequacy stop him. He did not recoil from touching the stranger. Instead, he acted immediately and thoroughly as a true neighbor to the man. So too must we.

There is a third person in the story of the good Samaritan who does not help the man who was attacked, and we probably don't even realize it. It's the victim himself. Of course he didn't help, you're thinking; he's half-dead and unable to move or even cry out. But isn't that us, in our sinfulness? We've fallen. We're wounded. We cannot bring ourselves back to life. We cannot redeem ourselves. We need Jesus, the Good Samaritan. Only he has the power to heal us of our brokenness and sin, to give life after death, to redeem us.

## TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

On a summer day, with the windows open, we may hear the sound of church bells. Bells seem to have come into church life in Irish monasteries around the seventh century, and spread around the Christian world by Irish monks on missionary journeys. By the eighth century, bells were standard equipment in even small parish churches. An ancient ceremony, once called the “baptism of the bells,” recognizes that the church bell has a voice to call people to awareness and summon them to worship, and even bestows a name on the bell.

In a world without clocks or watches, the bell had an indispensable role. For calling monks in from the fields for prayer, or alerting far-flung visitors, the bell’s voice was enhanced by hoisting it high into a tower. Soon it was learned that the sound of several bells clanging together in harmony imparted a sense of joy to great celebrations, and bell towers prospered, some chock full of bells. Different combinations of rings could indicate a death, a Mass, a wedding, a fast day, the curfew at the end of day, and the Angelus. Before electricity, bell-ringing was hard work indeed: the biggest bell in the Catholic world, in Cologne, Germany, weighs twenty-seven tons! There’s no substitute for the resonant roar of a mighty bell; electric chimes are not eligible for blessing!

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## El rincón del P. Gerardo

Moisés sabía mejor que nadie de dónde habían venido los mandamientos de Dios. Él había subido la montaña solo y solo había recibido las dos tablas de piedra. Pero en las lecturas de hoy él le recuerda a la gente que estos mandamientos ya no están remotos ni son misteriosos. En ese momento ya estos mandamientos deben estar en la boca y en el corazón de ellos, o sea que deben ser parte de su propio ser. También son esos mandamientos para nosotros. Es más fácil actuar conforme a algo que ya hemos asimilado. Ésta es la lección de Moisés sobre los mandamientos: “Están muy a tu alcance . . . para que puedas cumplirlos” (Deuteronomio 30, 14).

Tan importante como lo que hizo el buen samaritano fue lo que no hizo. No se fijó si la víctima era de otra tribu o raza. No consideró si la víctima tendría parte de la culpa. No miró a su alrededor a ver si aparecía alguien más que pudiera hacer esa tarea. No esperó a que fueran las autoridades las que se hicieran cargo cuando pasaran por allí. No se detuvo ante su sentido de ineptitud o inutilidad. No retrocedió ante la posible repugnancia de tocar al extraño. Sino que actuó inmediata y cuidadosamente como un verdadero prójimo del hombre. Del mismo modo debemos actuar nosotros.

Hay una tercera persona en la historia del buen samaritano que no ayudó al hombre atacado y probablemente ni nos demos cuenta. Se trata de la propia víctima. Tal vez estés pensando que por supuesto no se pudo ayudar; estaba medio muerto e incapaz de moverse ni de gritar. Pero, ¿acaso no somos así nosotros como víctimas de nuestro propio pecado? Hemos caído. Estamos heridos. No podemos reavivarnos ni redimirnos nosotros mismos. Necesitamos a Jesús, el Buen Samaritano. Sólo él tiene el poder de sanar nuestros quebrantos y salvarnos de nuestro pecado, para darnos la vida después de la muerte, para redimirnos.

"EL GOZO ESPIRITUAL ES LA MEJOR SEÑAL

Nació en Bañoreal, Italia en 1221. Fue religioso franciscano, llegó a ser uno de los más grandes sabios de su tiempo. Este santo en sus sermones, escritos y actitudes demostró vivir lleno de un amor inmenso hacia Nuestro Señor. Los que lo conocieron y trataron dicen que todos sus estudios y trabajos los ofrecía para gloria de Dios y salvación de las almas. Recorrió el mundo visitando las casas de su comunidad y animando a todos a dedicarse a la santidad, tenía una exquisita bondad en su trato, una amabilidad que le ganaba los corazones, sus virtudes preferidas eran la humildad y la paciencia. La meditación frecuente en la pasión y muerte de Cristo, lo llevaba a esforzarse por cumplir aquel consejo de Jesús: "Aprended de mí que soy manso y humilde de corazón". Su crucifijo lo tenía totalmente desgastado de tanto besarle las manos, los pies, la cabeza y la herida del costado. Su amor a la Virgen María era intenso y por todas partes recomendaba el rezo del Angelus (o de las tres Aves Marías). San Buenaventura: pide a Nuestro Señor que nosotros lo amemos como lo amaste tú.
