Fr. Gerard's Corner

King Zedekiah appears today as weak and as ineffectual as Pontius Pilate was centuries later. Eager to wash his hands of the decision of what to do with the troublesome prophet, he allows his princes to take charge: "He is in your power" (Jeremiah 38:5). They throw him in a cistern and leave him to die. Zedekiah, given the opportunity to take a stand and defend the words of the prophet, steps aside to let him die.

But then the king reconsiders. It is the influence of one person, a foreigner, one of his servants, who pushes him to do the right thing. Ebed-melech, an Ethiopian eunuch, is Jeremiah's savior. To stand up to his master, the king of Judah, must have taken great courage. He put his life on the line. But he acted. He spoke up. Sometimes all it takes is one morally upright person who has the guts to stand up to power and move an uncertain leader to act justly and mercifully.

Perhaps this is what Jesus is trying to tell his disciples when he says he has come to bring division. The world is no longer a pristine Eden. The world is full of evil—immoral people who actively exercise it and indifferent people who passively allow it. The kingdom of God cannot have either of these. Doing good demands standing up to those who do evil and to those who allow evil to be done. It may mean opposing a leader or a superior. It may mean opposing a friend or family member. A divided household is better than a corrupt one.

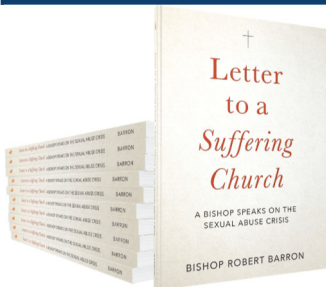

El rey Sedecías aparece hoy tan débil e inefectivo como Poncio Pilato unos siglos más tarde. Ansioso de lavarse las manos de la decisión que tenía que hacer con el fastidioso profeta, le permite a sus príncipes tomar las riendas en el asunto: “Lo tienen ya en sus manos” (Jeremías 38, 5). Arrojan a Jeremías en un pozo para que allí muera. Sedecías, que tuvo la oportunidad de pronunciarse en contra y defender las palabras del profeta, se hace a un lado y lo abandona para que muera.

Pero después el rey recapacita. La influencia de una persona, un extranjero que es uno de sus sirvientes, lo impulsa a hacer lo correcto. Ebed-Mélek, un etíope y oficial del palacio, es quien salva a Jeremías. Y tuvo que necesitar gran valor para hacerle frente a su amo, el rey de Judá. Puso su vida en riesgo, pero actuó y habló. Algunas veces todo lo que se necesita es una persona con valores morales y que tenga las agallas para enfrentarse con el poder, e inspirar a un líder indeciso para que actúe justa y misericordiosamente.

Tal vez sea eso lo que Jesús trata de comunicarle a sus discípulos cuando dice que ha venido a traer la división. El mundo ya no es un Edén límpido. El mundo está lleno del mal—de personas inmorales que practican el mal y de personas indiferentes que pasivamente lo permiten. En el Reino de Dios no puede haber nada de eso. Hacer el bien nos exige enfrentarnos con aquellos que hacen el mal y con los que lo permiten. Aunque signifique oponernos a un líder o a un superior. Aunque signifique oponernos a un amigo o a un miembro de la familia. Un hogar dividido es mejor que un hogar corrupto.

Sus padres no tenían hijos e hicieron una peregrinación a un santuario de Nuestra Señora y Dios les concedió este hijo, y después de él otros cinco. Este santo propagó dos nuevas devociones que llegaron a ser sumamente populares: La devoción al Corazón de Jesús y la devoción al Corazón de María. se propuso fundar seminarios en los cuales los futuros sacerdotes fueran esmeradamente preparados para su sagrado ministerio. Tenía una impresionante capacidad para predicar Las gentes decían de él: "En la predicación es un león, y en la confesión un cordero". Fundó la Congregación de Jesús y María, o padres Eudistas, comunidad religiosa que ha hecho inmenso bien en el mundo y se dedica a dirigir seminarios y a la predicación. Murió el 19 de agosto de 1680. Su gran deseo era que de su vida y de su comportamiento se pudiera repetir lo que decía Jesús: "Mi Padre celestial me ama, porque yo hago siempre lo que a Él le agrada". San Juan Eudes, ruega por nosotros.
