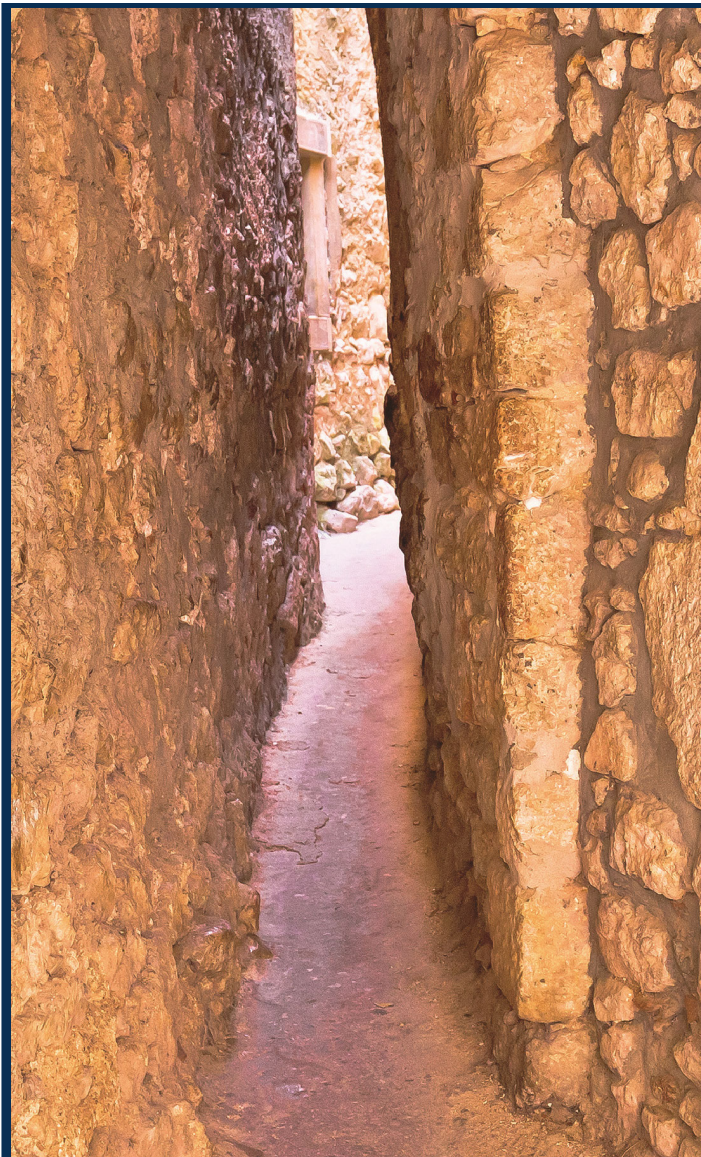

Fr. Gerard's Corner

Imagine if all the living former presidents of the United States were honored at the White House with a state dinner, and the guests chosen to dine with them were not the rich and powerful but refugees, homeless people, prisoners, and others who are neglected. No less surprising a picture is Jesus painting today in the Gospel. Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob are dining with people from the ends of the earth, Gentiles, while the residents of the towns and villages around Jerusalem are on the outside looking in. The outrage! Outsiders hobnobbing with leaders while VIPs are excluded and called names! No wonder there is wailing and gnashing of teeth.

A month or so ago we heard the parable of the good Samaritan, which Jesus used to answer the question, "Who is my neighbor?" (Luke 10:29). But the conversation had started with the question, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" (10:25). Now we have a vision of that inheritance. Those who are rejected say, "We ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets" (13:26). In other words, "We're your neighbors!" They have totally misunderstood what it means to be a neighbor.

Jesus says that those who fail to enter are not strong enough. The passage from Hebrews suggests a way to gain strength: discipline. It may be the best way to learn. After all, *disciplina* means teaching or instruction. It is also the root of the word "disciple," which we all strive to be. A true disciple has learned that a true neighbor treats everyone with love, kindness, and mercy, especially those who seem least likely to be invited to a dinner party.

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WELCOME THE STRANGER

We have become accustomed to seeing pictures in the media and stories on the news about immigrants from Latin America and refugees from Syria fleeing violence and destruction in their own countries, trying to make their way to a safe place. We have also seen the reactions of people who want to keep them away from their countries, who fail to welcome the stranger and the helpless children. Have we forgotten Jesus' call to comfort the homeless and the stranger? "They shall bring all your brothers and sisters from all the nations ... to Jerusalem, my holy mountain, says the LORD."

In the three readings for this day, we are told that we are to welcome these strangers, to welcome the discipline of the Lord, which leads to peace, and to "strive to enter through the narrow gate" into the glory of God's own homeland, the reign of God.

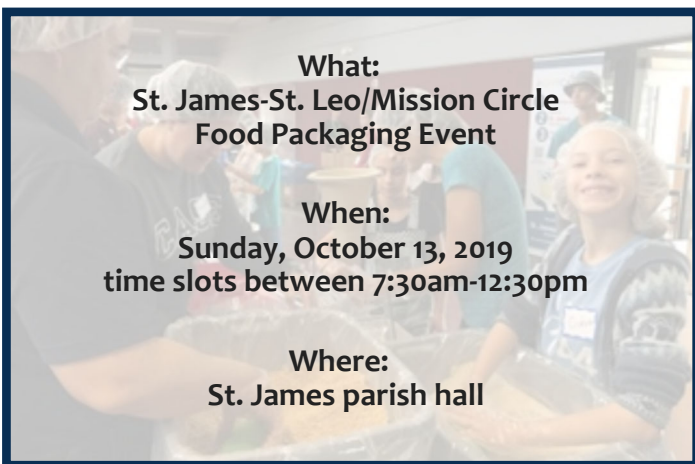

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

The wonderful diversity of life and worship among Roman Catholics of East and West is an example of God writing straight with crooked lines. The steady hand of the villainous Emperor Diocletian drew a line across Europe and Africa that split the empire in two, and for the most part determined how Christians would worship two thousand years later.

Italy's heel and the far northern city of Trieste fell on the Eastern side, and have had a form of Eastern liturgy ever since. Constantinople, which soon became the seat of the Roman Empire, became a base for Christianizing the East up to Russia and Poland. Poland was on the Eastern side, but a series of wars and medieval mayhem pushed the religious boundary back to the Ukraine, and Poland remains an outpost of the Latin Church to this day.

An old rule of thumb declared that whatever religion was observed by the local prince, the people had to follow. This gave rise to persecution and migration as people sought toleration for their expressions of faith. In the United States, we are accustomed to peaceful collaboration among Christians of East and West, a situation that challenges churches that still feel the pinch of age-old division.

El rincón del P. Gerardo

Imaginémonos si todos los antiguos presidentes de los Estados Unidos fuesen honrados con un banquete en la Casa Blanca y los comensales escogidos no fueron ni los ricos ni los poderosos, sino los refugiados, los que viven en la calle, los prisioneros y otras personas desamparadas. No es menos sorprendente lo que Jesús describe hoy en el Evangelio. Abraham, Isaac y Jacob comen en compañía de paganos de todos los rincones de la tierra mientras que los residentes de las ciudades y los pueblos alrededor de Jerusalén sólo miran desde afuera. ¡Qué atrocidad! ¡Los marginados codeándose con los líderes mientras que los personajes importantes quedan excluidos y echados afuera! No en balde habrá llanto y desesperación.

Hace más o menos un mes que oímos la parábola del buen samaritano, que Jesús utilizó para contestar la pregunta: “¿Quién es mi prójimo?” (Lucas 10, 29). Pero la conversación había comenzado con la pregunta: “¿Qué debo hacer para obtener la vida eterna?” (10, 25). Ahora tenemos una visión de la vida eterna. Los rechazados dicen: “Hemos comido y bebido contigo y tú has enseñado en nuestras plazas” (13, 26). En otras palabras, “¡somos tu prójimo!” Ellos han malentendido totalmente lo que significa ser un prójimo.

Jesús dice que los que no logran entrar no son lo suficientemente fuertes. El pasaje de la carta a los hebreos sugiere una manera de lograr fortaleza: la corrección. Es posible que sea la mejor manera de aprender. Después de todo, dejarse corregir es una disciplina, lo cual significa enseñanza o instrucción. También es la raíz de la palabra “discípulo”, que todos nos esforzamos por ser. Un verdadero discípulo ha aprendido que el verdadero prójimo es aquel que trata a todos con amor, gentileza y misericordia, en particular a aquellos que probablemente nunca serán invitados a un banquete.

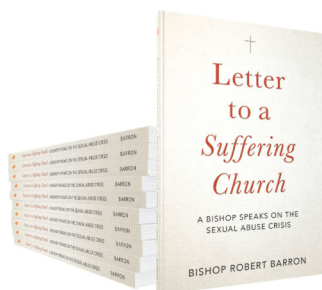
