Fr. Gerard's Corner

Once again, Jesus refuses take the side of a sibling who's upset. Two weeks ago, it was Martha, asking Jesus to tell her sister to help her. Now this person in the crowd asks Jesus to tell his brother to share the inheritance. He figures Jesus will come down on his side. It's only fair to share, right? But Jesus shifts the focus. Don't focus on possessions, which can inspire greed; focus on what matters to God.

Today's parable of the rich man and the bountiful harvest is similar to Jesus' comparison of the wealthy person and heaven to a camel and the eye of a needle. Both may teach the same lesson, but today's parable implies a second. Note that Jesus' warning in the last line regards "all who store up treasure *for themselves*" (Luke 12:21). Imagine how the ending would differ if the rich man, upon seeing he had more grain than storage space, decided to give the bounty to the poor and hungry. It is his selfishness that is completely opposed to what matters to God.

We naturally tend to accumulate possessions. We come into this world with nothing, but as young children we become very possessive of what is "mine." The appropriateness of sharing can be a difficult lesson. As we accumulate possessions, many people—children and adults—find it even more difficult to share. We feel we deserve what we have. Saint Paul would say that all these things are "what is on earth," as opposed to "what is above" (Colossians 3:2). We are called to become a "new self," putting to death the "old self," which accumulates earthly possessions (Colossians 3:9-10).

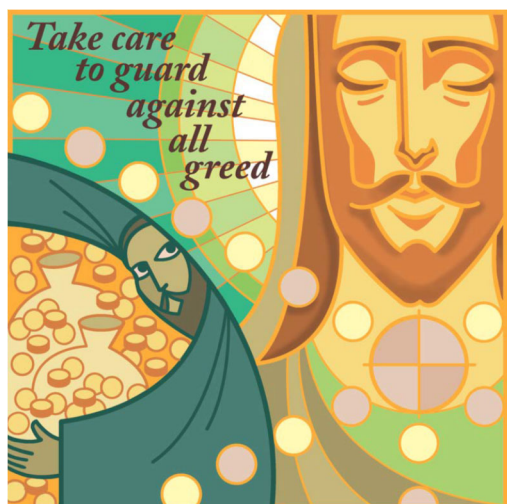

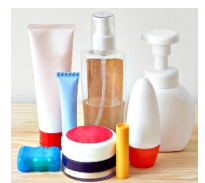

El rincón del P. Gerardo

Una vez más Jesús se niega a tomar partido con un hermano que está descontento. Hace dos semanas era Marta la que le pedía a Jesús que le pidiera a su hermana que la ayudara. Ahora una persona de la multitud le pide a Jesús que le diga a su hermano que comparta la herencia, pues cree que Jesús se pondrá de su parte. Después de todo, es justo compartir, ¿cierto? Pero Jesús pone su atención en otra cosa. No pongan su atención en sus bienes materiales, sino en lo que es importante para Dios.

La parábola de hoy sobre el hombre rico y su cosecha abundante es similar a la comparación que hizo Jesús sobre la persona rica y el cielo con el camello y el ojo de una aguja. Ambas parábolas pueden enseñar la misma lección, pero la parábola de hoy implica una segunda cosa. Fijémonos que la advertencia de Jesús en el último renglón se refiere a todo aquel que “amontona riquezas para sí mismo” (Lucas 12, 21). Imaginemos cuán diferente terminaría el relato si el rico, al ver que tenía más grano del que podía almacenar, hubiese decidido dar esa abundancia a los pobres y hambrientos. Su egoísmo es completamente opuesto a lo que es importante para Dios.

Es natural para nosotros acumular bienes. Venimos a este mundo sin nada, pero ya desde niños nos hacemos muy posesivos en cuanto a lo que es “mío”. La justicia de compartir puede ser una lección difícil. La acumulación de bienes hace que muchas personas, ya sean niños o adultos, encuentren difícil el compartir. Nos creemos que merecemos todo lo que poseemos. San Pablo diría que todas esas cosas son los bienes “de la tierra” en vez de “los bienes del cielo” (Colosenses 3, 2). Estamos llamados a revestirnos del “nuevo yo” después de habernos despojado del “viejo yo”, que acumula los bienes de la tierra (Colosenses 3, 9-10).

SB 24 would mandate public universities in California to dispense abortion by medication techniques at on-campus student health centers. This bill is now fated to become law.
