Fr. Gerard's Corner

True humility increases our humanity. Turning our backs on the places of honor at a banquet to take a lesser seat means we are giving consideration to others. We acknowledge that other people have the same rights, have similar hopes and aspirations, and may be just as deserving or even more so of an exalted position. We develop empathy for others. Truly, we are "loved more than a giver of gifts" (Sirach 3:17), for we have given the gift of affirmation to our neighbor.

True humility makes us more hospitable. Taking the spotlight off ourselves directs that light on the value of others. Our empathy leads us to invite "the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind" (Luke 14:13), the neglected, the vulnerable, the marginalized, the outcasts. We want to tell them, "You are valued. You are important. You are treasured." Aware of it or not, we are doing God's work when we do so. After all, as we sang in the psalm, "God, in your goodness, you have made a home for the poor" (cf. Psalm 68:11). We realize our home is enhanced by the presence of those commonly rejected.

Humility cuts against the grain of what society tells us every day. It means admitting that we are not capable of doing it all ourselves, honestly acknowledging that we are not the best, realizing that we do not deserve all the riches that have come to us. How fortunate we are to have a host who exalts us despite our unworthiness.

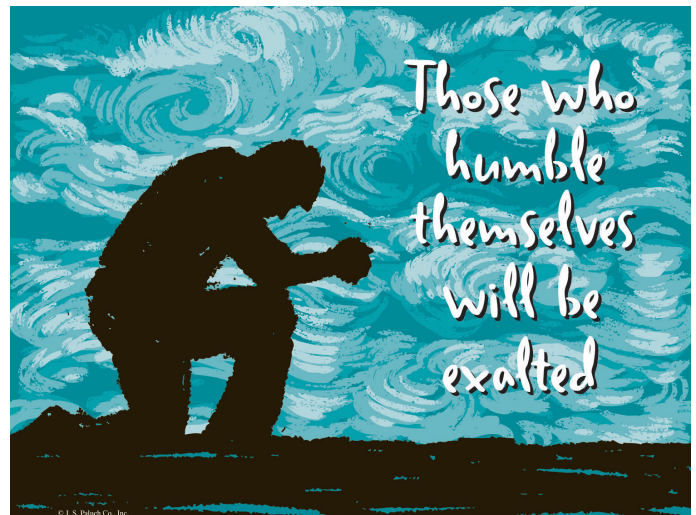

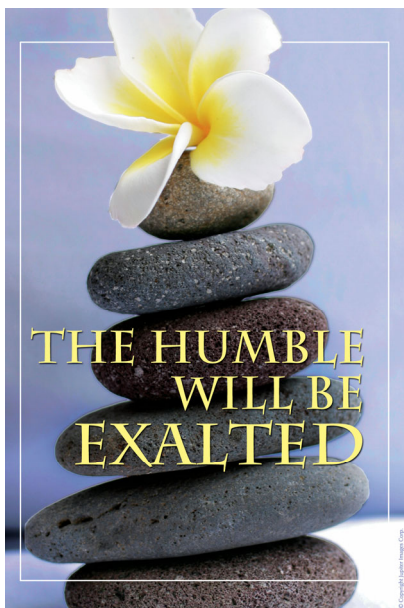

La verdadera humildad acrecienta nuestra humanidad. Dejar los puestos de honor en un banquete para tomar un asiento menos importante significa que tenemos en consideración a los demás. Reconocemos que otras personas tienen los mismos derechos, tienen esperanzas y aspiraciones similares, y pueden ser tan o más merecedoras de un puesto elevado. Así nos volvemos más comprensivos para con los demás. Verdaderamente, si tenemos humildad nos "amarán más que al dadivoso" (Sirácide 3, 17), pues le hemos dado asentimiento a nuestro prójimo.

La verdadera humildad nos hace más hospitalarios. Si desviamos de nosotros los reflectores, esa luz alumbrará mejor los valores de los demás. Nuestra comprensión nos lleva a invitar "a los pobres, a los lisiados, a los cojos y a los ciegos" (Lucas 14, 13), a los abandonados, a los vulnerables y marginados. A ellos queremos decirles: "Ustedes son valiosos. Ustedes son importantes. Ustedes son un tesoro". Al hacer eso hacemos la obra de Dios, aunque no estemos conscientes de ello. Después de todo, y tal como le cantamos al Señor en el salmo: "habitó tu rebaño en esta tierra, que tu amor preparó para los pobres" (cfr. Salmo 67, 11). Sabemos que nuestra tierra se realza con la presencia de los que comúnmente son rechazados.

La humildad va contracorriente de lo que la sociedad nos dice diariamente. Esto significa admitir que no somos capaces de hacerlo todo por nosotros mismos, reconocer que no somos los mejores y darnos cuenta de que no somos merecedores de las riquezas que hemos recibido. Qué afortunados somos de tener un anfitrión que nos enaltece a pesar de nuestra falta de merecimiento.

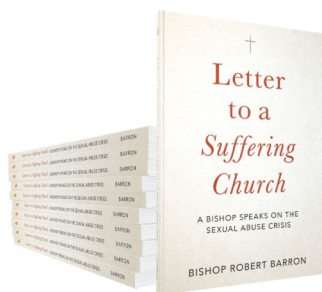
