Fr. Gerard's Corner

We tend to think of prayer as an individual, personal phenomenon. But the first reading suggests that prayer can be communal. Moses did not go alone to the top of the hill to raise his arms in supplication to God. He was accompanied by two friends, Aaron and Hur, who eventually supported his arms when Moses tired. All three together lifted their arms to God. In the Gospel Jesus tells his disciples, "Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night?" (Luke 18:7). In the light of the parable of the dishonest judge, this suggests that if several people persist in asking for the same thing, God will see that justice is done.

"Keep in touch!" we call out when saying goodbye to a friend we only see occasionally. Jesus, knowing that the day would come when he would be separated from his disciples, could not do the same. Throughout his life, Jesus continually prayed to his Father. This was the way that he was able to keep in touch. Moreover, he was providing a model to his disciples. Through constant and persistent prayer, his disciples could continue to keep in touch.

"Be persistent," Paul charges Timothy in proclaiming God's word, "whether it is convenient or inconvenient" (2 Timothy 4:2). It is not always an easy task, even when it is convenient, but when it is inconvenient it becomes quite a challenge. Yet it is our mission, as disciples, to proclaim God's word, especially when it is inconvenient. Today, on World Mission Sunday, let us commit ourselves to persist in proclaiming God's word even when it is difficult.



Sexual Abuse Compensation Program

The Independent Victim Compensation Program (ICP), a program sponsored by the Diocese of San Diego to assist victim-survivors who were abused as minors by priests of this diocese, is accepting applications. The ICP is independent and not controlled by the Church. There is no time limit on when the abuse may have taken place. The program will consider all claims, regardless of how long ago the abuse occurred. No attorney is necessary and there are no fees of any kind. U.S. Residency is also not required. 

PERSISTENCE

Today's readings are about persistence, passionate persistence. Exodus tells of a battle won despite weariness because Moses, with help from Aaron and Hur, held his hands raised. Timothy asks that same persistence of his community and us. Luke tells of a court case won by a widow, despite the dishonesty of the judge, because she will not leave him alone. The psalm reminds us that God is everywhere, guarding us from harm day and night, coming and going, now and forever. The readings are about persistence, the relentless, unwavering pursuit of what must not be lost. The readings are about God's passionate persistence in pursuing us, seeking to win our hearts.

El rincón del P. Gerardo

Nosotros tendemos a considerar la oración como un fenómeno individual y personal, pero la primera lectura sugiere que la oración puede ser comunitaria. Moisés no fue solo a la cumbre del monte para levantar sus manos a Dios en suplicación. Dos amigos lo acompañaron, Aarón y Jur, que sostuvieron los brazos de Moisés cuando éste se cansaba. Los tres juntos levantaron sus brazos a Dios. En el Evangelio Jesús les pregunta a sus discípulos: “¿creen acaso que Dios no hará justicia a sus elegidos, que claman a él día y noche, y que los hará esperar?” (Lucas 18, 7). A la luz de esta parábola del juez deshonesto la sugerencia es que, si varias personas persisten en pedir lo mismo, Dios hará justicia.

“¡Mantengámonos en contacto!” decimos muchas veces al despedirnos de un amigo que vemos sólo ocasionalmente. Jesús, que sabía que el día vendría en que se separaría de sus discípulos, no pudo decir lo mismo. A lo largo de toda su vida Jesús oraba a su Padre constantemente. Ésa era la manera de seguir en contacto. Es más, también le dejaba así un modelo a sus discípulos. Mediante la oración constante y persistente sus discípulos pueden seguir en contacto.

“Insiste a tiempo y a destiempo” en proclamar la palabra, le dice Pablo a Timoteo (2 Timoteo 4, 2). Esta tarea no es siempre fácil, aun cuando es a tiempo, pero cuando es a destiempo resulta un verdadero desafío. Sin embargo, es nuestra misión de discípulos proclamar la palabra de Dios, sobre todo cuando es a destiempo. Hoy, en el Domingo Mundial de las Misiones, comprométamonos a persistir en proclamar la palabra de Dios aun cuando sea difícil.



We are called through our baptism to be part of the Church's missionary efforts, through prayer, self-sacrifice and support of missionary vocations through material aid. Remembering that we are baptized and sent as a Universal Church of Christ on mission in the world, we can...
