Fr. Gerard's Corner

Isaiah's vision captures the dual movement that he preached to the people of Israel and Judah. First, people of every nation, not just the Chosen People, were expected to stream toward God's holy mountain, the place on earth closest to God. At the same time, the word of the LORD would flow down that mountain to bring peace and justice to all nations. God will issue judgments, making human weapons and aggression unnecessary. God will come to us, but we must come to God.

The end result Isaiah wants is for all to "walk in the light of the LORD!" (Isaiah 2:5). Isaiah foresees a time when people from all nations will be enlightened by realizing God's will for humanity. Since we are all created by God and in God's image, in God's eyes we are all brothers and sisters. To God, people fighting with one another can be compared to a parent when their children fight. To raise a weapon or to kill another person is analogous to fratricide.

Not that there was ever a time that the "works of darkness" were appropriate, but what we hear in the second reading and the Gospel should scare us into the urgency of changing bad behavior. "The night is advanced, the day is at hand," Paul writes (Romans 13:12). Jesus warns his disciples that the Son of Man will come "at an hour you do not expect" (Matthew 24:44). If we are honestly preparing our hearts to receive Jesus, we must stop doing things that injure or demean others and "put on the armor of light" (13:12). If we wouldn't want it "brought to light," that's a sign we shouldn't do it.

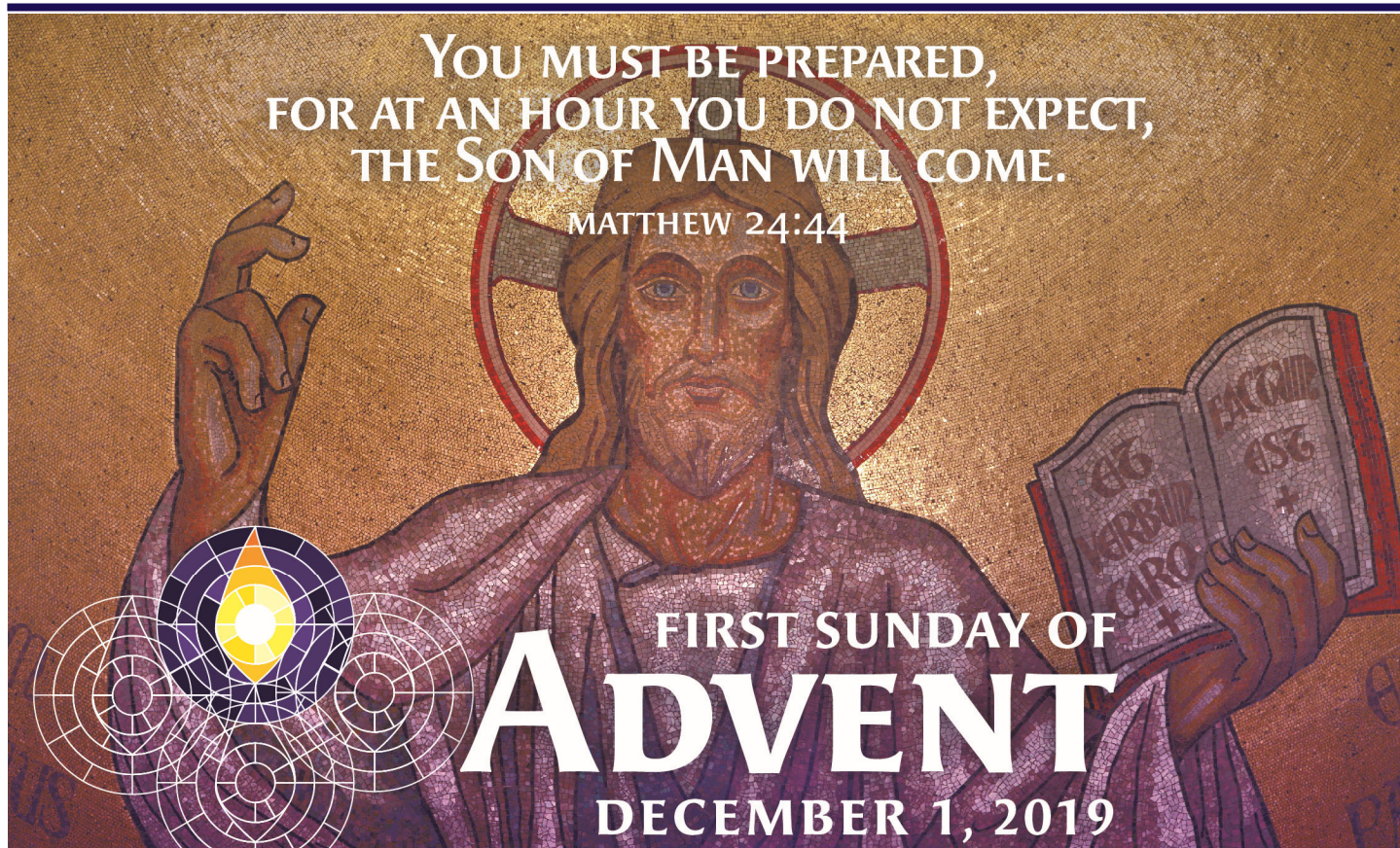

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HOPEFUL EXPECTATION

Our liturgical year begins with the season of Advent—a time of hopeful expectation of the coming of the Lord. On the First Sunday of Advent we look forward to the end of time when we will awaken to the dawn of Christ's new day.

Today we hear Isaiah speak of a day when God's power will have brought universal peace and God's Word will have instructed all people, radiating God's "light" (teachings) into all of human society. Only when humanity walks "in the light of the LORD" (Isaiah 2:5), when all people desire to be instructed "in [God's] ways" (Isaiah 2:3), will the world be set aright and our deepest longings fulfilled. The reading from Romans calls us to "awake from sleep" for this final "day is at hand" (Romans 13:11, 12). Together this Sunday's scriptures proclaim our Christian faith that Jesus is the One who will finally come to fulfill God's plan of salvation.

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El rincón del P. Gerardo

La visión de Isaías capta el doble dinamismo de su prédica a los pueblos de Israel y Judá.

Primeramente personas de todas las naciones, y no sólo del pueblo escogido, confluirán hacia el monte santo de Dios, o sea, al lugar de la tierra más próximo a Dios. A la misma vez la palabra de Dios saldrá de ese monte para llevar la paz y la justicia a todas las naciones. Dios será el árbitro, y todas las armas y agresiones serán innecesarias. Dios vendrá a nosotros, pero nosotros hemos de ir a Dios.

El resultado que desea Isaías es que todos “caminemos a la luz del Señor” (Isaías 2, 5). Isaías vaticina el tiempo en que los pueblos de todas las naciones serán iluminados, por darse cuenta de la voluntad de Dios para toda la humanidad. Puesto que todos hemos sido creados por Dios, y a su imagen y semejanza, todos somos hermanos y hermanas a los ojos de Dios. Dios ve a las personas que pelean entre sí, de la misma manera que un padre o una madre ven a sus hijos pelearse; por tanto, levantar un arma o matar a otra persona es análogo al fratricidio.

No es que jamás “las obras de las tinieblas” fueran oportunas, pero lo que escuchamos en la segunda lectura y en el Evangelio debería amedrentarnos como para darle urgencia a cambiar nuestro comportamiento. “La noche está avanzada y se acerca el día”, escribe san Pablo (romanos 13, 12). Y Jesús le advierte a sus discípulos que el Hijo del hombre vendrá “a la hora que menos lo piensen” (Mateo 24, 44). Si honestamente estamos preparando nuestro corazón para recibir a Jesús tenemos que dejar de hacer las cosas que lastiman o menosprecian a otras personas y “revistámonos con las armas de la luz” (romanos 13, 12). Si no queremos que “salga a la luz” es que no lo debemos hacer.

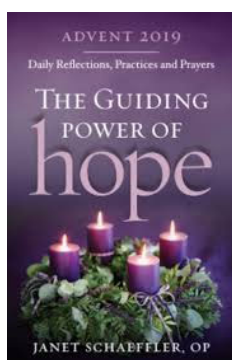

St. James—St. Leo Catholic Community is under the pastoral care of the Eudist Fathers, or Congregation of Jesus and Mary. We owe our name to Saint John Eudes who founded the Congregation in France in 1643.
