Fr. Gerard's Corner

The early Israelites believed that those who followed the Lord's commands would be rewarded during their lifetime or during the lives of their descendants. God's justice would triumph in this world. During the time of the Maccabean revolt, when so many righteous persons were martyred, God's justice began to be understood as capable of transcending this life. Martyrs could be rewarded after they died. In today's first readings, the seven brothers are so confident in their beliefs—both in following religious practices and in the reward of the resurrection—that they are willing to die for their faith.

Saint Paul is likewise willing to risk arrest, torture, and death to preach in defiance of the law. Of course, he models his courage and confidence not only on Jewish martyrs like the seven brothers and their mother, but also on the risen Lord himself.

Jesus' answer to those who deny the resurrection is perfectly logical without falling into the trap of trying to explain the afterlife on the Sadducees' terms. To the Sadducees, there could not be an afterlife because there was no satisfactory answer to this tricky question. Surely a person cannot be married to multiple people at the same time, so there cannot be an afterlife where this could happen. Jesus explains that marriage is not an issue after death. Moreover, the afterlife could be inferred long before Moses because if God is God of the living and God was the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, then even they are still alive. The afterlife is a life that is completely new, not possible to think of in terms of this world. It exceeds our ability to imagine or understand.

CONFIDENCE IN THE LORD

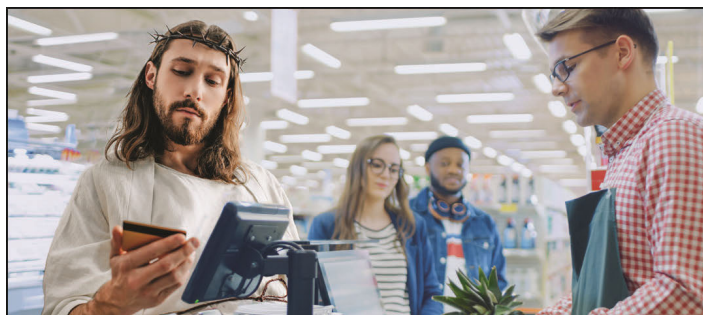
We are nearing the end of the liturgical year. Today's readings remind us that our own lives will draw to a close one day, and we can be certain that the Lord will encourage, strengthen, and save us—both now and at the last. The astonishing story of the Maccabees invigorates our faith as we behold an entire family willing to die rather than deny the Law of Moses. The psalm response echoes the faithful cries of the Maccabees: "I call upon you, for you will answer me, O God." That same confidence appears in Saint Paul's letter to the Thessalonians. "The Lord is faithful," he testifies; "he will strengthen you and guard you from the evil one." In the Gospel, Jesus explains just how long God's protection will endure. The children of God whom God guards, Jesus says, will live forever like angels.

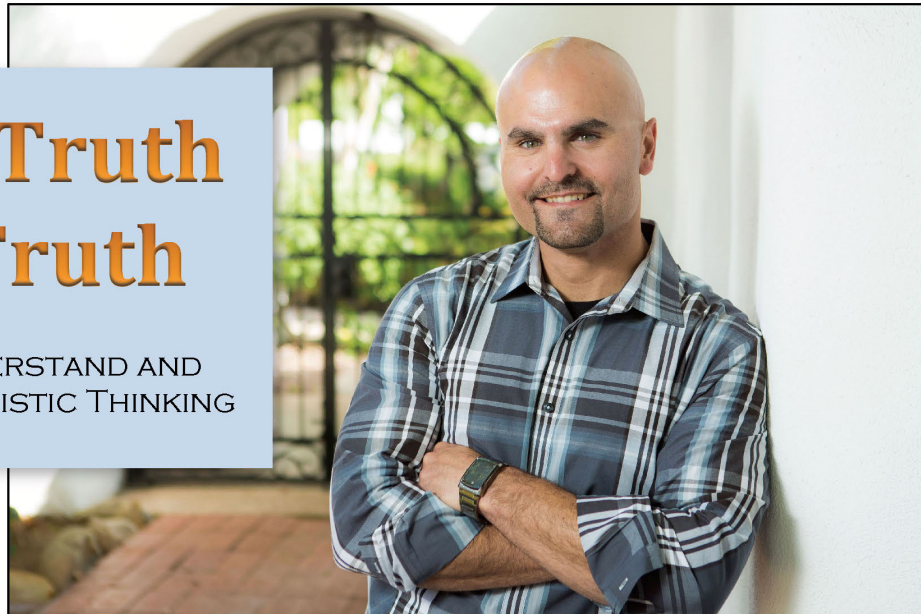

El rincón del P. Gerardo

Los primeros israelitas creían que aquellos que cumplían los mandamientos del Señor serían recompensados durante el transcurso de su vida o la de sus descendientes. La justicia de Dios triunfaría en este mundo. Durante el tiempo de la revuelta de los macabeos, cuando tantas personas justas sufrieron el martirio, se empezó a entender que la justicia de Dios era capaz de trascender esta vida. Los mártires podían ser recompensados después de su muerte. En la primera lectura de hoy los siete hermanos tienen plena confianza en sus creencias, tanto en el cumplimiento de las prácticas religiosas como en la recompensa de la resurrección, y estaban dispuestos a morir por su fe.

San Pablo también está dispuesto a arriesgar un arresto, la tortura y la muerte para predicar pese a la ley. Por supuesto que él modela su valentía y confianza no sólo en los mártires judíos, como los siete hermanos y su madre, sino también en el mismo Señor resucitado.

La respuesta de Jesús a aquellos que niegan la resurrección es perfectamente lógica sin caer en la trampa de tratar de explicar la vida después de la muerte en términos de los saduceos. Para los saduceos no podía haber una vida después de la muerte, porque no había una respuesta satisfactoria para esta pregunta capciosa. Ciertamente una persona no puede estar casada con otras varias personas a la misma vez, por tanto no puede haber una vida después de la muerte donde eso pudiera suceder. Jesús explica que el matrimonio no es asunto después de la muerte. Es más, la vida después de la muerte puede inferirse desde mucho antes de Moisés, pues si Dios es el Dios de los vivos y Dios fue el Dios de Abraham, de Isaac y de Jacob, entonces hasta ellos están todavía vivos. La vida después de la muerte es completamente nueva y no es posible imaginarla en términos de este mundo, pues excede nuestra imaginación y entendimiento.
