Fr. Gerard's Corner

We tend to think of punishment as retribution. Someone is getting their just deserts. Now they will think twice before they do the same thing again. If they fail, then they should just be punished harder next time. But we hear in the first reading today that this is not how God punishes. God "rebuke(s) offenders little by little . . . that they may abandon their wickedness" (Wisdom 12:2). Later in the chapter, the author says of God: "But condemning them bit by bit, you gave them space for repentance" (12:10). Space for repentance. No matter what we have done, God always gives us space for repentance. No matter what others have done to us, let us always give them space for repentance.

The beginning of this reading suggests the reason God always gives us space to turn back. "You love all things . . . for what you hated, you would not have fashioned" (11:24). If we exist, we are loved by God. God never desires that anyone be punished past the point from which they can no longer return.

Zacchaeus was not well-liked in Jericho. He was a tax collector, so he worked for the Roman occupiers. He was wealthy, so that implies that he was collecting more than what was due and keeping the extra for himself. He may have climbed a sycamore tree as much to avoid the crowd as to see over it. But Jesus gives him "space for repentance" and Zacchaeus, full of remorse, takes that space. He returns to God with the same eagerness with which he scampered up the tree, promising to pay back every dishonest penny four times over. His repentance can be a model for us all.

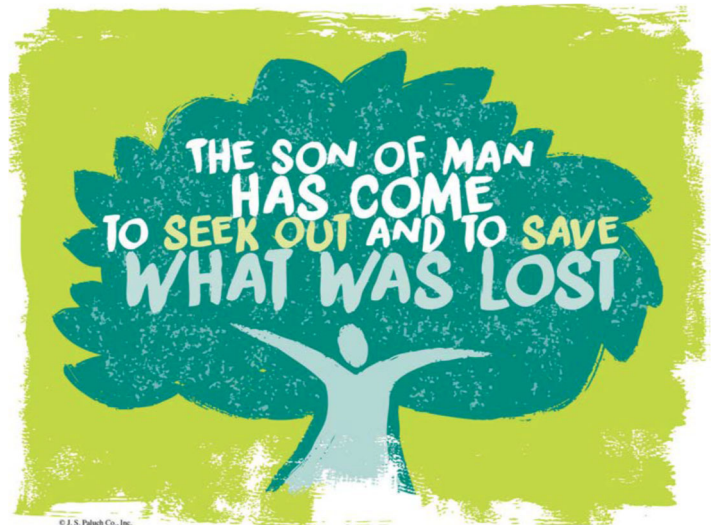

El rincón del P. Gerardo

Tendemos a pensar en el castigo como un desquite. Alguien recibe su merecido. Ahora va a pensarlo bien antes de hacer lo mismo de nuevo. Si falla habrá que castigarlo más duro para la próxima. Pero en la primera lectura de hoy escuchamos que así no es cómo castiga Dios. Dios “los va corrigiendo poco a poco . . . para que se arrepientan de sus maldades” (Sabiduría 12, 2). Después en este mismo capítulo el autor dice así acerca de Dios: “ejecutando poco a poco tu sentencia, les dabas oportunidad de arrepentirse” (12, 10). Oportunidad de arrepentirse. No importa lo que hayamos hecho, Dios siempre nos da la oportunidad de arrepentirnos. No importa lo que otras personas nos hayan hecho a nosotros, démosles siempre la oportunidad de arrepentirse.

El comienzo de esta lectura sugiere la razón por la cual Dios nos da la oportunidad de arrepentirnos. “No aborreces nada de lo que has hecho, . . . pues si hubieras aborrecido alguna cosa, no la habrías creado” (11, 24). Si existimos, somos amados por Dios. Dios nunca desea que nadie sea castigado hasta el punto de no tener ya la oportunidad de arrepentirse.

Zaqueo no era popular en Jericó. Era un cobrador de impuestos, por lo tanto trabajaba para los dominadores romanos. Era rico, por lo tanto eso implicaba que cobraba más de lo debido y se guardaba lo adicional para sí mismo. Pudo haberse subido al árbol no sólo para ver por encima de la gente, sino también para que no lo vieran a él. Pero Jesús le da una “oportunidad de arrepentirse” y Zaqueo, lleno de remordimiento, aprovecha la oportunidad. Regresa a Dios con el mismo entusiasmo que se precipitó a subirse al árbol y prometió pagar todo lo que había cobrado deshonestamente restituyéndolo cuatro veces más. Su arrepentimiento podría ser un ejemplo para todos nosotros.

St. James—St. Leo Catholic Community is under the pastoral care of the Eudist Fathers, or Congregation of Jesus and Mary. We owe our name to Saint John Eudes who founded the Congregation in France in 1643.
