Fr. Gerard's Corner

At the time that Isaiah (actually, "Second Isaiah," as scripture scholars call him) wrote these words, the Chosen People had suffered a crushing loss to Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonian Empire. The temple was destroyed, Jerusalem laid waste, and the people scattered to live among their enemies. Yet Isaiah says that restoring the survivors of Israel is not enough. The LORD's servant must spread God's salvation to the ends of the earth. God's salvation, like the light on the mountaintop, should spread indiscriminately among friend and foe alike. The Chosen People have been defeated and devastated. They cannot even count on their own nation's survival. They cannot know that their nation or temple will ever be restored. Yet Isaiah tells them that God's salvation must reach across all of Babylon, the very empire responsible for the death and suffering of a generation of their families.

The words we heard at the beginning of Mass today echo Paul's words to the Corinthians at the beginning of his first letter to them. The words we will hear inviting us to receive the Eucharist echo John the Baptist's words when seeing Jesus. The words and message we hear today and every day we celebrate the Eucharist have been faithfully passed down to us from nearly two thousand years ago.

Scholars debate about whom Isaiah is referring to when he repeatedly writes of a servant of the LORD. Is it Israel, as is implied in 49:3; Isaiah himself, as implied in 49:5; or one who is to come? Christians see Jesus as the fulfillment of these prophecies, formed from the womb (49:5) to bring salvation to all people (49:6) and thereby revealing the glory of God (49:3).

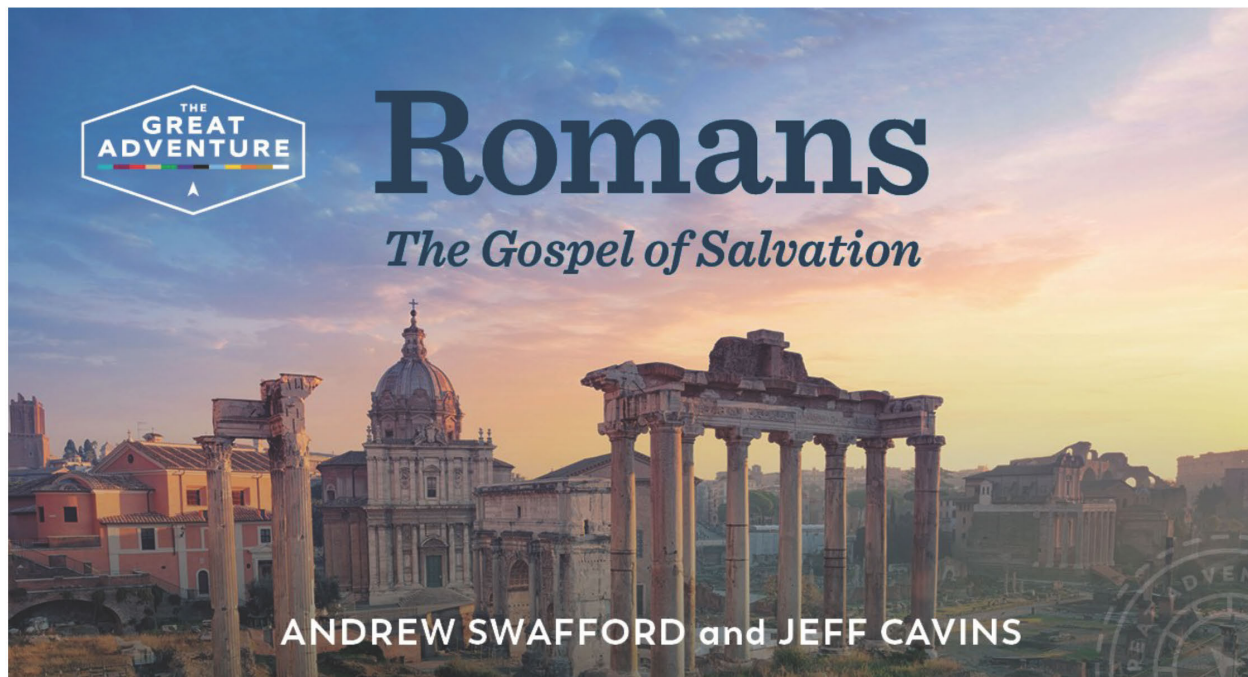

El rincón del P. Gerardo

En el tiempo en que Isaías (con más exactitud el “segundo Isaías”, según lo identifican los biblistas) escribió estas palabras el pueblo escogido había sufrido una pérdida devastadora por manos de Nabucodonosor y el imperio babilónico. El templo había sido destruido y el pueblo dispersado entre sus propios enemigos. Sin embargo, Isaías dice que restablecer a los sobrevivientes de Israel no es suficiente. El siervo de Dios tiene que extender la salvación de Dios hasta los últimos rincones de la tierra. La salvación de Dios, tal como la luz en la cima del monte, debe expandirse sin hacer diferencia entre amigo y enemigo. El pueblo escogido ha sido vencido y derrotado. Ni siquiera pueden contar con su propia nación para sobrevivir. No pueden saber que ni su nación ni su templo serían restaurados jamás. Sin embargo Isaías les dice que la salvación de Dios debe extenderse a lo largo y ancho de toda Babilonia, nada más y nada menos que el imperio responsable por la muerte y el sufrimiento de toda una generación de su familia.

Las palabras que escuchamos al comienzo de la Misa le hacen eco a las palabras de Pablo a los corintios al comienzo de la primera carta que les dirigió. Las palabras que oiremos para invitarnos a la Eucaristía le hacen eco a las palabras de Juan el Bautista al ver a Jesús. Las palabras y el mensaje que escuchamos hoy y cada vez que celebramos la Eucaristía nos han sido fielmente transmitidas en el curso de hace casi dos mil años.

Los biblistas deliberan acerca de a quién se refiere Isaías cuando repetidamente escribe sobre el siervo de Dios. ¿Es Israel, tal como se implica en el versículo 3 del capítulo 49? ¿Es el mismo Isaías, según lo implica el versículo 5 del mismo capítulo? ¿O es acaso otro que ha de venir? Los cristianos ven el cumplimiento de estas profecías en Jesús, a quien Dios formó desde el seno materno, (49, 5) para que llegue la salvación a toda la tierra (49, 6) y de ese modo manifestará la gloria de Dios (49, 3).
