## Fr. Gerard's Corner

June 28, 2020

### Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The woman of Shunem was clearly a woman of influence, even in her own marriage. The author clearly states that it is she, not her husband, who invites the prophet to dine with them in their home. She goes on to suggest to her husband, not ask him, that they build a room for Elisha and furnish it with furniture. She is determined to offer him hospitality beyond his or her husband's expectations. For her generosity, God rewards her with a child. She had prepared a room for God's prophet. Elisha promises her that God will prepare her womb for a new life.

When most of us were baptized a stream of water was poured over our heads, but to truly appreciate the first line of the second reading, we should picture baptism by immersion. After all, this was the norm in Paul's time. When the elect are plunged into the baptismal waters, they are temporarily unable to breathe. They are dying with Christ. When their faces are lifted out of the water, they are being raised to new, changed life. As baptized Christians, we are called to bury our lives of sin and live in a new life of holiness.

When using an absurdly high bar, we often make comparisons that sound ridiculous: "I love this ice cream more than life itself." Jesus' opening words to his apostles in the Gospel sound equally outrageous: "Whoever loves father or mother . . . son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me" (Matthew 10:37). How could we love anyone more than the people who brought us into the world or those whom we brought into the world? But this is not the point. Loving Christ above all gives us a different perspective, in which everyone is someone's daughter or son. This allows us to see all people as our brothers and sisters.




## Please read before attending Mass at St. James-St. Leo

- High-risk persons and anyone with symptoms is not to attend.
- Anyone over the age of 4 is required to wear a facemask at all Masses, whether indoors or outdoors.
- No-touch temperatures will be taken upon entering. Available seating is designated with appropriate spacing.
- Collection boxes are available at the entrance for Sunday envelopes.
- All fonts will be empty of water. Missalettes are removed. You are encouraged to bring your own.
- Restrooms are limited to one person/family at a time.
- Drinking fountains and social room are not available.
- Vestry is for authorized persons only (clergy, staff, sacristans). Prayer chapel is for pass-through only.
- One entrance is observed. All locations will be sanitized between Masses.
- No physical contact occurs during Sign of Peace or Lord's Prayer.
- Communion is distributed at the end of Mass, after the final blessing; host only, no cup.
- Eucharistic Ministers will use a mask with sanitized hands. Any contact requires re-sanitation.

**Each Mass location is limited to 100 persons total, so the following is observed:**

- Saturday evening Mass and Sunday Mass require a reservation through Signup Genius. If you are unable to register online, please call the parish office at (858) 755-2545.
- People without reservations or who are high risk may attend outdoors.
- Weekend Masses at St. James Church will be live streamed and may be watched through personal devices.
- Saturday evening Mass and Sunday Mass will be held at both the church and the parish hall.





La mujer de Sunem era evidentemente una mujer con influencia, aun en su propio matrimonio. El autor dice claramente que es ella, y no su esposo, quien invita al profeta a comer en el hogar de ellos. Además no le pregunta, sino le sugiere a su esposo construir una habitación amueblada para Eliseo. Ella está resuelta a ofrecerle una hospitalidad más allá de lo esperado por su propio esposo y por el mismo Eliseo. Dios recompensa su generosidad con un hijo. Le había preparado una habitación al profeta de Dios. Eliseo le promete que Dios preparará el seno de ella para recibir una vida nueva.

Cuando fuimos bautizados, a la mayoría de nosotros nos echaron un chorro de agua sobre nuestra cabeza, pero para apreciar de veras la primera frase de la segunda lectura debemos imaginarnos el bautismo por inmersión. Después de todo, esto era lo corriente en los tiempos de Pablo. Cuando el elegido se sumergía en las aguas del bautismo no podía respirar por unos momentos. Estaba muriendo con Cristo. Cuando lo alzan a la superficie recibe una vida nueva y transformada. Nosotros los cristianos estamos llamados a sepultar nuestra vida de pecado y vivir una vida nueva de santidad.

Algunas veces hacemos comparaciones ridículas: "Este helado (nieve) es mejor que la vida". Las primeras palabras de Jesús a sus apóstoles en el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy también suenan inauditas: "El que ama a su padre o a su madre más que a mí, no es digno de mí" (Mateo 10, 37). ¿Cómo podemos amar a alguien más que a aquellos que nos dieron la vida o a quienes nosotros le hemos dado la vida? Pero éste no es el punto. Amar a Cristo por encima de todos nos da una perspectiva diferente, para ver a otra persona como la hija o el hijo de alguien, lo cual nos permite ver a todos los demás como nuestros hermanos y hermanas.
