Fr. Gerard's Corner

July 5, 2020

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Our expectations often fool us. Zechariah realized this. It's only natural to expect that a king would ride in on horse and chariot. On a beast of burden without a weapon? Preposterous. Yet that is how the "just savior" brings peace. In the Gospel, Jesus says God has revealed to little ones what has been hidden from the wise and the learned. To recognize Jesus as the Messiah, one had to be open to the possibility of a king who acted like a servant. Those who insisted they already had all the answers (e.g. the scribes and the Pharisees) refused to accept him.

Yokes are uncommon today, but in the days before tractors and other power machinery strong animals had to pull farm equipment across the field. To drag the plow through heavy soil and keep it headed in a straight line, animals usually worked in pairs, attached with a yoke. The animals walked at a sustainable pace, supporting each other when one tired or encountered an obstacle. With a yoke, each animal needed to do only half the work. Jesus offers us similar support. By sharing in our hardships, he lightens our burden and gives us some rest. We are not going it alone.

We have some responsibility in having our burden eased. We need to stand up and take the yoke. "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me," Jesus tells his audience (Matthew 11:29). We need to turn to the Lord and we need to listen and learn. We need to ask what the Lord is calling us to do and be willing to accept that. In doing so we will realize that Jesus will always be there to help us.

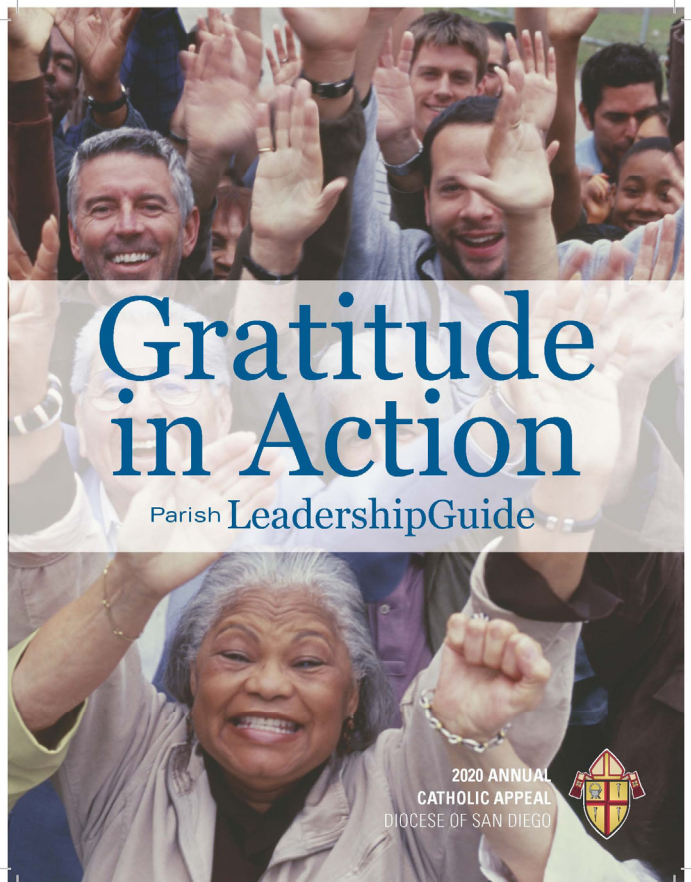

El Rincón del Padre Gerardo

Decimocuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Nuestras expectativas a menudo nos engañan. Zacarías se dio cuenta de eso. Es natural esperar que un rey venga en carro y caballo. Pero, ¿montado en un burro y sin armas? Absurdo. Y sin embargo así es como el “siervo justo” trae su paz. En el Evangelio Jesús dice que Dios le ha revelado a la gente sencilla lo que ha escondido a los sabios y entendidos. A fin de poder reconocer a Jesús como el Mesías había que aceptar la posibilidad de que un rey actuara como un siervo. Aquellos que insistían en tener una respuesta para todo (por ejemplo, los escribas y fariseos) se negaron a aceptarlo.

Los yugos no son comunes hoy, pero en los tiempos anteriores al tractor y otras maquinarias eléctricas eran los animales los que se usaban para jalar los equipos agrícolas por todo el campo. Los animales normalmente trabajaban en pares y apegados a un yugo, para arrastrar el arado por terrenos densos y mantenerlos en una línea recta. Los animales caminaban a un paso sostenible, apoyándose uno al otro cuando uno de los dos se cansaba o encontraba algún obstáculo. El yugo ayudaba a que cada animal hiciera sólo la mitad del trabajo. Jesús nos ofrece una ayuda semejante. Él comparte nuestras adversidades, y así nos alivia la carga y nos ofrece un descanso. No estamos solos.

Nosotros tenemos cierta responsabilidad en aliviar nuestra carga. Tenemos que estar resueltos a tomar el yugo. “Tomen mi yugo sobre ustedes y aprendan de mí”, le dice Jesús a su audiencia (Mateo 11, 29). Tenemos que volvernos al Señor, y necesitamos escuchar y aprender. Necesitamos preguntarnos qué es lo que el Señor nos llama a hacer y estar dispuestos a aceptarlo. Así nos daremos cuenta de que Jesús siempre estará ahí para ayudarnos.
