Fr. Gerard's Corner

July 26, 2020

Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The well-known story of Solomon using his newfound wisdom to determine a baby's true mother by proposing to cut the baby in two occurs just a few verses after the passage we hear today in the first reading. Note, however, that Solomon did not specifically ask God for wisdom. He asked God simply for an understanding heart. Also notice that he did not ask for an understanding mind, but an understanding heart, so that he could know in his heart what is right. God then gives him "a heart so wise and understanding" (1 Kings 3:12) that he gains the wisdom to distinguish right from wrong and make just judgments.

Again this week Jesus uses parables to describe the kingdom of heaven. The act of buying a field in which you've just reburied a treasure seems strange and a little deceptive, but in the uncertain political situation of Jesus' time, and especially at the time the Gospels were written, hiding a treasure underground was not uncommon. The parable's point is that the finder gives everything he has to gain that treasure. So must we be willing to do to gain the treasure of heaven.

Not once in all the parables we have heard over the last few Sundays has Jesus mentioned wisdom. Yet wisdom is essential to reach the proper conclusions. Wisdom teaches us to recognize true treasure, which may be overlooked by most people, buried deep inside someone, hidden away from those who see superficially. It is wisdom that gives the finder an understanding heart to make the right judgment and value the treasure for its true worth.

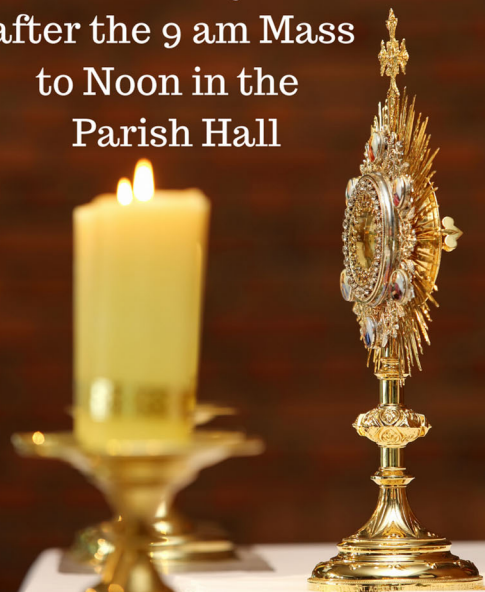

Saint James the Apostle's Story

This James is the brother of John the Evangelist. The two were called by Jesus as they worked with their father in a fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee. Jesus had already called another pair of brothers from a similar occupation: Peter and Andrew. "He walked along a little farther and saw James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They too were in a boat mending their nets. Then he called them. So they left their father Zebedee in the boat along with the hired men and followed him" (Mark 1:19-20).

James was one of the favored three who had the privilege of witnessing the Transfiguration, the raising to life of the daughter of Jairus, and the agony in Gethsemani.

Two incidents in the Gospels describe the temperament of this man and his brother. Saint Matthew tells that their mother came—Mark says it was the brothers themselves—to ask that they have the seats of honor in the kingdom. "Jesus said in reply, 'You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I am going to drink?' They said to him, 'We can'" (Matthew 20:22). Jesus then told them they would indeed drink the cup and share his baptism of pain and death, but that sitting at his right hand or left was not his to give—it "is for those for whom it has been prepared by my Father" (Matthew 20:23b). It remained to be seen how long it would take to realize the implications of their confident "We can!"

The other disciples became indignant at the ambition of James and John. Then Jesus taught them all the lesson of humble service: The purpose of authority is to serve. They are not to impose their will on others, or lord it over them. This is the position of Jesus himself. He was the servant of all; the service imposed on him was the supreme sacrifice of his own life.

On another occasion, James and John gave evidence that the nickname Jesus gave them—"sons of thunder"—was an apt one. The Samaritans would not welcome Jesus because he was on his way to hated Jerusalem. "When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, 'Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?' Jesus turned and rebuked them..." (Luke 9:54-55).

James was apparently the first of the apostles to be martyred. "About that time King Herod laid hands upon some members of the church to harm them. He had James, the brother of John, killed by the sword, and when he saw that this was pleasing to the Jews he proceeded to arrest Peter also" (Acts 12:1-3a).

This James, sometimes called James the Greater, is not to be confused with James the Lesser or with the author of the *Letter of James* and the leader of the Jerusalem community. Franciscanmedia.org

El Rincón del Padre Gerardo

26 de julio de 2020

Unos pocos versículos después del pasaje que leemos hoy en la primera lectura está la bien conocida historia de Salomón que, para determinar quién es la verdadera madre de un bebé, usa su recién descubierta sabiduría y propone cortar el niño a la mitad. Notemos, sin embargo, que Salomón no le pidió a Dios la sabiduría específicamente. Sencillamente le pidió rectitud de corazón. También notemos que no pidió rectitud de mente, sino de corazón, para poder saber de corazón qué es lo correcto. Dios le concede entonces “un corazón sabio y prudente” (1 Reyes 3, 12) y así recibe la sabiduría para distinguir entre el bien y el mal, y hacer juicios justos.

Una vez más esta semana Jesús usa parábolas para describir el Reino de los cielos. La acción de comprar un terreno donde acabas de esconder un tesoro parece extraño y un poco falaz, pero en la incierta situación política del tiempo de Jesús, y sobre todo del tiempo en que fueron escritos los Evangelios, esconder un tesoro en la tierra no era algo raro. El punto de la parábola es que el que lo encuentra da todo lo que tiene a fin de ganar ese tesoro. Lo mismo debemos estar dispuestos a hacer nosotros para ganar el tesoro del cielo.

Ni una sola vez Jesús ha mencionado la sabiduría en las parábolas que escuchamos en los domingos anteriores. Sin embargo la sabiduría es esencial para llegar a las conclusiones correctas. La sabiduría nos enseña a reconocer el verdadero tesoro que pudiera pasarle por alto a la mayoría de las personas y que está escondido muy dentro de alguien, donde aquellos que ven superficialmente no pueden encontrar. Es la sabiduría lo que le da al que encuentra el tesoro rectitud de corazón para hacer el juicio correcto y darle al tesoro su verdadero valor.

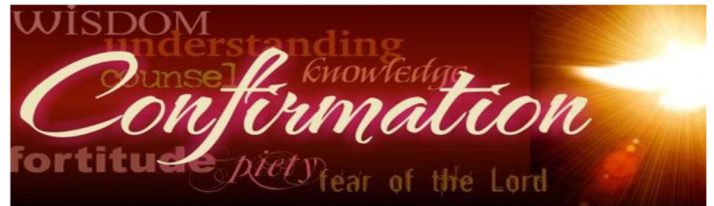

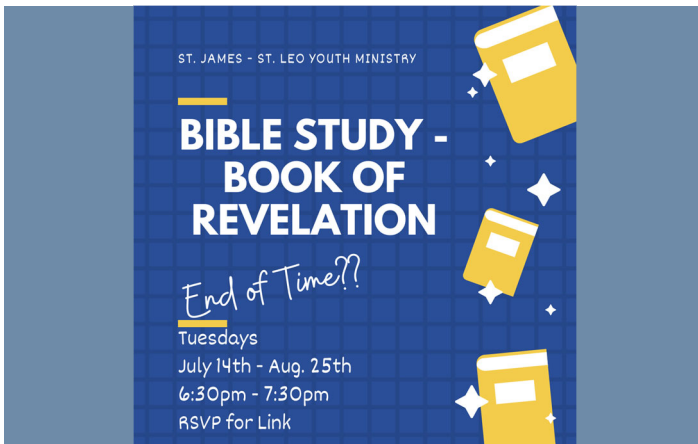
