Fr. Gerard's Corner

The entire relationship between God and the Chosen People was founded on the covenant. The history of the Israelites, from Abraham to Moses to David, was anchored in the covenant and found opposition of enemy nations, from Egypt to Assyria to Babylon. But in today's first reading, we hear Isaiah tell his audience, recently returned from exile, that foreigners who held to the covenant would also be welcome on God's holy mountain, in God's house. Admittance is not based on background, culture, or history, but on one's own faithfulness and service.

It is in a direct line from both Isaiah and Jesus Christ that Paul can say to the Romans, "I am the apostle to the Gentiles" (Romans 11:13). Paul has dedicated his ministry to making disciples of all nations, drawing foreigners to the LORD. Pope Francis has repeatedly emphasized that we are a missionary church, steadily calling us to go to "the peripheries" to minister to those on the outskirts of society.

The Canaanite woman in today's Gospel broke through a number of boundaries, but it was Jesus who broke through the first one. He journeyed to Tyre and Sidon, two cities in Phoenicia, part of Syria, where the people worshiped pagan gods. Jews did not typically venture there. He told the woman, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel," but his presence in her territory belied his words (Matthew 15:24). Jesus went outside Israel and found people of great faith outside the chosen ones. We too may find open hearts and willing souls outside our own borders.

St. John Eudes

John Eudes was born in 1601, in the village of Ri, in Normandy, France. After completing his studies at the Jesuit College in Caen, he entered the Congregation of the Oratory of France, founded in 1611 by Cardinal Pierre de Bérulle. Accepted by the founder himself on March 25, 1623, John Eudes was ordained to the priesthood on December 20, 1625. During time in the Oratory, he assimilated the Christocentric spiritual thought of de Bérulle and shared his enthusiasm for "restoring the priestly order to its full splendor".

Imbued with this spirit, as an apostolic missionary, he evangelized many towns and cities of Normandy, Ile-de-France, Burgundy and Brittany. He spent most of his life evangelizing people through "the popular parish mission." He had great zeal for sharing the good news of the Reign of God. He wanted all people to know the merciful love of God and to experience that love in a personal way.

In the course of his parish missions, he met women who were in need of healing and rehabilitation. In 1641, he founded the Order of Our Lady of Charity to provide haven and assistance to women and young girls mistreated by life. In the centuries after his death, this charism lived on and grew into a worldwide apostolate. The congregation is now known as the Sisters of Our Lady of Charity of the Good Shepherd (sometimes just The Good Shepherd Sisters).

He recognized the pressing need for contributing to a reform of the clergy, and founding a seminary at Caen appeared to him as indispensable. To do so, he left the Oratory and, on March 25, 1643, with a few diocesan priests, founded a congregation dedicated to the spiritual and doctrinal formation of priests and candidates to the priesthood, while pursuing the work of parish missions. Other seminaries were soon added to the one at Caen. Thus, the Congregation of Jesus and Mary was born.

He brought people to love Christ and the Virgin Mary by speaking tirelessly about their Heart, the sign of the love God shows for us and the communion to which we are called.

To offer them liturgical worship, he composed Masses and Offices in their honor and had the first Feast of the Holy Heart of Mary celebrated on February 8, 1648, at Autun, and the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus celebrated on October 20, 1672.

Moreover, through his many writings, he helped spread the spiritual teaching of his masters who were members of Bérulle's Oratory, while giving it his own personal touch to the point where he came to be regarded as a spiritual master in his own right.

He died on August 19, 1680 and was canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 31, 1925. The pope proclaimed him to be "the Father, Apostle and Doctor of Liturgical Devotion to the Hearts of Jesus and Mary."



El Rincón del Padre Gerardo

Toda la relación entre Dios y el pueblo escogido estaba fundamentada en la alianza. La historia de los israelitas, desde Abraham hasta Moisés y David, tenía la alianza como ancla y encontró oposición de las naciones enemigas, desde Egipto hasta Asiria y Babilonia. Pero en la primera lectura de hoy escuchamos a Isaías decir a su audiencia, que recién regresaba de su exilio, que los extranjeros que se habían adherido a la alianza también serían conducidos al monte santo, en la casa de Dios. El acceso no está basado en antecedentes, cultura o historia, sino en la fidelidad y el servicio de cada cual.

Es en una relación directa con Isaías y con Jesucristo que Pablo puede decirle a los romanos: “Trato de desempeñar lo mejor posible mi ministerio entre los no judíos” (cfr. romanos 11, 13). Pablo ha dedicado su ministerio a hacer discípulos de todas las naciones, conduciendo a los extranjeros hacia al Señor. El Papa Francisco ha enfatizado repetidamente que somos una Iglesia misionera, llamándonos incesantemente a ir a “las periferias” a servir a los marginados de la Sociedad.

La mujer cananea del Evangelio de hoy rompió un buen número de límites, pero fue Jesús quien rompió el primero. Él fue a Tiro y Sidón, dos ciudades de Fenicia, en Siria, donde la gente adoraba a dioses paganos. Los judíos normalmente no se aventuraban a ir allí. Le dijo a la mujer: “Yo no he sido enviado sino a las ovejas descarriadas de la casa de Israel”, pero su presencia en el territorio de ella contradecían sus palabras (Mateo 15, 24). Jesús salió afuera de Israel y encontró a personas de una gran fe fuera del pueblo escogido. También nosotros podríamos encontrar corazones abiertos y almas dispuestas fuera de nuestras propias fronteras.


Comunion Espiritual

¿Qué es la comunión espiritual?

Santo Tomás de Aquino la describió como "un ardiente deseo de recibir a Jesús en el sacramento más santo, abrazándole amorosamente" en momentos o circunstancias que no podemos recibirla en la Comunión sacramental. Con la ausencia de misas públicas en la Arquidiócesis de Santa Fe, debido a la enfermedad del coronavirus, la oportunidad de recibir la comunión espiritual es particularmente apropiada. La comunión espiritual no necesita ninguna instrucción especial; sólo requiere la misma disposición que la recepción actual del sacramento y un giro a Jesús con el corazón. No se requiere ninguna oración o formulario en particular; sin embargo, para ayudar con el enfoque de una intención adecuada, se les sugiere recitar una oración. A continuación, les compartimos una de las más populares compuesta por San Alfonso Liguori:

"Dios mío, creo que estás presente en el Santísimo Sacramento. Te amo sobre todas las cosas y te deseo con todo mi corazón, puesto que ahora no puedo recibirtre sacramentalmente, te pido que vengas espiritualmente a mi corazón. Te abrazo como si tú estuvieras ya en mi corazón y me uno a ti completamente. Por favor, nunca permitas que me separe de ti."


