Fr. Gerard's Corner

In the verses preceding the ones we hear in today's first reading Isaiah details Shebna's excesses, particularly the tomb he had hewn for himself. Isaiah goes so far as to say that the LORD would see to it that Shebna would make use of his tomb much earlier than he expected! Isaiah's Judah was threatened by foreign adversaries from without and moral decay from within and Isaiah had no time for leaders who served only themselves. Instead, the LORD favors Eliakim, who serves God, and so to him God entrusts the key of the house of David. Eliakim is made a part of David's lineage, ensuring that a Messiah, one anointed to bring salvation, would eventually be born.

Jesus' disciples initially tell him that people say he is John the Baptist or Elijah or Jeremiah or one of the prophets, like Isaiah. A prophet is not one who can predict the future; a prophet is one chosen by God, sent by God, who speaks on God's behalf, and commits to spreading God's message. In this sense Jesus is a prophet, but not just "one of the prophets" (Matthew 16:14). He is not just chosen by God, he is the Son of the living God. He is not just delivering a message, he is the Word of God. He is not just pointing to salvation, he is our salvation. Peter realized this uniqueness of Jesus, and so Jesus gives him the authority over all believers.

Each time we gather together at Mass, we listen to the word of the Lord. We eat at the table of the Lord. We grow in knowledge of the Lord and are sustained in the Lord's mission. We become a part of something much larger than ourselves, for we are a part of a parish community, of a diocese, of the whole Church, indeed, of the body of Christ.

Don't abandon spiritual communion even if you're back at Mass. Here's why: Quang D. Tran, S.J. | Aug 12, 2020

Repeated throughout the day, it becomes a re-living of a mini Good Friday and Holy Saturday, longing for Easter Sunday.

In the past months, the pandemic has led to the revival of the practice of spiritual communion — the act of asking and desiring Jesus to enter our soul as if we were receiving Him sacramentally at Mass. St. Thomas Aquinas taught that we can “spiritually eat” with our desire for the Eucharist and receive its graces when we are unable to receive physically.

When I was offering “Zoom Masses,” I would hold the chalice and Host to the camera after the “Lamb of God” and pause for the virtual congregation, wherever they might be, to make an act of spiritual communion:

My Jesus, I believe you are really present in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you more than anything in the world, and I hunger to receive you. But since I cannot receive Communion at this moment, feed my soul at least spiritually. I unite myself to you now as I do when I actually receive you. Never let me drift away from you. Amen.
(St. Alphonsus Liguori)

Before the pandemic, many Catholics probably had not heard of this centuries-old practice, but they've now found they grew to love the Eucharist more because of it. As public Masses are gradually being offered again, it's tempting to pack away this devotion until the next crisis.

Instead, Catholics attending Mass virtually or in person would do well to continue making daily spiritual communions, in good times and in bad, in sickness and in health.

Having experienced the powerful effects of this practice, St. Teresa Avila advised: When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you.

But spiritual communion can also be made on days when one physically attends Mass and receives communion. Rather than a mere substitute for receiving the Eucharist, spiritual communion intensifies our hunger for the sacrament and renders its actual reception more fruitful. When friends who are apart communicate regularly with one another, how sweet and familiar is the encounter—the communion—when they meet again in person! Reflect on this powerful quote about spiritual communion.

St. Alphonsus Ligouri recommended making a spiritual communion three times — beginning, middle, and end — during a visit to the Blessed Sacrament or at Mass. In fact, there is no limit to how many spiritual communions one can make in one day. St. Alphonsus wrote: Blessed Agatha of the Cross made 200 spiritual communions in the day; and Peter Faber, the first companion of St. Ignatius, used to say that spiritual communions are a most powerful help to receive the holy Eucharist with the proper dispositions.

While spiritual communion is often prescribed to the laity, especially those who are homebound or hospitalized, priests would also benefit from it. After passively listening to people devoutly pray the spiritual communion prayer (above) for several Sundays, I felt moved to pray it outside of Mass as well.

This act of spiritual communion repeated throughout the day became a re-living of a mini Good Friday and Holy Saturday, longing for Easter Sunday. Though I am nowhere close to making 200 daily spiritual communions, the practice of repeating them throughout the day has nevertheless renewed my love and reverence for the great mystery that I celebrate with the Church each day.

Spiritual communion is not just for times of pandemic or other extraordinary circumstances. Spiritual communion is for all times.

SANTA ROSA DE LIMA

(1586-1617)

23 de agosto

Isabel de Flores nació en Lima, Perú; era tan bella, que su madrina dijo que era “bella como una rosa”. Asumió ese mismo nombre al momento de su Confirmación y años después, cuando por fin su familia se convenció de que no aspiraba al matrimonio, adoptó el nombre de Rosa como Religiosa Terciaria Dominica, viviendo en casa, dedicada a la oración, al trabajo diario y al cuidado de los pobres; tejía hasta altas horas de la noche, además de dedicarse a la jardinería para luego colaborar en la economía familiar. Su vida de oración y penitencia fue intachable y ejemplar, pues no sólo contempló a Dios en la creación, sino que construyó una cabaña en oratorio personal en su jardín. En un cuarto de su casa comenzó un hospital cuidando de los enfermos y de quienes acudían a ella. Como gran santa que fue, su vida se vio marcada por el sacrificio y la angustia espiritual. Murió a los 31 años llegando a ser la primera persona latinoamericana en ser canonizada; posteriormente fue declarada Patrona de América Latina.

El Rincón del Padre Gerardo

En los versículos que preceden a los que escuchamos hoy en la primera lectura, Isaías detalla los excesos de Sebná, en particular el sepulcro que se había tallado para sí mismo. ¡Isaías llega hasta decir que el Señor se ocupará de que Sebná use su sepulcro mucho antes de lo que esperaba! La Judá de Isaías era amenazada por adversarios extranjeros desde fuera y por un deterioro moral desde dentro, por tanto Isaías no tenía tiempo para lidiar con líderes que se servían sólo a sí mismos. En vez, el Señor favorece a Eleacín, siervo de Dios, y a él le confía las llaves del palacio de David. A Eleacín se le hace parte del linaje de David, garantizando así que un Mesías, ungido para traer la salvación, llegaría a nacer con el tiempo.

A principio los discípulos de Jesús le dicen que la gente dice que él es Juan el Bautista o Elías, o Jeremías, o alguno de los profetas, como Isaías. El profeta no es alguien que predice el futuro; el profeta es alguien escogido por Dios y enviado por Dios para hablar en nombre de Dios, y se compromete a difundir el mensaje de Dios. En este sentido Jesús es un profeta, pero no sólo “alguno de los profetas” (Mateo 16, 14). Él no sólo es escogido por Dios, él es el Hijo del Dios vivo. Él no sólo entrega un mensaje, él es la Palabra de Dios. Él no sólo nos indica la salvación, él es nuestra salvación. Pedro se dio cuenta de esta naturaleza única de Jesús y por eso Jesús le concede autoridad sobre todos los creyentes.

Cada vez que nos reunimos en la Misa escuchamos la palabra de Dios, comemos en la mesa del Señor, aumenta nuestro conocimiento del Señor y recibimos el sustento para hacer la misión del Señor. Llegamos a formar parte de algo mucho más grande que nosotros mismos, pues somos parte de una comunidad parroquial, de una diócesis, de la Iglesia universal, o sea, del Cuerpo de Cristo.
