Fr. Gerard's Corner

Last week we heard Jesus tell his disciples that those who wish to follow him must first take up their cross. One of these crosses is to take the responsibility to hold others accountable. Whether it is individually, like Ezekiel, or with a community, like the early church in Matthew, we are obligated to call others to account when they act unjustly or unmercifully. It can be difficult to correct a subordinate, awkward to correct a peer, and scary to correct a leader. But we are called to do so, out of love for our neighbor, so that a conversion of heart may take place.

If you love your neighbor as yourself, as Saint Paul reminds the Romans that as Christians they are called to do, at the very least you will treat your neighbor the way you would want to be treated yourself. Therefore, he can say that Christians fulfill all the commandments, the entire law, by following this one principal command. Neither religious nor political authorities could find fault in that.

It is alarming to hear Jesus tell the disciples that if a sinner “refuses to listen even to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector” (Matthew 18:17). Is Jesus telling his disciples to exclude sinners, just as society treats outsiders and collaborators? No, quite the opposite! Jesus has already extended his mission into Gentile territory and welcomed tax collectors into his fold. Jesus does not tell them to treat sinners as the Pharisees treat Gentiles and tax collectors, but as you would treat Gentiles and tax collectors. Jesus trusted that his disciples realized the goal is always reconciliation, not exclusion.

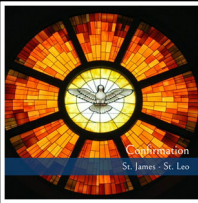

In October 2001, the United States Congress passed a joint resolution designating that every September 11th be observed as "Patriot Day."

The proclamation calls on Americans to "participate in community service in honor of those our Nation lost, to observe this day with other ceremonies and activities, including remembrance services ... to honor the innocent victims who perished as a result of the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001."

El Rincó del Padre Gerardo

La semana pasada oímos a Jesús decirle a sus discípulos que todo el que quiera seguirlo debe primero cargar con su cruz. Una de esas cruces es aceptar la responsabilidad de amonestar. Ya sea individualmente como Ezequiel, o con una comunidad como la Iglesia primitiva en el Evangelio de Mateo, estamos obligados a pedir una rendición de cuentas a los que actúan injusta o despiadadamente. Puede ser difícil amonestar a un subalterno, complicado corregir a un colega y aterrador llamarle la atención a un líder. Pero a eso estamos llamados por amor al prójimo y para que se pueda dar una conversión de corazón.

Si amas al prójimo como a ti mismo, tal como san Pablo le recuerda a los romanos que son cristianos, lo mínimo que puedes hacer es tratar a tu prójimo como quisieras ser tratado tú. Por eso Pablo dice que los cristianos cumplen con todos los mandamientos, con el cumplimiento pleno de la ley, cuando cumplen este mandamiento principal. Ninguna autoridad, ni religiosa ni política, puede decir que hay equivocación en eso.

Resulta alarmante oír a Jesús decirle a sus discípulos que si un pecador “ni a la comunidad le hace caso, apártate de él como de un pagano o de un publicano” (Mateo 18, 17). ¿Acaso le dice Jesús a sus discípulos que deben excluir a los pecadores de igual manera que la sociedad trata a los marginados? ¡Rotundamente no! Se trata más bien de lo opuesto. Jesús ya ha extendido su misión hasta territorios paganos y recibió en su rebaño a los publicanos o cobradores de impuestos. Jesús no le dice a sus discípulos que traten a los pecadores como los fariseos tratan a los paganos y cobradores de impuestos, sino como tú tratarías a los paganos y cobradores de impuestos. Jesús confió en que sus discípulos estaban conscientes de que la meta será siempre la reconciliación y no la exclusión.

To All Parishioners and Supporters of Mission Circle from Fr. Gerard LeComte, CJM:

For over 40 years, Mission Circle has been a key part of the St. James – St. Leo Catholic Community. Under Fr. John Howard's leadership, the intent of Mission Circle has always been to provide parishioners the opportunity to become "missionaries for a day". Initially, this was focused on a needy home for girls in Tijuana called Casa Eudes, and over the years, other projects have arisen that have expanded the reach of Mission Circle volunteers. These include the Food Packaging events, the peanut butter and jelly ministry, the shoe program, tutoring kids at the St. Leo Mission, cookies for Kairos, and other similar opportunities.
