Fr. Gerard's Corner

Anger is a basic human emotion, its welling up within us perfectly natural in many situations. However, if left to fester, or expressed as wrath or vengeance, it can become poisonous. Sirach tells us that "the sinner hugs (wrath and anger) tight," refusing to let go of their visceral reaction to being wronged (Sirach 27:30). Instead, we must embrace the golden rule, forgiving our neighbor so that we may be forgiven ourselves. Forgiveness opens the door for reconciliation.

When the king in Jesus' parable forgave the loan, he didn't just wipe away the servant's debt, he restored him (and his family) to life. Had he not done so, the servant, his wife, and their children would have been sold, along with all their belongings, to pay his debt. He literally gave them their life back. How tragic to see him then go out and punish the servant with the smaller debt!

In ancient times seven was seen as the perfect number, so it was used to symbolize perfection or completeness, as in the creation story. When Peter suggests to Jesus that forgiving one's brother or sister "as many as seven times" (Matthew 18:21) would be sufficient, he is suggesting that seven times would amount to total forgiveness. But Jesus responds that "not seven times but seventy-seven times" (18:22) is the answer, implying that there is no completion to forgiveness. Seventy-seven implies boundlessness, a sense that forgiveness is not a task to be quantified and completed, but an attitude to be integrated into our way of living. We are called to be forgiving. Always. Really, how can we stop forgiving if we so often need forgiveness ourselves?

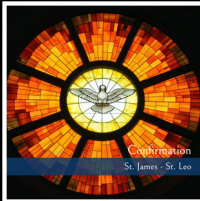

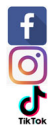

El Rincó del Padre Gerardo

El enfado es una emoción humana básica y es perfectamente natural que aflore en nosotros en muchas circunstancias. Sin embargo, si lo dejamos enconarse o lo expresamos en forma de cólera o de venganza puede resultar venenoso. Sirácide nos dice que “el pecador se aferra a (el rencor y la cólera)”, negándose a dejar su reacción instintiva por sentirse ofendido (Sirácide 27, 30). En vez, debemos aceptar la regla de oro, o sea, perdonar a nuestro prójimo para que seamos perdonados. El perdón le abre la puerta a la reconciliación.

Cuando el rey de la parábola de Jesús perdonó el préstamo, no sólo eliminó la deuda del servidor, sino que le devolvió la vida a él y su familia. De no haberle perdonado la deuda, el servidor junto a su esposa y sus hijos hubieran sido vendido con todos sus bienes para poder saldar la deuda. Verdaderamente le devolvió la vida. ¡Qué trágico ver cómo castigó luego al servidor que tenía una deuda más pequeña!

En la antigüedad el número siete se percibía como el número perfecto y por eso era usado para simbolizar perfección o integridad, tal como sucede en la historia de la creación. Cuando Pedro le sugiere a Jesús que perdonar a un hermano o hermana “hasta siete veces” (Mateo 18, 21) sería suficiente, está sugiriendo que siete veces quiere decir un perdón total. Pero Jesús responde que “no sólo hasta siete, sino hasta setenta veces siete” (18, 22) su implicación es que no hay un total para perdonar. Que el perdón no tiene límites, que no es una tarea que tiene una medida ni un terminar, sino que perdonar es una actitud que debe ser parte íntegra de nuestra manera de vivir. Estamos llamados a perdonar siempre. Y es que, ¿cómo dejar de perdonar cuando tan a menudo nosotros necesitamos ser perdonados?

Marian days of September

During the month of September there are three notable Marian celebrations which signify different aspects of Marian devotion in the Catholic faith. These days are the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, The Most Holy Name of Mary and Our Lady of Sorrows. The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. There is no account of the birth of Mary in the Scriptures, but other sources such as the apocryphal work Protoevangelium of James fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Since the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary takes place on December 8, the birth of Mary falls nine months later on September 8.

The celebration of the Most Holy Name of Mary falls on September 12 and had been observed by the Church since 1684, when Pope Innocent XI included it in the General Roman Calendar to commemorate the victory at the Battle of Vienna in 1683. It was removed from the Church calendar in the liturgical reform following Vatican II but restored by Pope Saint John Paul II in 2002, along with the Feast of the Holy Name of Jesus. Our Lady of Sorrows was a devotion started by the seven founders of the Servite Order, in 1239, five years after they established themselves on Monte Senario. They took up the seven sorrows of Mary, standing under the Cross, as the principal devotion of their order. The principal biblical references to Mary's sorrows are in Luke 2:35 and John 19:26-27. The Lucan passage is Simeon's prediction about a sword piercing Mary's soul; the Johannine passage relates Jesus' words from the cross to Mary and to the beloved disciple. In 1668 this feast was set for the Sunday after September 14, the Feast of the Holy Cross. The feast was inserted into the Roman calendar in 1814, and Pope Pius X fixed the permanent date of September 15 for the Feast of the Seven Sorrows of the Blessed Virgin Mary (now simply called the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows.)

May we continue to venerate Our Blessed Mother, seeking her intercession and trust in her protection.
