### Fr. Gerard's Corner

The key in today's passage from Ezekiel is in the turning. What are you turning away from and what are you turning toward? It's not what happened in the past that matters, it's what you've turned to now. Every day we face choices, choices between right and wrong, choices between justice and injustice, choices between life and death. Each day we must consciously turn toward good.



This parable of the vineyard, like the one of the Last Judgment, is unique to Matthew. The theme of saying vs. doing runs throughout his Gospel. It is what you do, not what you say, that opens the door to eternal life. In Jesus' story of the Last Judgment, the king does not say to those on his right, "I was hungry and you said you would bring me food" or "I was naked and you told me you would get me some clothes." Similarly, here the son who does his father's will is the one who does the work, whether he said he would or not. Even the chief priests and elders agree. Yet they are not "walking the walk." Tax collectors, like Matthew, are. They turned away from sin and followed Jesus and are now teaching and preaching and anointing and healing and doing the actual work of building the kingdom of God. What you said before is irrelevant; what is important is working in the vineyard today.

Exhibit A in doing the Father's will, obviously, is Jesus Christ, who was, as Paul writes, "obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross" (Philippians 2:8), even though he said things like "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me" (Matthew 26:39) and "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" (27:46). Even while pleading for mercy, he did not hold back from fulfilling his Father's will.

### Every Catholic Needs to Know About This Little-Known Eucharistic Doctrine “Concomitance,”

as St. Thomas Aquinas explains it, means that “nothing is lost by the body being received by the people without the blood.” By Father John Cush

... They have mentioned that, as much as they appreciate nice stories about nice people being nice to others (basically what Bishop Robert Barron has described as “beige Catholicism,” which is its own brand of Moralistic Therapeutic Deism), what parishioners want most of all is to learn about the faith — its contents, its practices and tradition, and how best to live this faith out in the world today.

Right now we are in a whole new world — a world of masks, social distancing and hand sanitizers. Gone are the processions and recessionals at the beginning and end of Mass. Gone are the pew hymnals and holy water. Gone, too, was the sign of peace during Mass... At all Masses, only the priest celebrant drinks from the chalice and he and he alone purifies the chalice.

It has been my experience that few to none of the parishioners whom I encounter are wondering what happened to the distribution of the Most Precious Blood during this time. On a diocesan level and on a parish level, the rationale for not distributing the chalice was explained very well. However, what is interesting to me is that so few parishioners know the doctrine of **Eucharistic concomitance...**

What do I mean by the doctrine of concomitance? **Namely this: that when we receive Holy Communion under the form of the consecrated Host, we receive the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.** And that when we receive Holy Communion under the form of the Precious Blood in the chalice, we receive the Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Thus, if one receives Holy Communion under one species (and, for the most part in our Catholic history in the West, we offered the Eucharist only under the form of the Host), nothing is lacking in that reception.

The “Doctor Communis”, Saint Thomas Aquinas, teaches (and this is a tenet of our faith): “*Nothing is lost by the body being received by the people without the blood: because the priest both offers and receives the blood in the name of all, and the whole Christ is present under either species*” (Summa Theologiae, III, q. 80, a. 12, ad 3).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (1390) states: “*Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace. For pastoral reasons this manner of receiving communion has been legitimately established as the most common form in the Latin rite. But “the sign of communion is more complete when given under both kinds, since in that form the sign of the Eucharistic meal appears more clearly.”* This is the usual form of receiving communion in the Eastern rites.

The U.S. Bishops’ Conference’s document, “Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion Under Both Kinds in the Dioceses of the United States of America,” reminds us:

It should never be construed, therefore, that Communion under the form of bread alone or Communion under the form of wine alone is somehow an incomplete act or that Christ is not fully present to the communicant. The Church’s unchanging teaching from the time of the Fathers through the ages—notably in the ecumenical councils of Lateran IV, Constance, Florence, Trent, and Vatican II — has witnessed to a constant unity of faith in the presence of Christ in both elements.

Even in the earliest days of the Church’s life, when Communion under both species was the norm, there were always instances when the Eucharist was received under only the form of bread or wine. ... Thus, **the Church has always taught the doctrine of concomitance**, by which we know that under each species alone, the whole Christ is sacramentally present and we receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace.

We pray for the end of the global pandemic and for the resumption of daily parochial activities and reverent liturgies. However, it might be good to remind ourselves that, even without the reception of Holy Communion to the faithful by the chalice, no one is missing out on any part of the Eucharist. Remember the doctrine of concomitance!

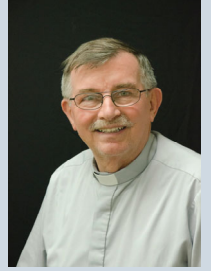

## El rincón del Padre Gerardo

La clave en el pasaje de hoy de Ezequiel se encuentra en el arrepentimiento. ¿De qué te arrepientes y hacia dónde caminas? Lo importante no es lo que sucedió en el pasado, sino hacia dónde te encaminas ahora. Todos los días se nos presentan opciones, opciones para escoger entre el bien y el mal, entre la justicia y la injusticia, entre la vida y la muerte. Cada día tenemos que encaminarnos conscientemente hacia el bien.



Esta parábola de la viña, como la del juicio final, es única en el Evangelio de Mateo. El tema de las palabras en contraste con las acciones aparece en todo su Evangelio. Es lo que haces y no lo que dices, lo que abre la puerta de la vida eterna. En la historia de Jesús sobre el juicio final el rey no le dice a los que están a su derecha “estuve hambriento y dijiste que me traerías de comer” o “estuve desnudo y me dijiste que me traerías ropa”. De manera similar, aquí el hijo que hace la voluntad de su padre es quien realiza el trabajo, ya haya dicho que lo haría o no. Aun los sumos sacerdotes y los ancianos están de acuerdo en eso; pero sin embargo, no hacen lo que predicán. Los cobradores de impuestos, como Mateo, sí se arrepienten de su pecado y siguen a Jesús, y ahora enseñan y predicán, ungen y curan, y ponen manos a la obra de construir el Reino de Dios. Lo que dijiste en el pasado es irrelevante; lo importante es trabajar hoy en la viña.

La primerísima manifestación de hacer la voluntad del Padre es obviamente Jesucristo, que, tal como dice san Pablo, “por obediencia aceptó incluso la muerte, y una muerte de cruz” (Filipenses 2, 8), aunque dijo cosas tales como “Padre mío, si es posible, que pase de mí este cáliz” (Mateo 26, 39) y “Dios mío, Dios mío, ¿por qué me has abandonado?” (27, 46). Aun cuando clamaba misericordia, nunca dejó de cumplir la voluntad de su Padre.

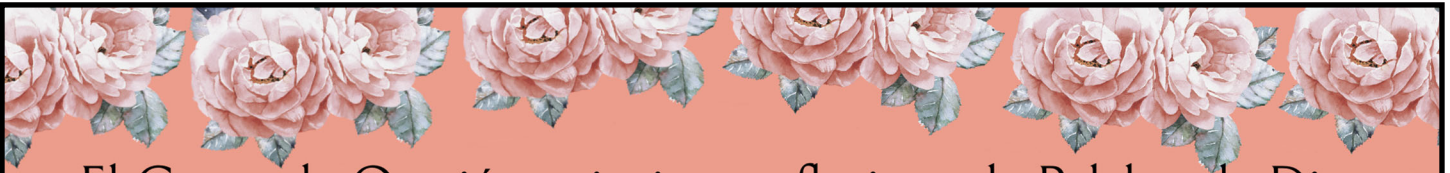
