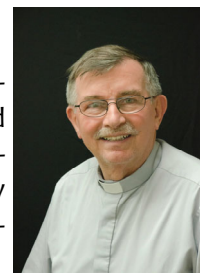
Fr. Gerard's Corner

The Lord has ears for everyone's prayers, but the reading from Exodus emphasizes God's attentiveness to the pleas of those most in need. The LORD surely hears the cry of the wronged widow and orphan, the alien and the debtor. They are some of the most disadvantaged and vulnerable in society, then and now. The Chosen People had recently lived in subjection in Egypt. They definitely should be able to empathize with those who suffer a similar sort of plight now, those who are dependent on the mercy and goodness of others.

"You were once aliens yourselves in the land of Egypt," the LORD said to the Israelites (Exodus 22:20). We may be aliens ourselves in the country in which we live, or perhaps we were once. Perhaps we have never had the experience of calling a new country home, but probably our parents, grandparents, or great-grandparents did. Very few of us do not have an ancestor who was once an alien here. Therefore, even if we were never aliens ourselves, a line can be drawn to our forebears who were.

Jesus' response to the lawyer echoes Jewish thought in the rabbinical circles of the time, so in that sense he has passed the test. Significantly, he says that "the second (commandment) is like it" (Matthew 22:39). The two commandments, love of God and love of neighbor, are interrelated. Since we are all made in the image of God, and since we are called to love God with our whole being, loving our neighbor—and ourselves—is loving God.

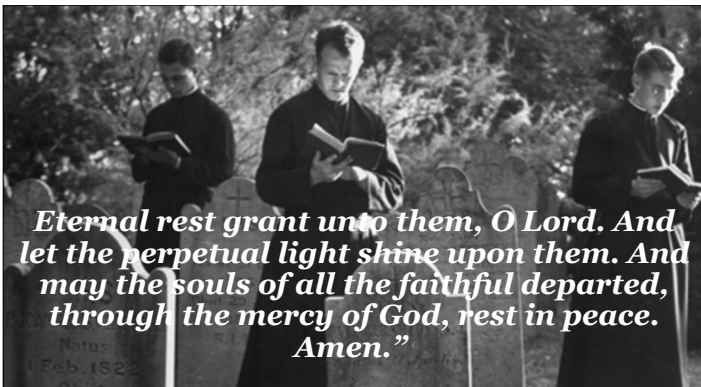

AMAR A DIOS, PROCLAMAR LA BUENA NUEVA DE JESUCRISTO, SERVIR AL PUEBLO DE DIOS

El rincón del Padre Gerardo

El Señor escucha la oración de todos y cada uno, pero la lectura del Éxodo enfatiza su atención en las súplicas de los más necesitados. De seguro el Señor escucha los clamores de las viudas y los huérfanos, los extranjeros y deudores tratados injustamente. Todos ellos son los más desamparados y vulnerables de nuestra sociedad, en aquellos tiempos y ahora. El pueblo escogido había vivido hasta recientemente en cautiverio en Egipto. Deben definitivamente identificarse ahora con todos aquellos que sufren tribulaciones similares, aquellos que dependen de la misericordia y la bondad de otras personas.

“Ustedes fueron extranjeros en Egipto”, le dice el Señor a los israelitas (Éxodo 22, 20). Nosotros mismos pudiéramos ser extranjeros en el país en que vivimos o tal vez lo fuimos alguna vez. Quizás nunca hemos pasado por la experiencia de ir a un país que no es el nuestro y empezar a asentar raíces allí, pero es probable que nuestros padres, abuelos o bisabuelos sí hayan tenido esa experiencia. Muy pocos de nosotros no tenemos algún antepasado que una vez fue extranjero aquí. Por lo tanto, aun si nunca hemos sido extranjeros, podemos trazar un vínculo genealógico con nuestros antepasados, que sí lo fueron.

La respuesta que da Jesús al doctor de la ley le hace eco al pensamiento judío entre los círculos rabínicos de aquella época, así es que, en ese sentido, pasó la prueba. Es significativo que él diga que “el segundo (mandamiento) es semejante a éste” (Mateo 22, 39). Los dos mandamientos, amar a Dios y amar al prójimo, están interrelacionados. Puesto que hemos sido creados a imagen y semejanza de Dios, y ya que somos llamados a amar a Dios con todo nuestro ser, amar al prójimo y amarnos a nosotros mismos es amar a Dios.
