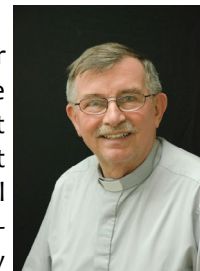

Fr. Gerard's Corner

Our lives are filled with schedules. We may have a calendar on one app for work and another one for our personal appointments and responsibilities. At the end of the day we check the TV schedule or maybe our favorite sports team's schedule. Of course, parishes have Mass schedules as well. God does not work on schedules. Jesus has a habit of bursting into our lives when we least expect and certainly not according to a prearranged timetable. As he told his disciples, "You do not know when the time will come" (Mark 13:33). It is important that we are prepared at all times. The end of our lives may come tonight. The end of the world may come tomorrow. Jesus' arrival into our lives in an unexpected way may come at any time.



We want to be in control of our own lives as much as possible. We long to be the homeowner in the Gospel, organizing our responsibilities for ourselves or others to handle. But there is only so much we can do. We can adopt a healthy diet and lifestyle, but that doesn't guarantee we will live to be a hundred. In the end, we are the clay and not the potter. We pray for the grace to accept how the Lord is molding us.

"We have all withered like leaves" is an apt image at this time of the year in much of the country (Isaiah 64:5). Leaves have fallen from the trees, their life drained. How appropriate we hear these words at this celebration of the Eucharist, when we will receive the bread of life, the Body and Blood of eternal life, which can transform our lifeless withered spirits into vessels of the living Christ.

Nuestra vida está repleta de horarios. Tal vez hasta tengamos dos aplicaciones diferentes para nuestro calendario, una para el trabajo, y otra para nuestras citas y responsabilidades personales. Al final del día laboral miramos el horario de programación de la tele o de nuestro equipo de deporte favorito. Por supuesto que las parroquias también tienen un horario de Misas. Dios no trabaja con horarios. Jesús tiene el hábito de irrumpir en nuestra vida cuando menos lo esperamos y definitivamente sin conformidad a un horario prefijado. Así les dijo a sus discípulos: “No saben cuándo llegará el momento” (Marcos 13, 33). Es importante estar preparados en todo momento. El final de nuestra vida puede que sea esta noche. El final del mundo puede que sea mañana. La venida de Jesús a nuestra vida de una manera inesperada puede que sea en cualquier momento.



Queremos tener control de nuestra vida en todo lo posible. Quisiéramos ser el dueño de la casa del Evangelio y organizar nuestras responsabilidades de manera que puedan ser realizadas por nosotros mismos o por otras personas. Pero no podemos hacerlo todo. Oremos para recibir la gracia de aceptar la manera en que Dios nos está moldeando.

“Todos estábamos marchitos, como las hojas” (Isaías 64, 5). Ésta es una imagen apta para este tiempo del año en que, en la mayor parte de la nación, las hojas secas se han caído de los árboles. Qué apropiado es escuchar estas palabras en esta celebración de la Eucaristía en que recibimos el pan de vida, el Cuerpo y la Sangre de la vida eterna, que pueden transformar nuestro espíritu inerte en un recipiente del Cristo vivo.

EL JESÚS DE SAN MARCOS

El Evangelio según San Marcos es el más corto y terso de los cuatro. Los discursos de Jesús tienden a ser concisos también. El retrato de Jesús que nos da Marcos no tiene nada de la poesía del Sermón del Monte o del Sermón de la Llanura como en Mateo ni Lucas, ni la extensión y reflexión de los “Yo Soy” los discursos en Juan. El Jesús de Marcos “va al grano”, díramos hoy. Esto se refleja muy bien en el pasaje de hoy.

No es una casualidad que el diálogo de Jesús en este momento en el Evangelio según San Marcos, las palabras finales sobre el fin del mundo, inmediatamente antes de su pasión, esté plagado de signos de exclamación y una sensación general de urgencia.

Haríamos bien en remodelar nuestra manera de vivir este Adviento, ya que vivimos en un mundo con necesidad urgente de escuchar el mensaje que Jesús proclamó. Es hora de que nos “despertemos” y salgamos al mundo para hacerlo. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

FIESTA DE LA FE

Iglesia peregrina

Nuestra participación en la Misa requiere que peregrinemos desde el hogar hasta la iglesia parroquial. Realmente nuestra preparación comienza en casa, desde que nos disponemos a la participación y emprendemos la peregrinación. Esto nos recuerda que la Iglesia, en esencia, es peregrina y que sigue esperando la venida del Emmanuel, no sólo del Dios que nace entre nosotros, sino del Dios que, en la persona de Cristo, vendrá de nuevo, de Jesús, cuyo nombre significa: Dios salva. Aunque caminamos y nos desplazamos a muchos lugares, esta peregrinación es particularmente significativa porque nos reunimos con un mismo fin, celebrar el misterio pascual de Cristo: su pasión, muerte y resurrección. El congregarnos en la casa de la Iglesia, haciendo a un lado nuestras diferencias naturales, para hacernos una voz, un solo pan y un solo cáliz reafirma la posibilidad de caminar juntos hacia Dios, de unir nuestra alabanza, de alimentarnos para el viaje y de celebrar por adelantado el Reino de Dios anunciado por Jesús. Por eso es que caminamos con un fin, un fin que puede ir más allá de nuestra propia visión, si se quiere, pero que en la perspectiva de Dios, es tan concreto y tan veraz, como el pueblo que se reúne y camina con alegría a la casa de la Iglesia.
