Fr. Gerard's Corner Pastoral Patterns



The passage from Isaiah we hear today was written during a time of great hope. The Jewish people had been released from exile and could finally return to Jerusalem. Isaiah invokes “a year of favor,” a jubilee year in which all property reverted to its original owner (Isaiah 61:2). In the truest sense, the original owner of all worldly goods is God, who then distributes them generously and equitably. The Messiah, Jesus Christ, is the fulfillment of this promised year of favor, bringing glad tidings, liberty, justice, and praise. Moreover, because he is with us always, every year is a year of favor. What in Isaiah’s day was an emancipation from exile and a hope in a return to the holy city has with Jesus become emancipation from sin and hope in life everlasting.

“Who are you?” John is asked repeatedly, to which at first he only responds with who he is not. He is not the Messiah who has been promised, Elijah whose eventual return many anticipated, nor a prophet like Moses raised up from among their kin. No, he is the messenger, the one to prepare the way of the Lord. Just as Isaiah prepared the road to the holy city, John prepares the road into our hearts.

John tells the religious leaders that “there is one among you whom you do not recognize” (John 1:26). Throughout all of Jesus’ public ministry, many of these same leaders failed to recognize him. It is our challenge now to recognize him. Do we recognize him in the least of our brothers and sisters? Do we recognize him in our community, when two or three are gathered in his name? Do we recognize him in the Eucharist, his body and blood poured out for us? Do we recognize him in times of difficulty and uncertainty?

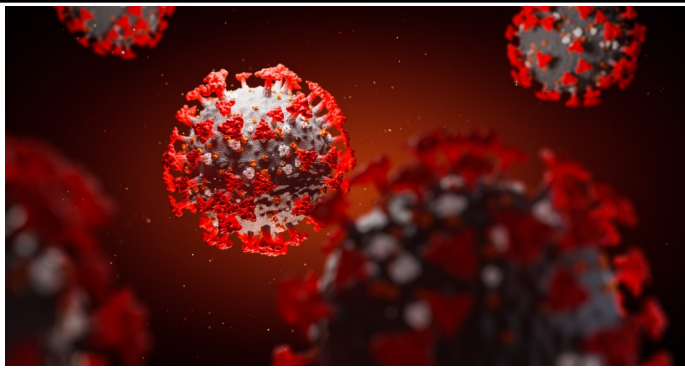

General Absolution: A message from our Pastor

Be prepared! In this time of pandemic, our bishop has granted the possibility of general absolution during Mass at Advent, since there will be no communal penance services. Our preparation for Christmas can and should be also a spiritual preparation. I invite our believers to get prepared for *General Absolution* by meditating on the wonderful text of the formulas (see below), and completing an **examination of conscience prior to general absolution**. Please see the many helps for Examination of Conscience from USCCB.

Examinations of Conscience

Before celebrating the Sacrament of Penance, one should prepare oneself with an examination of conscience, which involves reflecting prayerfully on one's thoughts, words, and deeds in order to identify any sins.

There are various types of examinations of conscience but regardless of which one you use to prepare yourself for the Sacrament it should be rooted in Scripture; particularly, the Ten Commandments and Beatitudes. Below are a few examples of Examinations of Conscience that can help you prepare for the Sacrament.

- Examination of Conscience based on the Ten Commandments
- Examination of Conscience in Light of Catholic Social Teaching
- Examination of Conscience for Children
- Examination of Conscience for Young Adults
- Examination of Conscience for Single People
- Examination of Conscience for Married Persons

Palabras Pastorales



El pasaje de Isaías que escuchamos hoy fue escrito durante un tiempo de gran esperanza. El pueblo judío había sido liberado del exilio y por fin podía regresar a Jerusalén. Isaías invoca “el año de gracia del Señor” un año de jubileo durante el cual toda propiedad se restituía al dueño original (Isaías 61, 2). En el sentido definitivo, el dueño original de todos los bienes de este mundo es Dios, quien los distribuye generosa y equitativamente. Jesucristo, el Mesías, es el cumplimiento de este año de gracia prometido, que trae júbilo, libertad, justicia y alabanza. Es más, puesto que él está siempre con nosotros, cada año es un año de gracia. Lo que en el tiempo de Isaías fue una emancipación del exilio y una esperanza por el regreso a la ciudad santa se ha convertido con Jesús en una emancipación del pecado y en una esperanza de la vida eterna.

“¿Quién eres tú?” es la pregunta que le hacen repetidamente a Juan, a lo cual él primero responde diciendo quién no es él. No es el Mesías prometido ni Elías, cuyo regreso muchos anticipaban, ni tampoco un profeta como Moisés, que era uno de sus antepasados. No, él es el mensajero, el que prepara el camino del Señor. Así como Isaías preparó el camino hacia la ciudad santa, Juan prepara el camino hacia nuestro corazón.

Juan les dice a los líderes religiosos que “en medio de ustedes hay uno, al que ustedes no reconocen” (Juan 1, 26). A lo largo de todo el ministerio público de Jesús, muchos de esos mismos líderes tampoco lo reconocieron a él. Nuestro desafío ahora es reconocerlo a él. ¿Lo reconocemos en el más pequeño de nuestros hermanos y hermanas? ¿Lo reconocemos en nuestra comunidad, cuando dos o tres nos reunimos en su nombre? ¿Lo reconocemos en la Eucaristía, su cuerpo y su sangre entregados por nosotros? ¿Lo reconocemos en los momentos difíciles y de incertidumbre?

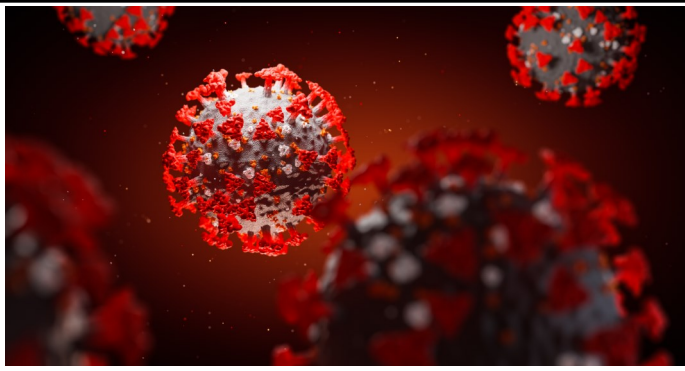

La señal de la cruz

La trazamos, desde la frente hasta el pecho, de hombro a hombro, para recordar que en nuestro interior, donde decidimos qué hacer, debemos optar por el estilo de vida cristiano, debemos ser Cristo.
