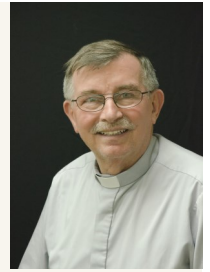

## Homily Helps

It's never too late to change. Nineveh had long since fallen at the time the book of Jonah was written, but was still synonymous in people's minds with cruelty and oppression. The idea that its people ever would have repented was unimaginable. But the author insists we imagine it. Not only do they repent of their horrible deeds, they do so dramatically, donning sackcloth and fasting. So complete is their conversion that God promptly relents. God forgives even the most heinous crimes. Let this give us all hope in the power of repentance.



On Monday we will celebrate the feast of the conversion of Saint Paul, whom we hear from today. "I tell you," he warns, "time is running out" (1 Corinthians 7:29). He pleads with his audience to immediately do the opposite of whatever they are doing now. Hearing the gospel should turn their lives around 180 degrees, for "this is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand" (Mark 1:15). Jesus Christ is with us now and he completely reorients our lives. We must change our perspective. We must be converted.

We can imagine what life was like for the four fishermen in the Gospel. Most days they went out to sea, caught netfuls of fish, sold them at market, then went home to their families. Nothing wrong with any of that. But with Jesus in their midst, this whole routine fell away. Every bit of it paled in importance to spending every minute of every day with the one who changes the world. Moreover, they were now charged with changing the world as well, while pursuing a wholly different kind of quarry.

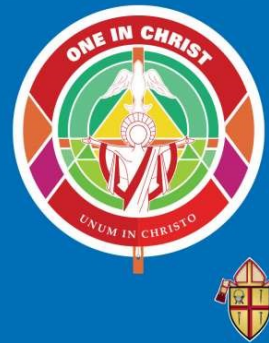

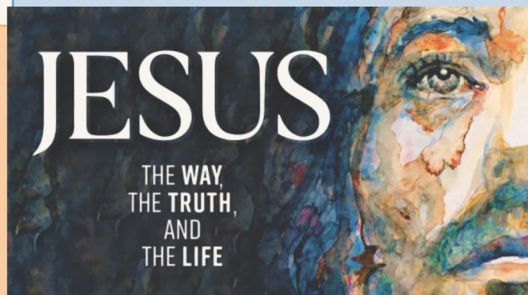

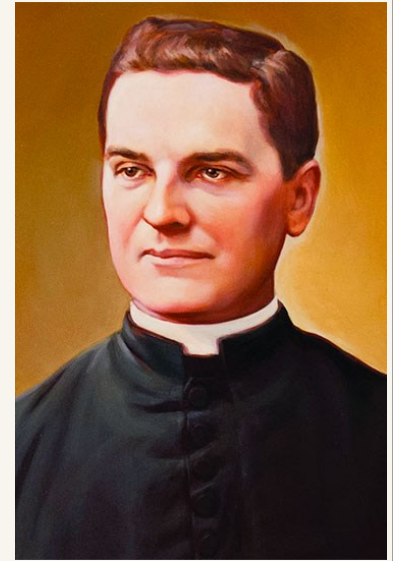
## BLESSED MICHAEL J. MCGIVNEY, FOUNDER OF THE KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

Fr. McGivney was born in Connecticut in 1852 of Irish immigrant parents. He entered the seminary at 16 years old but had to leave to help raise his siblings due to the untimely death of his father.

He was greatly affected by the devastating effect of the death of the wage earner of a family. He re-entered the seminary in 1873 was ordained a priest in 1877 and subsequently founded the Catholic fraternal service order the Knights of Columbus, a mutual aid society for widows and orphans.

The Knights initially also served as a Catholic anti-defamation society. Fr. McGivney knew immigrants were frequently treated with suspicion so he named the the society after Christopher Columbus, an American hero. The principles of his Knights of Columbus were (and are) Charity, Unity, Fraternity, and Patriotism.

Fr. Michael McGivney was approved for beatification by Pope Francis and was officially beatified last year on October 31, 2020.

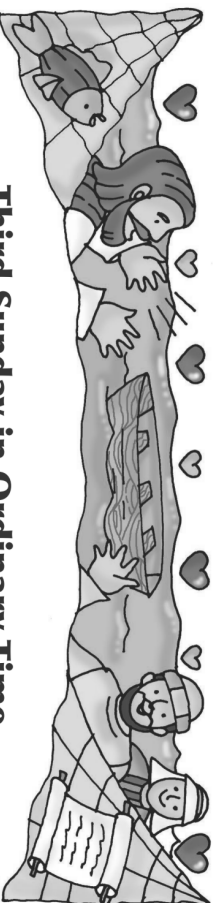

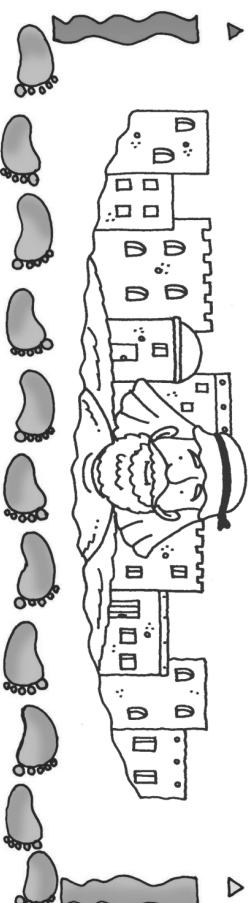

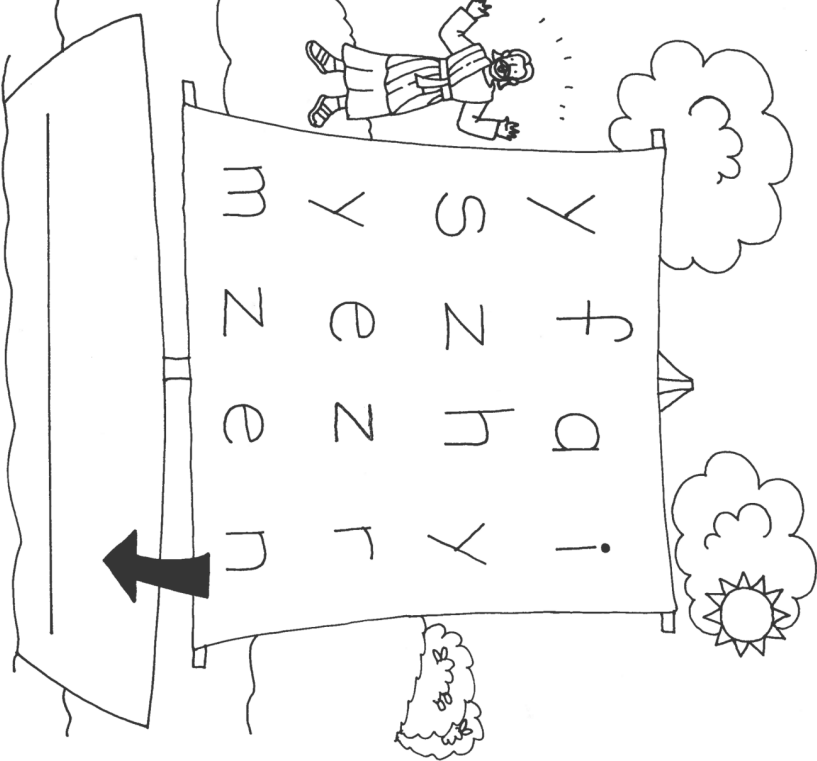

### Proyecto de homilía

Nunca es tarde para cambiar. Hacía mucho tiempo desde la caída de Nínive cuando se escribió el libro de Jonás, pero esta ciudad aún era sinónimo de crueldad y opresión en la mente de la gente. La idea de que su pueblo se hubiera arrepentido era inimaginable. Pero el autor insiste en que nos lo imaginemos. No sólo se arrepienten de sus obras horribles, sino que lo hacen de una forma dramática, vistiendo de sayal y ayunando. Tan completa fue su conversión, que Dios cambia de parecer. Dios perdona aun los crímenes más atroces. Que esto nos dé esperanza en el poder del arrepentimiento.

El lunes celebraremos la fiesta de la conversión de san Pablo, una de cuyas cartas escuchamos hoy. En ella él nos dice: “Les quiero decir una cosa: el tiempo apremia” (1 corintios 7, 29). Él le implora a su audiencia que inmediatamente hagan lo opuesto a todo aquello que hacen en el presente. De haber escuchado el Evangelio, su vida daría un giro de 180 grados, pues “se ha cumplido el tiempo y el Reino de Dios ya está cerca” (Marcos 1, 15). Jesucristo está con nosotros ahora y reorienta completamente nuestra vida. Tenemos que cambiar nuestra perspectiva. Tenemos que convertirnos.

Podemos imaginar cómo era la vida de aquellos cuatros pescadores del Evangelio. La mayoría de los días se tiraban al mar y sus redes se llenaban de peces, los vendían en el mercado y después regresaban a casa con su familia. Nada de eso estaba mal. Pero con Jesús entre ellos toda esa rutina se disipó. Todo aspecto de esa rutina se empalidecía en importancia comparada con pasar cada minuto de cada día junto al Señor, que cambia al mundo. Es más, ahora a ellos se les daba la misión de también cambiar al mundo, con una pesca completamente diferente.
