Most of our students live in this neighborhood. The majority of their parents do not speak and read English well enough to assist their children with their homework. Oftentimes, these students fall behind in reading level, and without intervention, some of them drop out of school by 6th grade. That is where La Clase Mágica and our volunteer tutors and staff come in. We help these students with their homework, and then we read with them for 20 to 30 minutes. By 4th grade, many of our students are reading at "grade level." This is a very rewarding and effective ministry.
